Chapter 15 - Weird and Unknown p. 148

The winds of Iceland were not the only strange, uncanny things that have Lived in memory through the years, and that come back now to haunt the recall of the convoy days. There were other things, other visitations, that were even stranger and sometimes more chilling, and that seem as vivid and unreal now as they did at the moment of their happening We heard them or saw them or felt them, as surely as we heard the crack of thunder in a tropical hurricane or saw the rising of an African moon or felt the stinging whip of an arctic gale, and yet they seemed in some cases to be from an unnatural world that did not recognize our normal order of things.

Who can ever say, for example, what force created and controlled the balls of cold light that appeared suddenly above our ships one still March night as we sailed near the Arctic Circle, and that stayed with us for a full hour, following our changes of course, and then suddenly swung high into the sky above us and sped off in formation, vanishing toward the polar cap.

They were not reflections or ballucinations or mirages or freaks of vision seemby only one or two wear; men on watch. They were real balls of light, four of them, that appeared overhead without warning where the sky had been black and inpenetrable, and that hung somewhere between the zenith and the mast tops of our little four-ship convoy with its three escorts. It was impossible to tell just how high they hung, for there was no way of gauging a perspective against the dark sky and, therefore, no way of telling how big they were.

We were in the waters of the Norwegian Sea at the time, for while en route to Iceland we had been forced far north of our planned course and into a lonely part of the world where ships seldom strayed. It was a black night, with high clouds shutting out the stars, and up until well after midnight we had been content with having it stay all black and lonely; that meant that the submarines had lost us and that we were alone but safe for the time being in a sea of soft sounds and cold darkness, making swift but quiet headway.

Then suddenly they were there, four identical balls of light, appearing abruptly overhead in about the same relative positions as the four ships in formation below. They looked cold and white. They did not glisten or sparkle or gleam. They just hung there in the sky like pale, white, watching globes.

I was on the bridge at the time, wearing the battle-phones, and I heard several lookout-gunners starting to call in at once, but the voice from the forward gun was just an instant ahead of the others.

"Three-inch to bridge."

"Yes," I said. "I see them."

"Three-inch to bridge. What are they?" The gunner's voice was tight and nervous.

"I don't know."

We watched them in wary silence. They stayed with us, hanging poised and cold against the blackness overhead.

We were the Commodore ship and we were responsible for the others, and so we blinked the order for a sudden course change, forty-five degrees to port. The ships swung about in formation, and our escort craft came swinging around with us, and we all straightened out on the new compass bearing and sailed silently off toward the south, thinking to leave the lights behind.

But the lights swung too, holding their position directly overhead.

After a while we changed course again, forty-five degrees to starboard. The strange lights stayed right along with us, maintaining speed and never

wavering from their fixed locations.

On the bridge of our ship, looking across the water, we caught sight of the flickering red glow of an Aldis signal lamp as a call came our way from one of the other convoy ships. We acknowledged with our own Aldis, knowing that it would shut out our signal beam from any viewer except the one who had called us.

• We knew what the query would be, even before it came glimmering at us across the waves: "What are they?"

"Do not know," we flickered back. "Hold formation. Regard as friendly."

If they were not friendly, at least they were not hostile. They made no move to descend or to approach us. They simply stayed there, hanging in the night sky, riding along above us for a full hour as we sailed on our way through the dark arctic waters, maintaining our silence and our speed and our uneasy watchfulness. All the time, our guns wereheld trained on the strange balls of light. And all the time, we hoped we would not have to shoot at them.

As it happened, we did not. Shortly before two o'clock in the morning, the light balls suddenly began to recede upward, all four moving at once as though on signal, pulling away from their positions to higher and higher altitudes at a speed that was astonishing. And then, poised high overhead, they streaked off toward the north and within moments had vanished from sight.

Their departure left us relieved but shaken. We never did know what they were, where they came from, what they sought, or where they went.

How does one explain a thing like that, except to point out that it happened at sea, and that the sea contains many mysteries, and always will?

Dear Mrs. Lorenzen:

I have been reading with interest your articles regarding the pieces of metal which you believe came from some extra-terrestrial apace craft, etc. I believe the U.S. Government has had such metals in their possession since about 1942 or 1943.

On an evening in late summer, just about the time the sun began to set, my husband and I were driving east towards our home. We were approximately 30 miles west of our home. We saw an abject in the sky ahead of us and travelling very fast towards the east. Although my husband insisted it was a balbon, I did not agree, because as it turned, the light reflected in different directions. It was very bright and the light it reflected from the rays of the sun were more like the reflections from glass, or perhaps, from something similar to chrome plating. I watched it until it drifted out of sight.

The next day we learned some strange object had crashed some thirty miles east of our home or approximately 50 to 69 miles east of where we sighted it. It crashed on a farm and, if I remember correctly, the farmer who owned the land, was the first to the scene. It looked like a big ball of fire as it crashed, but the farmer said when he arrived at the spot, the metal was white hot. Within a very short time the place was swarming with Government men. They kept it well guarded and no one was allowed near. They finally gathered up every little fragment they could find and took it away. Thus ended the story.

The metal was described as resembling aluminum, but, if I remember correctly, lighter in weight than aluminum. The UFO'S were NOT known to us as such, nor did anybody of the people in our magigbourhood who were looking at the phanomenon know about them. REPORT ON THE OBSERVATION BY ABDON GONZALEZ TELLO

ABDON GONZALEZ came to my home to inform me of his observation many years ago, during the Second World War.

He is now 38 years old and wrks as an inspector for the National Sports Committee.

His sighting occured in May of 1942 when he was only 13 years old. It was 3 pm and he was playing football in the street with several friends, about five. The others were mostly older, about 18 years old. This was in Miraflores, Lima. Suddenly, one of the boys shouted and pointed at the sky. What they saw was a cigar(silver) shaped object crossing the sky. It made no noise at all. It had no wings or fins of any kind. It was a round, long object and the ends were "cut" not rounded. It was travelling from north to south and appeared to be about 6 inches long at arm's length. CONZALEZ finds it hard to remember now, but he thinks it was about 30 or 40 metres long, 5 or 6 metres in diametre and was at an altitude of about 50 degrees. It was in sight for about 30 seconds, having seen it the first time before him travelling to the left (he was facing west). There were a few clouds in the sky but it was a clear day. At that moment the sun, as far as he remembers, was not shining. However, it definitely had a metalic appearence and was a "perfect cylinder." It dissapeared behind buildings after travelling in a straight line. It did not change course or speed. He calculates that it must have been about 300 or 400 high. He never saw another UFO before or after.

The witness does not know how to contact the other boys. He seems sincere. A very quiet, almost sluggish man who is not looking for publicity. You have his permission to publish his observation if you wish and you may use his name but he would prefer that you did'nt put who he works for.

ast Friday I appeared on KABC-TV, or Channel 7 here in Los Angeles, to describe an Unidentified Flying Object (UFO) which I had seen in Kormandy during World War II days. Same dual again for me tomorrow night!

Barring any changes of program, the schedule calls for me to "guest" a second time (sometime between 6-6:30 p.m.) on the UFO seg-ment which capable com-mentator Baxter Ward has n dishing out to the public on his news program over the past several weeks.

students upo students are grateful to Baxter for his fine, scientific interest and believe he is performing a worthwhile public aervice in pointing up the challenging celestial mys-tery now taking place above our heads.

Now It Happened

I have never scoffed at the possibility of UFO exis-tence, having observed them twice, in 1945 and 1946, in France. Have com-mented about the matter many times during the last 13 years since commencing to write this column.

Briefly, what happened to me was this: In August, 1944. I was the Duty Officer of the 38th Infantry Regimental Headquarters staff, part of the 2nd Infantry Di-vision, then heading south boward Falaise after the tremendous Mt. Lo break-

through in the Battle of Normandy.

The sergeant of the guard at our headquarters awakened me a little before 1 a.m., as instructed, at my foxhole - about 100 yards away from. the French farmhouse then serving as our regimental headquarters base. But as I rose to go, I saw something.

Glow is Bright It was a prominent orange-red light which we just commencing to sail up above the trees in the northernly direction of Om-aha Beach, 20 to 30 miles away. Bigger than Venus, smaller than the moon. At first I thought it was a Ger-

man V-1 jet missile. The executive officer of the 38th Regiment, L4. Col. Frank H. Boos of Janesville, Wis., had expressed a strong personal desire only a few days before, at our officers mess, to see a V-1. He had not seen one prior to that time.

So the guard and I trotted up the hill on the double and called to Frank to come outside and see his V-1 at long last. He was there, soon enough, as well as 1st Lt. John J. Murphy of New k City, leader of our in-Yor telligence reconnaissance platoon.

Both officers came cutside and the four of us proceeded to watch the UFO --- because that was what it was, actually, not a Ger-man V-1 jet missile.

Let me describe this strange light, vehicle, craft or whatever it may have been.

It came toward our interested little group in a straight line from the north, heading south, approximately 120 miles per hour and perhaps 3000 feet above us. There was no sound of any kind emanating from the mysterious object. It stopped over our front lines.

When they were about two miles out from Oliver Springs, Mr. Nelson says, a strange object showed up about 50 feet in front of the car, and about the height of the windshield.

"It was a glossy white," he says, "and was reflecting a light about 30 feet long and three or four feet wide. When we eased the car up toward it, the light moved slowly away. When we stopped it stopped."

Mr. Nelson says they called some people out of a house there by the roadside to see what he and the other two men with him were seeing. These people, a woman and some shildren, were as dumbfounded as the three men were.

"We moved slowly forward," says Mr. Nelson. "And the light again moved forward. We stopped. It Stopped. Finally it rose high in the air and proceeded over Black Oak lidge in a southwesterly direction.



Gentlemen:

Thank you for your letter and application for membership in your organization. Your application is enclosed along with my check for your bulletin for one year.

Regarding my experience with UFO's as a naval radar operator during world war II there really isn't too much to relate, but it might fit someplace in the pattern.

I can't recall any dates but it was during the summer of 1945., at sea between Guam and Saipan. Our air search radar on several occassions picked up a large group of pips approximately 100 miles away on a course that would bring them directly overhead. We challenged them but got no response. Their speed on our plot indicated over 1,000 MPH. Visual lookouts were alerted but saw nothing. These groups passed overhead at approximately 2,000 Ft. and showed up on the radar screen as definate solid (not Fuzzy) objects. When our visual spotters reported there was nothing in view I personally went out and searched the sky with no luck. I believe these were reported to the Naval Bureau but can't be sure. Our gear was carefully checked and calibrated and was in good order.

These were definately not ionized clouds, inversions, sea gulls, mechanical defects or any of the other common explainations. After many months of operating radar gear one knows when they have a definate solid object on the screen and for my money these were solid although invisable objects.

I have a clipping from the Cleveland Plain Dealer dated December 10, 1955 which you may not have. I want to keep this clipping in my file but will report it exactly as printed below:

SCAN SKIES FOR SPACE CRAFT OUT MEDINA WAY

GUAM SAIPAN has kept residents of Rittman and Medina on the jump lately.

Strange lights observed doing loop-the-loops in the skies led motorists to speculate on the source and then to try to run them down.

Since there was no discernible beam from the earth, searchlights were ruled out and the speed seemed to eliminate airplanes.

One explaination has been that a searchlight atop a railroad locomotive was reflected on low-hanging clouds to give the illusion of a visitor from outer space.

I have also heard that someone in Medina has a strange metal-like object which he claims fell from the sky and is going to have it analized, however I haven't been able to track this down. Will let you know if I can get any info.

Gentlemen:

Observing Major Donald E.Keyhoa's reference to your organization, and the address, in his book: "The Flying Saucer Conspiracy", I should like to affiliate, to aid if possible, for I observed a flying saucer during June, 1945- which you may add to your list of sightings.

My grandson, Harry III, and I, with my chauffeur, Johnny Hinojosa, took off in June, 1945, for the Rockies to fish for rainbows, bound for The Powder River Country, after stopping a week at the Broadmoor in Colorado Springs for my grandson to enjoy their skating ring there- ice skating.

Continuing to Lander, Wyoming, Johnny driving, Harry III in the middle and I on the right hand side, we left Lander driving northeaswardly, along a well paved highway. At about 3 p.m., approaching a ridge, around which the highway extended, and through a cut, I observed a flying object on the far side of the ridge, apparently at a low elevation, outlined against the sky with the sun in the west, a brilliant sunlit afternoon.

Shape of the flying object was round, as sketched on an attached sheet; there being no visible reference objects such as a house of a tree, I could not estimate the size, although the object did appear to be about 30 feet in diameter, of a bronze folor, trailed by what appeared to be fumes emerging from the sides and reat, of a bronze-grayish color.

The object was moving southeastwardly, at low speed, which I estimated at about 90 miles per hour. A low velocity wind was blowing from the west. No air traffic was visible anywhere in the area. All prairie country.

Punching Harry III with an elbow, directing his attention, before he or Chauffeur Johnny could locate it, the object disappeared behind the ridge. Driving around a curve in the highway, we stopped on the northeast side of the ridge, searched for an hour or so, thinking the object had landed, but we found no trace of the flying object.

Please be assured that the writer is sound in mind and body, responsible, mechanical engineer, owning and operating several industries here, two relating to aircraft.

The flying saucer would require enormous amount of power- of some kind, and I suggest nuclear energy as a source, on account of its great energy per unit of weight of uranium 235 which could be sufficient to move a saucer from either Mars of the moon and back, although whatever the design of power plant, there must be some security against the effect of radiation, although this was not externally visible in this sighting.

If a nuclear energy power plant propels saucers and mother saucers, the form of plant would necessarily differ from any of which we yet know, to derive propulsion directly instead of **through** an intermediate water tube boiler driving a steam turbine driven electric generator, or a direct drive without a generator. Certainly not jet propulsion on account of the weight of fuel which would be necessarily carried aboard, and not propulsion by air, heated with nuclear energy, for want of adequate weight of air in outer space, unless there is used some method of which we have no knowledge.

The great variety of saucers and mother saucers described by Major Keyhone's book, would not be unusual, for there are also many designs of piston and jet propelled aircraft, from the great B-36 down to a Piper Cub- and I have a racing ship smaller than a CUB.

Most remarkable is that in the several thousand sightings around the world, there has been no failure of propulsion such as would ground a saucer, on land.

It is not surprising that Army Air Forces endeavor to suppress news of flying saucers, especially General Twining, whom I have known quite well for many years, before he was promoted to captain, since there are very few, if any scientists among Air Forces pilots, and rarely are engineers among pilots.

Most proficient in nuclear physics is Dr.George Granger Brown, Dean of the College of Engineering- frequently my house guest here- who had charge of atomic energy since the Congress set up the Commission to take the subject over, detailed from University of Michigan to handle Manhattan Froject.

There has been no secrecy, such as the federal government would have our people believe about atomic energy; the cyclotron was designed during a seminar in the Summer of 1935 by physicists from the world over- Dirak from England, Bohr from Denmark, Fermi from Italy, Dr.Lawrence, Dr.Brown, Br. Sawyer, and others, including, I believe, Dr.Uhlenbeck who taught to me the nuclear theory 48 years ago in Physics, University of Michigan.

When the cyclotron split the first atom, the news appeared in every scientific and engineering magazine in the world, and again, in 1939, when nuclear fission was discovered- by a German physicist- that news also appeared in the same gournals, while the federal government took over several years later, obviously too late for any secrecy at all. All that the Russians need to have done was to study the many very good papers in journals of 1935, 1939 and subsequently. Secrecy about nuclear energy, and also flying saucers, seems rather silly.

Unidentified Flying Object Observation Report

Date: April 14, 1946 (Palm Sunday)

Time: 5:00 A.M.

USA

Location: Approximately 10 miles east of Havana, Illinois on U.S. Highway 136 and Illinois Highway 10

Observers: Paul Cummings, Jr. and Douglas Gowdy

We were driving from Canton, Illinois to Lincoln, Illinois at dawn on Palm Sunday. It was still relatively dark, therefore the auto headlights were still being used. We were driving straight east on a flat stretch of U.S. Highway 136 approximately 10 miles east of Havana, Illinois. All at once a bright luminous ball, pole orange in color, appeared in the middle of the highway approximately one mile ahead of us. (It was about the color of the sun, but not near as bright.) The object seemed to glide straight down the highway toward us about one foot above the pavement and occupied the entire roadbed, possibly touching both shoulders of the highway. The paved area was 20 feet wide.

When the object came within 200 feet of our car, I drove the car off onto the shoulder to avoid a collision, turned the ignition off, and both of us jumped out of the car as fast as possible. Both of us were frightened prompting Douglas Gowdy to make the statement: "It is the end of the world". Our first impulse was to protect ourselves from the object, since we could think only of an atomic explosion. We ran to the ditch alongside the road, layed face down and covered our heads with our arms for protection.

We layed there for about two minutes before we got enough nerve to look up. We then got up on our feet and looked both directions up and down the highway. The object was nowhere in sight. We had passed no other automobiles on the road between Havana and Mason City, so it is doubtful whether anyone else had observed the object. There was no sound associated with the object and we could feel no heat when the object came towards us. We stood near the car and discussed what we had seen. We thought at first it might have been the sun, but the sun had not appeared above the horizon. (According to the World Almanac, the sun rises at 5:24 A.M. on this date in Illinois.)

The automobile lights on the car were left on and the right door was left open when we hurriedly jumped out. The lights were still on when we got back into the car. We then drove to Mason City where we had breakfast. I don't know if the object passed alongside us, or took off and flew over us, since we had our faces covered. It was certainly a frightening experience and I have been very reluctant to repeat the story to others due to what I considered a fantastic episode at that time.

It was approxamatly 1:30 P. M. in late 1945 or early 1946. The weather was clear and no noticable breeze. I noticed a group of fellows looking toward the sky and I also looked up. What I saw, looked to be a Silver colored ballon or ball, larger. than the stars but still smaller than the moon. Soon, just about everyone on the base had seen it. The object stayed in the same position for several hours. The next day it was gone and we learned a plane had been sent up to investigate, But reaching their maximum altitude, still didn't seem to be any nearer than they were when on the ground.

All this took place around Crows Landing, Calif. about 22 miles from Modesto and 96 miles from San Francisco. If it had been a weather ballon it could not possibly have been seen from the ground.

(Quote) "Sweden and Russia shook hands... Russia was not sending (rockets) despite British-American efforts to prove she was, and the Swedes called 80% of flashes "of celestial origin." The remainder were relegated to "inflamed imaginations," with what justice, who knows?" (End quote)

On June 10,1946, at Helsinki, Finland: A powerful light in sky, for ten minutes. Trail of smoke. Two minutes later, an explosion.

August 22, '46, Waterford, Eire: Explosion at 7 PM. Water in harbor seethed and boiled.

August 20, '46, Chattilon-sur-Seine: Not a "flying bomb" but a whistling clothesline!

August 31, '46, Oslo: The Norwegian press was forbidden to mention "lights in skies." (Sound familiar? - J.C.) "Searchers with special metaldetecting equipment have been unable to detect even the smallest fragment."

Sept.6, '46: Report from Salonika and Macedonia that undoubtedly the lights, seen the past few days were "ground flares or Verey Lights, used by mountain bands."

Sept.11, '46, Srinagar, Kashmir: "Luminous body, resembling a squash racket," headed west. Left smoke-like trail.

Sept.15, '46, Alemtejo, Potugal: At dawn. "A strange bluish ball of light." Visable for over 5 minutes.

Sept.16, '46, Tangier: "Large balls of fire with huge green tails, streaked with red." Between midnight and 1 AM, "for 3 successive nights!"

Sept.17, '46, Fez Para, near Casablanca: "Long, thin trails of yellowgreen light, following fireballs."

Sept.24, '46: Sightings of various descriptions over Italy during week. Object sighted over Florence on Sept.22nd: "Precluding the possibility that it was a meteor was the fact that the object made a sharp turn and headed south toward Rome."

Oct.15,1946: "An inquiry by the Belgian Minister of Defense showed that none of the phenomina observed gave any reason to believe that unknown contrivances have been flying over Belgium!"

And so, with that October 15th rendition of what would later become a popular song in America, I bring this little compilation to a close.

Page 255 - ("Balls Of Fire" column)

Object seen over Wilmington, North Carolina on Aug.24,1946. Disappeared to northeast.

August 24,1946 (same evening) object spotted over Durham, North Carolina, moving in opposite direction. (southwest)

On Sept.6,1946, a large ball of purplish fire moved "less swiftly than a meteor" across the sky north of Philomath, Oregon, from west to east. Disappeared over Old Baldy Mountain. (Philomath is just west of Corvallis on US#20 - J.C.)

In North Wales, on the previous evening (Sept.5th) a "ball of fire and an explosion" struck a chimney near Wrexham, and knocked slates off another house, twenty feet away.

On Sept.5th, (same date as above) "blindingly brilliant fireball" fell on Waterloo St., Ruston on Trent (England) "rocking the houses."

On Sept.21,1946, in Beatrice, Schington (England) "A sound of an explosion, heard in a wide area."

Ostend (Belgium) about midnight on Sept.25-26,1946. Madam Deman saw "ball of light, approaching at terrific speed." Fell in her front yard, "in cloud of smoke."

In Compan, southwest France, around Sept.29,1946, "a meteor-like ball of fire" plunged into a mountain, with a loud explosion.

On Dec.10,1946, between McPherson and Garden City, Kansas, a flaming object, close to earth, left a long contrail in sky. 30 minutes duration. Over several areas of the Midwest, (Illinois, Missouri, Oklahoma, Iowa, and Nebraska) "red flashes of fire" coincide with the report from Kansas. A professor from the U of Nebraska said people had merely seen "3 meteors."

Page 259 - (Captioned "Over Baltimore")

August 11, 1946: Ball of fire "suspended from parachute" fell in East Brooklyn section of Baltimore.

Lug.12, '46: Another ball of fire descended on Baltimore.

Aug.16, '46: A third ball of fire fell in harbor (Baltimore) and burned furiously for several minutes.



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

Dear 'im and Coral:

We want in to see Mr. Kiehl late this afternoon, and I think rather than writing a publishable report I'll just give you a personal account of the encounter and let you form your impression that way. I'll use space-and-a-half to make it easier for you.

We took the tape recorder, but I left it in the car with 'enifer while I went to see if Mr. Kiehl was in. He was. He was glad to talk. I never went back for the tape recorder because he speaks so rapidly and with such a rural Pennsylvania (I suppose) accent that he is impossible to understand unless you can see all the gestures. They're part of the context.

He lives alone in a third-floor walkup flat in a small apartment building a couple of blocks from the civic center. I knocked on the door, and he answered in a T-shirt. I told him my name and said I was from APRO and that you wanted me to talk to him about his experience. He said come right in. The room was small and cluttered with books and magazine and APRO bulletins. Most of the books had something to do with UFOs, space flight, or the sort of esoterica you find in Fate magazine . During the interview he said he had joined the Army in 1916 (lieing about his age in order to get in) and was discharged in 1925; he had emlisted for 7 years. He showed me his discharge, which indicated he was a corporal when he got out. After that he appears to have worked many years as a trail boss (his expression) building roads and trails for the Forest Service and the National Fark Service in the high Sierra, in Oregon and "ashington and so on. He says he's now retired and appears to be living fairly comfortably on his pension or pensions. He's very short, not over 5'3" or so, but powerfully built and exceptionally well preserved physically for a man of 68.

He gave the impression of a man who has had very little formal education but who is still a reader and active mentally. He gives an overwhelming impression at first of being a rambling talker, but the longer I talked to him the more I felt that his frequent sidetrips away from the main topic -- his experience -not the result of a wandering mind but represented his way of "documenting" his experience by giving a certain amount of detail regarding the real persons along the way.

LAKE ONTARIO

Summer 1914

He started to go into his story very soon, but I stopped him and said I had at **app** recorder in the car and asked if he would object if we taped our conversation. He said he was entirely willing but that perhaps he ought to explain a few things first. I agreed, and he launched into a highly complicated story about what he had been doing that summer of 1914 and how he happened to be where the sighting took place. By this time I realized that taping would do no good and abandoned the idea. I decided against goigg to get Jenifer because of the cluttered condition of the little appartment, the unmade fold-down bed occupying most of the room, etc, and took comfort in the thought that she had the "ecember issue" of Esquire which we had just picked up and which has three excellent articles on the assassination and the research that has been going on.

So I let him tell is it his way, interrupting only occasionally to try to nail down a place name or a time or some other detail. You'll find some details apparently do not fit with those in the story he wrote to you, but I'm not sure they matter.

He had grown up in Marietta, Penna., where/Was born and as a child played around canals, canal boats, and trains along with the other kids, so he was accustomed to seeing machinery going by on freight cars and himself remarked that for a child in the horse and ouggy for era he had seen far more machinery of various and exotic kinds than most others.

In that summer of 1914 he had been working some canal when the job came to an end and he was going on a lake boat to look for another when the boat developed some sort of misery and sank, near a pier of some kind but he said some people were irowned and that he had to swim for it. He had transferred his money to his shirt pocket, which was closed with a "horse pin" but somehow it got lost while he was in the water. In any case he found himself on the Canadian side, broke and with no job. He was then 167 . He repeatedly referred to the body of water as Lake Ontario, even when I questioned him (I did so because you mentioned Lake Frie). There were a couple of young men from Boston, one a college student and a machinist about 25, who had escaped from the boat incident with him, and they planned to bum their way by freight to the west coast to Vancouver and then down to the San Franicisco Exposition of 1915; they let him tag along and the trio set out for a hobo jungle they any map I have, wither along Lake Erie or Lake Ontario).

It was late August, 1914, and Canada had just declared war on Germa ny, being part of the British Empire, and the boys found the railway yards swarming with Mounties and other cops looking for German schemes saboteurs. In the process the fuzz was picking up all bums and other worthy individuals looking for free transportation west via freight.

After a little judicious inquiry, our heroes learned that if they could just get a few miles west out of town they probably could hop a freight without undue interference, so they began looking for transportation even that far, since they didn't dare walk along the tracks for fear of being arrested.

They found a French Canadian couple who wanted to take a large rowboat about eight miles west along the north lakeshore to look at a mining claim, so they set out the next day -- our three voyageurs, the French Canadian couple and their three small They got about eight miles west when the boat sprang children. an alarming leak and it was decided to put into a small spit where Papa could work on the boat and they could spend the night on the The boat was beached and turned over to dry, and the whole beach. party moved inland over a small cliff of some kind left by glaciation and was busy gathering firewood. At about 5 p.m. one of the children noticed a deer at the waterline staring out over the lake, oblivious to the human beings crashing through the underbrush nearby. The child looked out over the lake where the deer was staring and saw a strange craft resting on the water. The child calk d her mother, who called her husband and the three young "mericans.

Kiehl says the air was still and the water smooth, and the strange craft sat **Destroited** in the water about 450 feet from shore. He estimates it was about 15 feet in daimeter, globular in shape except slightly flattened on top and with some sort of square substructure around the bottom. On this deck-like substructure he saw "two little fellers" busy with a hose which he thinks was about two or two and a half inches in diameter. He said the hose was green and had a round thing on the end which could have been a screen or filter of some kind. At the time he noticed them the "little fellers" were working vigorously with the lower part of the hose, which came out of the globe above their heads. hey seemed to be unkinking the lower part of the hose or untangling it in some way; in any case they were working vigor at it, with entirely human

motions. He rejects firmly the idea that they were machines of some kind. He estimates their hgight at four feet or under. They wore tightfitting suits that appeared green or purple as they moved in the late afternoon sunlight, and each had on a headgear which he at first described as a yellowish square mask. Under questioning he said that the masks were not just square and flat in front, but were that way on all sides -- in other words box-shaped.

While the little fellers were rassling the hose up out of the lake (her said the upper part of the hose appeared to give them no trouble and seemed to be controlled by machinery of some kind, possibly a winch) the top of the globe thrust up three pipes and the heads and shoulders of three other occupants appeared beside the pipes and began "fiddling" with them. He could not tell what they were doing, but noticed that like the "little fellers" below they all wore the same yellow square headgear but were dressed in khaki colored uniforms, like the others close fitting. "But they were all sort of skinny," he recalled, with heads (judging from the **xerrex** square helmets) larger than mormal for their small bodies.

After duly fiddling with the pipes, the topside trio turned and appeared to take a very hard look at the deer which was gazing at them It turned and bounded back into the forest. from the beach as far as Aichl could tell, they paid no attnetion to or at least seemed I not to notice their human audience, which was peking out through cracks in the rocks and from behind brush) and then sank back down into the globe and the pipes were tetracted.

At this point the little fellers had got the hose in through the square hatch above them and one **best** started to get in himself. Kiehl **collinese** could see in through the hatch and could see what appeared to him to be tiles set in the opposite wall, bright green in color. One of the little fellers got in, but the other didn't make it. He clung desperately to a ring **see** around the middle of the globe which Kiehl estimates was about seven inches in diameter, and the whole thing lifted straight up about 15 feet. He could see underneath it a bit and thinks it was a lattice-work of square metal, dull grey like the rest of the globe, and which shed a large quantity of water which fell back into the lake. Then the whole globe tipped back at a sharp angle, giving him (still a) better lock at its underside with its lattice of aguares, and then shot off into the sky at an angle which he indicated

by gestures to be about 45 degrees. It left a short trail, only a few feet long, of vapor or steam as it accelerated swiftly and quickly was out of sight. It made no sound at any time that he could hear.

He insists no one was frightened, just amazed and bewildered. At the time he himself thought that perhaps some other country had figured out some strange new flying machine, and this is not too strange in view of the wartime atmosphere at the time.

He felt nothing at all while looking at the machine (he estimates the whole sighting lasted perhaps 10 minutes) and felt no ill effects afterwards.

The last he saw of the machine the little feller was still holding depperately to the ring around the middle of the globe and Mr. Kiehl still wonders if he ever got back in.

I asked him what they all said about it afterward, and he replied that they said very little. He did not explain it this way, but I gathered from other things he had said that this was not a very loquacious party anyway. The French Canadian family could speak io "nglish and only the Boston college student knew enough French to converse with them at all. Kiehl, one has to remember, was bumming with two older men who he apparently felt were honoring a youngster of 16 by allowing him to tag along.

In any case, with the sighting behind them, the American trio left the French Canadian family the next day and promptly got picked up by the Mounties the minute they hit a railway track. The two boys from Boston joined the Canadian Army and wint off to war. Kiehl never saw either of them again. Being only 16, he was farmed out to a farmer where he worked for three weeks and then left because he never got paid . He made hi way up to Regina and Churchill working at various jobs before he finally wound up in Billings, Montana, where he got into ranch work and lumberjacking, which seems to have been his career until he joined the Army. After he got out he worked for the Forestry and National Park Services, as noted above, and, I have no doubt, became a friend and colle ague of Smokey the Bear or something.

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It is quite impossible to listen to his story and not conclude that he believes absolutely in what he is saying. "I KNOW what I saw," he says many times. While it remains possible that he has told himself a story so long and so many times that he now regards it a reality, his behaviour otherwise does not support such a conclusion. he answers all questions readily and only after pausing long enough to drop his current line of thought and grasp what you are talking about (He's usually wound up in painting the personal background of some character he has mentioned or is about to mention). He does not hesitate about details. I led him through the story three different times in various ways and found no internal contradictions. The only real discrepancies in his story his vague geography and his uncertainty about place names -- but you have to remember that this is a man who has had littles chooling, has had some difficulty in making himself understood because of his rapid-fire diction and his atrocious, ungrammatical, fragmentary speech -- and that all this happened 42 years ago.

How many people has he told this story to, and what was their reaction ? Well, he and the Boston boys told it to the Mounties, who seemed to be more impressed with the problem of three American buns on their hands than anything else. In the Army he told it to a major in the Army Air Corps, who very sensibly remarked that there undoubtedly are an awful lot of planets, and that the theory that Kiehl says he had by then worked out that the craft he saw could only have come from some other planet was just as good as any other.

After that, he seems to have found increasingly that **uppe** people thought he was eccentric or handing them a line when he tried to tell his story, so he sort of gave up trying to tell it. Until he read the article in Fate and got to reading about UFOs, and this appears to be one of his main interests now if not the principal one.

He says he wrote out his account and sent it to the President, who referred it to the Air Force, which sent him a reply. He says he sent the Air Force letter to you and would like to have it back. In the meantime he hopes you will indeed write up his story and thinks all such stories should be written up so people will know what has been going on. One reason he wants to see his story written up is that his sister, whom he had not seen for many years, visited him here from Pennsylvania not long ago and for the first time he told her the story.

He said he wanted very much to send her a printed copy of his story.

"You're the first man I've ever told this story to," he said, "who believed what I was saying or who knew what I was talking about."

He has no telephone, so I asked for the number of the apartment manager in case I needed to get hold of him again. He was looking through his wallet (very neatly fitted with cards of various **including** his APRO membership card) and finally found the name and phone number of the manager. He showed me some of his books and magazines. He had old copies of FATE and other magazines of that kind, plus the two LOOK articles on the Hills, a copy of TRUE, and so on. He had "Flying Saucers," by one Coral Lorenzen, and I restrained myself from informing him that there might soon be a "Son of Flying Saucers." Also he had an autogmphed copy of George Adamski's book which he said he had found in a second-hand bookshop. So you can see you are on one of the better bookshelves, although I have to admit that in this case the bookshelf actually was the north end of a divan indiscriminately piled with books, magazines, roadmaps and phemplets of some kind stuffed into manila envelopes.

It is very hard to judge clearly such a lonely, introverted person, still healthy and vigorous but so glad to have someone to talk to, and especially someone who doesn't dismiss him as a nut or charlatan -- that he bursts into a torrent of conversation which is not easy to interrupt. My net impression, as I said, is that he firmly believes what he is saying. On the whole it is consistent, and although there are some unclear details in my mind, I am inclined to believe him.

I hope this gives you something like the information you need, but if there's anything further you want done just say so.

Jenifer recommends the "squire article, by the way, and says



Dear Mrs. Lorenzen;

Enclosed please find the only references to UFO's in our area in recent months. I must admit that visible activity in our area has fallen sharply.

I have not completed transcribing the notes I took during our long "invasion" last year; I probably never will. The more I read and hear on the subject, the more I'm convinced that the primary mission of the UFO's is to confuse, muddle and divide....a modern Tower of Babel, so to speak. After all, we, ourselves can completely scramble a mans brains chemically, electronically and even manually. I have adopted a rather fatalistic attitude about them. My husband and I have purchased a Motor Home and, God willing, next summer will sell our house and travel. Sort of: if you can't fight 'em and won't join 'em--try to outrum 'em!

Since I spent from four to eight hours a day observing the UFO's during our 'flap' I noted many oddities; how they circle an area when a plane approaches, how they signal to each other, their 'relay' reconmaissance....but I don't think that I can add much to what others have already found out. There are a few which are still intriguing to me, however, even though they happened about two years ago. I have exact dates and times etc.etc. in my notebooks which are packed away; if you should desire more specific information, I'd be gax glad to dig it out.

I saw two huge lights over my neighbors acreage. They were about 20' above the ground---30' in diameter---about 40'-50' distance between the two discs. The light coming from the two discs was bright, cold,

opaque; there was no glitter or reflection or glare on my binoculars. (7X35) Occasionally the discs seemed to steam up, but the vapor did not flow in front of the face of the objects----in other words the x vapor did not flow <u>UP</u>, it flowed <u>OUT</u>.

I went out into the yard to observe it better and shortly heard a roaring sound coming closer. It was more like the sound of a tormado than a plane motor, but I just assumed that the AF was on the ball. (I had kept the Niagara Falls Air Base apprised of these sightings) them I saw the twin discs---I can only say "Rev up" because that's what it seemed to do. It dimmed and brightened 3 or 4 times and a strange electrical-like discharge (like the old mad scientist movies) seemed to come from the rim of the objects. Ner The roaring noise was now overhead, and, realizting that it was NOT a plane, swung the binoeulars up---and saw four more of the objects in the same general configuration. Two were on one side of my house and

two on the other. They were going from East to West and, if they did not change course, would pass over Lakeview, NY. on Lake Erie. These four discs were flying low--less than 1000' and travelling slowly for an airborne object---I should say about 50MPH. They were virtually identical to the two I had been watching, except that both vapor and fire were belching from their rear rim.

When I looked back at the first UFO it had disappeared in but there were many (app. 15) of the tiny firefly, blinking objects we have seen often before. They buzz around in a very haphazard, disorganized manner. I should judge that the distance I stood from the grounded UFO was less than 1800' TOTAL TIME OF SIGHTING ABOUT 5 MINUTES

I'm enclosing a drawing I did shortly after I saw the objects.

The second object which has taxed my poor brain is an utterly immpossible happening. I know it's impossible because our scientists would ALL agree on THAT.



Here is the true story of my Parents, as well as of my sisters who saw one or two UFO in the sky of Quebec.

My parents and my two sisters went to the home of my brother-in-law Gaston Jobin in order to "ski-doo". (This is in the small town of Villeneuve near Courville). The "ski-doo" belongs to my other brother-inlaw, Roger Briere, who came to get my parents and sisters in order to go to Gaston Jobin's place.

They had fun all afternoon and went into my brother-in-law's house around 3:50 P.M. What I am telling is what my parents and sister Suzanne told me, for I had remained at home. So. it was around 4 o'clock whem my sister lookedoout of the large kitchen windows; she was looking at the people who were skiing when she raised her eyes toward the sky. Immediately she called out to the others who were chatting in the livingroom.

She daid: They look like triangles of light, one of my younger sisters said:" one could say they are flying saucers." and that is indeed what they saw. I am basing this on the account told me by my/sister in order to tell you this story which is true. This is what she said she saw: two triangles separated from each other by about 3 to 6 feet. Two <u>luminous</u> triangles which were pale pink, whil becomming bright red with a little yellow which appeared and disappeared. That appeared and disappeared two or three times and suddenly the two triangles were there without moving, <u>luminous</u>, and they joined together as if to form, let us say, a cigar or a banans. (flying saucer)

The witness--about 12 or 13 years old then--was leading some cattle to the pasture when he suddenly heard a loud whistling sound in the sky. In about 450 ft distace there was a round object like two saucers stuck together rim to rim. It was about 10 ft in diameter with a darkish color. It took straight up raising a cloud of dust. There was a band of "a different color" round the object. The witness thinks it might be a window looking like a band because the object was revolving very rapidly. At the altitude of 500 ft neither the object was visible nor the sound was heard any more. The witness got scared and did not approach the place of the probable landing but ran away. The cattle got frightned too. The area was quite flat and later it was turned into an airport. The witness has a highschool education. He was intervewed by a member of ours, Mr. Apostolos Mandalakas, an electronics technician.

Back in 1947 while living in Phillipston Massuchusetts I had my first experience with UFO's.

When frequently while watching"TV" our screen suddenly became completely white a number of times ¹ began to check for the cause, using my HRO-7 receiver a "scope". There would be neither a wave pattern or audible sound. Still curious I checked outdoors to see a UFO hovering over one of the airway beacon stations less then a mile away. A quick call to the local airport brought the information it had been observed and reported to the Information Officer at Fort Devens.

My estimate of a altitude of about 2000 feet was confirmed by the airport manager. A few seconds after our conversation planes appeared and the UFO headed upward. To my surprise while the planes left vapor trails the UFO did'nt!

At the time of the first sighting (about 3;00 p.m. EST) the sky was clear with unlimited visibility. The UFO was almost directly over the airway tower. Bearing about EXS of my location.

During 1947-1948 sightings were almost a daily occurence, during daylight hours. With a few sightings at night. Again with a unlimited ceiling.

On three occasions in this period I tried signaling using a flashlight and Morse code. Each time the UFO responded with a beam of white light. Oddly though they only repeated my signals.

I was traveling for our business in those years and in the course of traveling saw UFO's all the way from Fort Kent Maine, westerly into Wisconsin and Michigan and southerly as far as Fort Jefferson out in the Gulf of Mexico.

One evening at Fort Jefferson while relaxing on the top parapet my wife and I saw a group of seven OFO's in a "V" formation appear directly south of us. I ran to our transmitter and called the USCG Base at Key West. The Base reported the UFO's had been spotted and were being observed on a radar scope. Then I rejoined my wife.

A few minutes later the UFO's returned heading SE-true at a altitude of about 4000 feet. Again the visibility was unlimited.

Other sightings have been noted through the years but they brought no new information that you folks don't already have.

Incidently while at Phillipston and Fort Jefferson I was able to obtain sharp photographs of the UFO's. Which were sent to Information Officers at Fort Devens and NAS- Boca Chica Florida.

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

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Dear Lorenzens,

About a month ago, I read your THE FLYING SAUCER HOAX, and a short time later, read Fuller's INCIDENT AT EXETER. Yesterday, I finished Frank Edwards' FLYING SAUCERS - SERIOUS BUSINESS. All three are very

In the three books, the Great Power Outage of 1965 is covered, along with the nearby outage in St. Paul's "Battle Creek area." I do not remember that your book nor Fuller's mentioned too much about earlier power outages, but in Chapter 11 of Edwards' book, the following appears: "The first indication that these things might interfere with commercial electric distribution systems in my records " and lists the incident at New Haven, Conn., in November of 1953, but adds that he "does not have enough substance in his records to definitely link it with UFOs."

interesting books, but that is not my main reason for writing to you.

Recently, one of my nieces decided she'd do a little article on UFOs for extra credit in her Journalism class, and she enlisted the aid of her old Uncle Jawn, knowing he was interested in such matters. While searching through one of my old notebooks, which I had not looked at for almost 20 years, I found that I had typed up all the reports from our local papers during the summer and early fall of 1947. concerning the UFOs.

One of them was very interesting because it appears to relate to the power outages mentioned in the three books above, and I am wondering if you have it in your files. Here it is, just as I typed it in my long-forgotten notebook:

St. Paul Dispatch, July 7, 1947.

An argument raged at Lodi, Calif., over the mysterious red glow which was seen in the sky, shortly before the power went off.

Mrs. W.C. Smith said she heard a roar like a four-engined bomber just before the lights went off, at dawn. Authorities thought it might have been a crop-dusting plane which had crashed into the high tension wires, but there was no report of anything such as this having happened.

I note other interesting reports in this July 7th page of my notes. For instance, this page contains my first reference to the "Mama" disc with "Baby" discs clustered around "her." Someone named AmyHerdliska, at Palmdale, Calif., made this sighting, according to my long-ago typed information from our papers.

No doubt you have something concerning this incident of the power failure (and probably a lot more on the affair, since you are closer to Lodi than I am in this frigid state, and possibly may even be acquainted with Mrs. Smith) but I've sent it along in case you'd missed it.

UFO REPORTS FROM ST. PAUL NEWSPAPERS (1947)

St. Paul Dispatch, 6/26/47:

Mysterious air objects in Oregon, puzzle observers. Kenneth Arnold, a flying businessman, reports he saw nine shiny, flat objects as big as an airplane (DC-4) flying at 1200 miles per hour over western Washington. They had a peculiar weaving motion like tail of kite.

St. Paul Pioneer Press, 6/27/47:

"More Flying Discs Seen." Oklahoman says that, six or seven weeks ago, he saw several speeding discs. A Kansas City carpenter says he saw eight or nine such objects in the sky, speeding westward. A Bremerton (Wash.) housewife says she saw them twice in the past ten days. At Eugene, Ore., E.H. Sprinkle, (any kin to APRO's Dr. R.Leo?) says he almost got a picture of them. They were racing from the southeast to the northwest, but before he could click his shutter they disappeared.

st.P. PP, 6/30/47:

Westerners were seeing flying discs Sunday (June 29th) almost everywhere from Canada to Texas. There was a similarity in all the reports. The discs were said to be round like "saucers." (I think this was the first time the St.Paul papers referred to them as "saucers."=--JC) Most observers reported them to be travelling south, at a high rate of speed. They were described as "of such brightness that reflections from them were almost blinding!"

St.P. PP, 7/3/47:

The mysterious flying saucers were sighted over Denver, Wednesday night. Henry Martin and Walter Harrod said they saw a group of brightly colored objects. Martin said they looked like "coffee-can tops." These objects were speeding southwesterly over Denver. Both men reported that the objects were moving swiftly and might have been a mile above the earth.

St.P. Disp., 7/4/47

"Original Area Reports More Flying Discs." At Alturas, Calif., Attorney Charles Lederer of Modoc County and Dale Williams, secretary of the Alturas Chamber of Commerce, reported seeing seven swift-moving discs while driving through the Warner Mountains, not far from Oregon border.

So far, reports of discs have come from Calif., Colo., Ariz., N.Mex., Texas, Okla., and Kansas. They are described as being shaped like discs, circles, balls, saucers, and coffee-can tops.

"Mystery Discs May Be U.S. Navy Planes!" Chicago(UP) Sky watchers, from coast to coast, reported Friday they had seen the flying saucers which reportedly have been careening through the skies since June 24, (sic) and a Los Angeles paper suggested that the discs might be a new type of Navy airplane." This news item went on to say that the Navy had a new plane resembling a "legless crab." According to the Los Angeles <u>Daily News</u>, such a plane was described in a recent issue of a scientific magazine. The craft, known as the "Flying Flapjack," can travel at 400 to 425 miles per hour. (Note that Arnold's report, 6/26, describes speeds three times this fast!)

H.E. Soule, Appleton, Calif., said he saw one of the discs at close range last Saturday, when it swooped toward the ground near his home! "It had no motor sound, no visable vapor trail, a terrific speed, and was aluminum-colored---not shiny," he said.

Police in two Portland (Ore.) suburbs reported that from their cruise cars they saw flying saucers weaving about the sky "in a playful manner," at a high rate of speed. They contacted headquarters by radio to report these didoes. Headquarters alerted all cars to "stand by, observe the discs, and report all observations!" (Wonder what ever became of the log-book for that day? - JC)

Two Navy chief petty officers reported three discs, travelling about four hundred miles per hour, 20 miles west of Naval Station at San Diego. Robert L. Jackson and William Baker said the discs, flying in close formations, came in from the west and then headed back over the ocean, again.

Meade Layne, San Diego publisher of an Occult magazine, said the discs are really "etheric bodies" from another world. He also said he received messages from people aboard the discs, via a medium, and they wanted to experiment with "living on earth." He reports, "They come with good intent." (This <u>must</u> be the same MFS Layne whose earlier remarks I have recorded in my report from Issue #17 of DOUBT Magazine, page 251. The report had to do with a sighting by Layne's "flock" of a space-ship which crossed the moon, on Oct.8,1946, in the Los Angeles area. Mr. Layne called this space-ship, "Careets," which is nice name for any space-ship, providing it is a female of the specie. Unfortunately, the sighting on Oct.8th, seems to have been seen only by those who subscribed to Layne's Round Robin Magazine.)

"Airline Crew Sights Saucers---Called Bigger Than Aircraft" A United Airlines pilot told of having sighted nine of the discs while flying over Idaho. The pilot said "they were bigger than aircraft."

Capt. E.J. Smith, of United Airlines trip #105 which left Boise at 9:04 PM, said that his co-pilot, Ralph Stevens, blinked the transport's landing lights as a warning signal, in the belief that the discs were other aircraft.

Smith stated that it was eight minutes after takeoff from Boise that he and Stevens saw five discs, flying what appeared to be a loose formation.

They called Miss Marty Morrow, the stewardess, to the cockpit to verify that they were actually seeing the discs, and she agreed that she too saw them.

Then, they saw four more discs, three clustered together, and the fourth flying by itself in the distance.

The plane was flying into the dim twilight sky when the objects were first sighted, Smith told the <u>Idaho Daily Statesman</u> by telephone from Pendleton, Oregon.

Smith and Stevens said that when the landing lights were blinked, they could see no answering signals from the objects. "The discs were flat and roundish. They definitely were not aircraft and they were much bigger than aircraft."

Following the first sighting of the discs, it was observed that the five objects were climbing on a course roughly following that of their plane. At no time was there any danger of a collision.

They were at 7,000 feet over Emmett, Idaho, when the landing lights were turned on as a warning. Smith picked up the microphone and called Ontario, Oregon CAA radio communications station, about 65 miles from Boise, but the operator there said he could see nothing.

"I know this," said Smith, "they were nothing from the ground in the way of fireworks reflections or anything like that. I know they weren't smoke. I know they weren't aircraft. I don't know how fast they were going. We all saw them. They were flat and circular, bigger than aircraft."

The saucers were sighted today in such widely separated points as Oregon, Washington, Idaho, Pennsylvania, New Orleans and Michigan.

A coastguardsman in Seattle took a picture of one from his front porch, but the enlargement showed only two white dots, one of which he explained was a flaw in the negative.

In Portland, Ore., many persons declared they had seen the discs, including police and three newspapermen. (See 7/5/47)

In New Orleans, Miss Lillian Lawless said she saw an object "shining like silver or chromium, flying at a great heighth and at terrific speed" in a north-easterly difection over Lake Pontchartrain.

And, for the first time, reports came from the east: Something round, and with a "halo" was reported from Philadelphia, but Dr.M.K.Leisy said it only appeared to be going the speed of the wind below the clouds.

From Summerside, Prince Edward Island, came reports of two discs. One was moving south, one southeast.

Sixty persons, picnicking near Twin Falls, Idaho, said they saw discs on Friday afternoon. (I think the affair where the old prospector's compass needle "gyrated wildly" took place near Twin Falls, at about this time, but I have no record of this in my notes.-JC)

"Seven States Report Flying Discs." - "Objects Noted at Decator." Claude Price of Springfield, Ill., concession superintendent of the Illinois State Fair, said that several autois's, parked along Route #36 near Decator, saw "mysterious round, flat objects" fly across the sky.

From Washington, D.C., came reports that the Army, Navy, and Air Force would like to know what the objects are. They have no idea either.

There were reports that the saucers might be some of the Navy's new "flying pancakes." The Navy reports that it has, at this time, only one of these planes, and this one is at Hartford, Conn.

In Salt Lake City, Mary Powers and Mrs. Lillian Dangerfield said they saw three "flat" discs moving from north to south, high over the city

(And, of course, "the able ranks of science"got into the act) A Dr. John G. Lynn, said to be "an expert on human behaviour," says that the discs are nothing but "imagination!"

St.Paul Pioneer Press, 7/6/47:

"Atomic Projects Called Source of Flying Discs!" A scientist on the Manhattan Project said that these discs were patially jet-propelled, and partially radio-controlled!!!

In Washington, D.C., the Committee on Atomic Research said this scientist's statements were not true! They were using no discs in their project, at present. (What interpretation do you give to those last two words? - JC)

Observers of the discs could not agree on their size. Some said they were 40 to 50 feet in diameter, while others described them as quite small.

Donald Dwiggins of Glendalc, Calif., saw four discs flying over Glendale which he reported seemed to change their shape in flight.

Near unanimity was recorded by observers on some of the common characteristics of the discs: terrific speed - bright reflections - round or oval shape - flat - flying with a peculiar undulating motion.

J.E. Johnston, of Waterloo (Iowa) said he saw a discs, Saturday. It was about the size of a dinner plate and only about 25 feet up.

James J. Hammer of St.Paul, said the discs were "old stuff" to him. Hammer said that 30 years ago he saw two of them floating over Happy Hollow Creek, one night. The only hitch is that Hammer's discs were square! ("30 years ago" would place this sighting in the World War I era. Happy Hollow is on the west (south) bank of the Mississippi, about three miles upstream from downtown St.Paul, and not far from Mendota.- JC)

Minneapolis Tribune, 7/6/47:

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The Armed Forces continue to profess ignorance of what these discs may be. They say they have no similar objects being used in their experiments.

"Canada Sees The Discs!" The area around Wallaceburg, in southwestern Ontario, has reported the discs.

A woman in St.Maries, Idaho, Mrs. Walter Johnson, said she saw some discs as big as a 5-room house land on a nearby mountain. Ten other persons saw the discs and all described them as thick like washtubs. The discs landed in a spot hard to reach and a search could not be immediately made.

A Catholic priest at Grafton, Wisc., found a disc-shaped object in his yard. Rev. Joseph Brasky said he heard a swishing, whirring noise, Sunday morning, and a moment later a thud and a mild explosion. He investigated and found a sheet-metal disc about 18 inches in diameter. It was warm to the touch and weighed about four to five pounds. He turned it over to the FBI. A Milwaukee news-editor said he examined the disc and it was nothing but a circular saw, bearing the trademark of a well-known mail order house. This editor didn't seem to be able to see the hole in the center of the disc in which the priest reported there were some wires and other gadgets.

The Army Air Forces said there was "something to the discs" in their estimation, but failed to say what. The Navy was equally mystified as to their origin.

Marine Ace, Joe Foss, sent one of the planes under his command after a "flying saucer" but the pilot failed to find it. Foss is head of the National Guard unit at Sioux Falls, Sodak.

And, Europe was doubting the sanity of Americans, concerning the discs. None had been seen in Europe to this date. (This last sentence, in view of what we now know about "foo fighters" and the mysterious rockets over Sweden in 1946, would appear to be merely the statement of a pooplyinformed reporter. Nevertheless, it appears in my notes, taken on July 7th, and must have been in the Pioneer Press for that date. - JC)

Mrs. Madelyn Ganow of Hagerstown, Maryland, said she saw five of the discs, flying eastward at a terrific speed. They made a noise like a far-away railroad train.

Nova Hart, of St. Louis, said he saw one of the discs on Sunday, near Pattonville. (Mo.?) He described it as circular with a ribbed framework, silver-grey in color, and said it seemed to have a motor and a propellor.

A Chicago woman reported a flying saucer with legs.

George Kuger of Denver, reported a disc with an American flag.

The first of the discs over New York State were reported by Mrs. Kenneth Wohley of Rochester. She said they were about the size of an ordinary saucer. (A good example of lack of "how far away?" -JC)

New Jersey residents said they saw discs near Palisades Park.

Virgil Been, Ransome County, Nodak., said he saw a green disc, about the size of a dinner plate, flying at a high rate of speed, about 40 or 50 feet above the ground.

Gregory Zimmer, Sioux Falls, Sodak., saw a disc with a small tail, at several thousand feet. It was travelling toward the southwest at a high rate of speed. (See, once again, the item concerning Joe Foss and the Sioux Falls Air National Guard, in the morning P.Press for this date)

The FBI said that the circular object found by the Grafton, Wisc., priest (see <u>P.Press</u>, 7/7) was nothing but a saw.

Several Milwaukee residents saw discs, over the weekend. Erwin Rottman described them as having tails and changing from gold to silver and then back to gold.

George Wilkinson, of Chicago, said that he and several other persons saw some big, flashy discs headed out over Lake Michigan on Sunday eve.

Charles Allen, Chicago, saw a bright ball in the sky, travelling southwest, on Sunday, after midnight.

Amy Heráliska, Palmdale (Calif.) saw what looked like a mama disk and five little baby discs. They flew about her and then went into what would have been her pouch had she been a kangaroo. (This is the first time this type of sighting has cropped up in my notes. - JC)

UFO Reports, St.P. Newspapers, 1947. (cont.)

St.P. Pioneer Press, 7/8/47:

Residents of all but a few states had reported the discs.

At Bozeman, Mont., Casey Baird, a pilot of a P-38 pursuit plane, working for the U.S. Geodetic Survey, said he had to evade a group of flying discs in a hurry. His partner tried to get a picture of these strange objects. (I believe this photo was later called a fraud. - JC)

A humorous (?) spokesman for the Navy made what the newspapers thought was a classic reply when asked if the discs belonged to the Navy: "The only thing we are building which looks like them (discs) is garbage-can covers, and they are not radio-controlled and only fly around in a high wind!"

St. Paul saw its first disc, Monday night. Robert Doody says he saw one from the corner of Grand Ave. and Cleveland. "It looked about 20 feet in diameter, was bright, and speeding west." (Mpls. is "west" - JC)

John Bull (sic) who works in the Omaha RR yards in east Minneapolis, reported that he and the yardmaster, Dean Ireton, saw what looked like the front of an automobile, hanging stationary in the air above them. It had what seemed to be headlights on the front. "The thing just stood there in the air, and then rushed off in about 3 seconds." It didn't make a sound, according to Bull. (My RR friends sometime tipple a bit, but I am not acquainted with these two gentlemen, so cannot pass judgement - JC)

Lester P. Barlow, a noted inventor, said he believes the discs are plastic, radio-controlled missiles, being developed by the Army.

A.B. Cross, Chattanooga (Tenn.) says he invented the flying disc and submitted it to the War Dept., back in 1943, but his idea was rejected.

R.L. Farnsworth, president of the American Rocket Society, remarked: "Nothing surprises me!" (This gentleman was a member of the Fortean Society and was always referred to in DOUBT as "Moon-Ho Farnsworth." - JC)

St.P. <u>Disp</u>., 7/8/47:

Carries account in headlines telling of French having seen saucers back in 1864. The reporter had found this account in Chas Fort's BOOK OF THE DAMNED. (As I remember, 20 years ago, I was rather teed-off at this reporter for having used this meager little 1864 report from a veritable treasure-trove of UFO material. Anyone who cares to read the first three of Fort's BOOKS, can find literally hundreds of sightings. - JC)

Mexico City residents saw their first discs and reported that they were flying in a westerly direction.

And, passengers on the Kornsjo-Halden express (Norway ?) told a rather odd story: They reported that they passed what looked like a tropical south-sea island, complete with blue lagoon, palm trees, little white houses, and a sandy beach!

\$3,000 is now offered for one of the discs, but no takers so far!

St.P. Disp., 7/9/47:

Reports of the discs had fallen off sharply, all over the nation.

Five jokesters in North Dakota admitted they made a disc which was found on a lawn at Woodworth.

The FBI was investigating a disc found in Idaho near Twin Falls. It was said to be similar to two drummer's cymbals placed face to face. It was about 30½ inches in diameter, with a metal dome on one side and a plastic dome on the other. It appeared to be held together with stove bolts. It appeared to have been turned out by a machine.

The Navy says that people may be seeing the tin foil screens which the Navy sends aloft to reflect radar rays. They sent one aloft and immediately calls flooded the newspaper offices from persons who claimed they had seen flying discs.

(A lapse of ten days in UFO reports in either St. Paul newspaper)

Then:

St.Paul Sunday Pioneer Press, 7/20/47:

Dr.J.L. Moreno, a New York City phychiatrist, believes that people may have seen the things they described but it was merely a figment of their imagination caused by the strain of the atom bomb and the other worries of the world today. He believes, in other words, that this saucer mania is a form of "group hypnotism" which has spread all over the United States because people want to believe in such things.

The discovery of a supposed disc on a ranch north of Roswell, N.M., exited everyone for a while. This was later said to have been a radar screen target from a weather balloon.

In Tennessee, three discs were reported which were bigger than houses. They emitted fire and smoke.

In South Carolina, a group of Army pursuit planes chased a flock of discs but failed to catch them.

In Delaware, the discs resembled Mayonnaise jars. At night, they were scen as beautiful balls of fire.



Radar, it is said (by whom? -JC) failed to spot any flying discs.

Numerous objects had been found on the ground, but these had not been seen in flight, or at the very end of a flight, at most. A flying buzz-saw was found in Wisc.. (See Grafton, Wisc. Priest, <u>PPress</u>, 7/7) and a metallic thing, turtle-shaped, and with a back fin was picked up in California.

Eino Wepplo, of Franklin, Minn., found broken fragments of something hard and dark, in sizes from peas to apples, in his field. University of Minnesota scientists said these objects were pieces of earth, fused by lightning. Wepplo said he was familiar with results of lightning hitting the ground, but this was different.

(This <u>Pioneer Press</u> article also carried a picture of Ken Arnold, the familiar one in which Arnold stands next to the propellor on his plane, looking skyward while holding a movie camera. Caption also mentions that Arnold played foctball for U of Minn.. (This must have been during the "Bernie Bierman regime" but I don't remember him. - JC)

There is also a sketch of a flying disc, done by Jack LaBous. The object pictured has a "mast" and resembles the "McMinnville, Ore., photo" in Frank Edward's FLYING SAUCERS, SERIOUS BUSINESS.)

(In August of 1947, we moved back out to Mahtomedi, after having lived in an apartment in St. Paul for 1% years following my discharge from the Air Force. Therefore, the following reports are rather spotty, thanks to the hustle-bustle of work on the new home. However, I've tried to keep them in sequence as much as possible. - JC)

St.P. Disp., 12/11/47:

"Tokyo - Now It's Japan's Turn." Kyodo News Agency said today that a policeman and two companions in Fukushima, 125 miles north of here, reported seeing a flying saucer in mid-afternoon of Oct. 10th. Tt was described as about a yard in diameter, with a tail like a rocket, travelling west to east at about 650 feet altitude. (Another "estimation" of size, probably, but where had this report been lost for two months?)

StP. Disp.-"Hawf-n-Hawf" Column, 12/30/47:

That at Markville, La., on poultryless Thursday, (no date) hundreds of little fish had mysteriously dropped from the sky.

Seattle Times, 12/31/47:

Meteor-like flash seen in sky of Washington, Oregon, and No. Calif .. A deputy-sheriff organized a search for what he thought was a burning plane, but no plane found.

St.P. PP. 2/19/48:

"Meteor Blast Terrifies Kansas Town!" At Norton, Kansas, a meteor exploded, high in the sky, breaking windows and causing consterration in southern Kansas and northern Oklahoma. Persons reported seeing a ball of fire and a streak of smoke in the sky. The smoke trail was between 20,000 and 40,000 feet up, and about five miles long.

st.P. PP, 3/27/48:

"Green Rain Falls!" During a spring shower at Dayton, Ohio, green rain drenched residents in the eastern parts of the city. It discolored umbrellas, clothing, and left a greenish tint on white-painted homes. The "green" rain was not prevalent over the whole city but only in one section. It woon washed away. Local scientists could not explain it. Some thought it might be chlorophyll, others thought pollen, while others thought it might have been green algae, which had found their way somehow into a rain cloud!

St.P. PP, (Spring of 1948 - not dated)

Article by Thomas R. Henry, Washington, D.C., concerning mysterious "oasis" in Antarctic which only freezes over during "severe winters." Last winter, (our summer of '47) it froze over!

Billings Gazette, 2/22/49:

Article concerning winter of 1948-49, "The worst winter the west ever went through!" (This, and the item above, are included for the benefit of those who blame saucers for the "goofed-up" weather! -JC) 47-17-11

Some time ago you received a letter from Mr. Edward A. Halbach concerning a letter that I had sent out to all the listed amature astronomer societies in the united states, to get information on "Saucers".

You then wrote to me concerning the A.P.R.O. and asked if I would like to join your society; you meant to send me a membership form, but apparently you forgot to do so. If you will send me one, I will be happy to join you.

I sent out 110 letters in that survey, and I received 18 replys. Seven reported that they had seen "something", but the absence of accurate information, made any conclusion impossible. I conducted the search for my own satisfaction, but I was not much satisfied.

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The following are the only three possible saucer observations that I have ever made.

In the year of about 1947, I sighted what at first appared to be a large plane with three orange lights upon it. They were traveling due north and passed over my head about 15 seconds after I had spotted them. I soon realized that these lights could not be attached to one object, because the lights of the city are always bright enough to light up the underside of any plane. The lights were spaced about 2 deg. appart when they were directly overhead, and at the same time appared about as bright as -2 magnetude.

The lights were identical in brightness, and in color, and were the color of an incandescent solid heated to a bright orange temperature.

Since I had never seen an airplane carry lights of this color, I presumed that they were saucers. I witnessed all this from my open window at about 11:00 o'clock at night; I had a 1 5/8" refractor at the time, and I soon picked it up to see if I could resolve the lights into some type of object.

The lights appared as stars in the scope(25)X) and I watched the lights in the scope untill they went out of sight; this took about 20 min.

I listened intently all during the time and even after they had passed, but I could hear nothing. The objects maintaned a course about 10° east of north and then turned eastward as they went out of sight.

So maybe they were just three airplanes with fog lights(the sky was clear with the everpresent haziness near the horizen, at the time), but maybe they were not.

The second observation occurred at 10:00 o'clock Dec. 12, 1952 in the evening.

I happened to look straight up and my eye caught sight of what appared to be four or five starlike white objects. The objects were about 2nd magnetude. I started counting approximate seconds as so n as I saw them and I had to run a ways around the house to keep them in sight, and in five seconds they had dissapeared out of sight because of distance. The course appared to be perfectly straight and of uniform velocity ; due south.

I later calculated that these could have been jets at about 500 mph. I was quite surprized to find this; to find if this was true I would have to check with the Air Force; I have not done this.

The third and last observation was at 11:30 that same night. I was observing that night, and would occationly look up to see what I could see. At

11:30 I saw a pair of lights approaching from the south, again, I started counting seconds and had to run to keep them from going behind some trees.

The lights were identical in size and color; they looked like small disks, or what might be described as tiny arc lights surrounded by a red-violet glow.

They reminded me of the tail lights of a car. I thought that as an inversion phenomena, this might explain them, untill I realized that the car would have to be traveling without headlights down a street without street lights. Since streets without lights are rare within about a mile in any direction, I considered this explaination as quite improbable.

The lights went out of sight in 20 seconds, and they were travleing in about a 10° east of north direction when I spotted them, at which time they were south-east from me; by the time they were going out of sight they were about 40° east of north from me.

The size of the glow or disk about each point of light was about 10 minits of arc in diameter, and the points themselves were about 1 1/2 magnetudes in brightness themselves,, at the time of closest approach, and at which time they were about 30° up from the horizen. No sound was ever hearh in connection with the above events.

These are all the possible saucer events that I have ever witnessed. I am in complete sympathy with those who try to get accurate information concerning such phenomena, as well as with those who attempt to classify and analyze the reports. If I can be of any assistance to you, please let me know.

Dear Mr. and Mrs. Lorensen;

Enclosed find three (3) reports from my log book. I have quite a few more, that will be sending your way, as soon as I type them out. I will send you the origi als, and keep the copies. I have been very interested in UFO since the very beginning. I saw my first UFO in the latter part of May, 1947. This was before Ken Arnolds sighting, and the UFO was on the ground. It was quite late at night, and the first thing I thought of was a very large bon fire. Quite frankly. I thought it was hobo's building a fire in our field. Why Hobo's, I'm not quite sure of today, as we were 12 miles from the railroad, and the tracks only went from Minneapolis Minnesota, to Duluth, two passengers a day, very few freights. But, at the time, I was 13, and that explaination sounded reasonable. I called my folks, and started to get my .22 rifle out and shoot up in the air to scare them. (Icould see shadows between me and the "fire".Before my folks were completely aroused, my "fire" made a short "run" (such as an airplamaewould do, only very much shorter) across the field, and up into the air. My parents arrived in time to watch it fade out in the Northeast. Any conventional aircraft can be ruled out, as the sound would have been heard. Jets were experimental at the time, and no jet could have taken off with only 20 foot run. No sound was heard at all, although the light was 1/4 a mild away fro where I was. At the time, I had no idea what it could have been, but soon the first big Flap started, and then I knew what I'd seen. I never reported it to anyone, or even mentioned it, because everyone would have laughed, or had me examined for a mental case. Since then. I have carried on a very exte sive study of the UFO, and have had many good clean sightings, myself. I am well qualified to tell the difference in UFO and any conventional object. I spent 9 years in service, and got to know all aircraft, balloons, etc.

My partner and I ame going to Colorado the weekend of the 31st. Mr. Huggins has already asked you for any information you may have on the area we will be in. We plan to leave here the evening of the 31st, be in Colorado and set up for the night of Feb 1st. We are going to set up operations on the dirt road leading towards the Great Sand Dunes National Monument. We will be between Highway 160 and 150, we are going to try to set up almost directly opposite of Blanca Peak, on that road. That should give us fairly good coverage of the area. We will be equipped with cameras, and gear to be able to report any sightings. If any new information does come into your office in reference to this area, please let us know as soon as possible. We would greatly appreciate it.

Mr. Wright and two other men were working on the highway replacing or rather planting sight posts** when their attention was attracted by a small plane passing by. Very shortly afterward Mr. Wright's co-workers shouted to him and looking up he saw what they were seeing-a somewhat cigar shaped object headed mostly north and at a terrific speed. There was no sound or vapor trail, being quite low in altitude. Mr. Wright judged it to be around 30 feet long, much longer than high (thick). He stated that the other two men spoke of seeing a dome on top but not having observed it for as long a time as they did, he did not notice such a protrudence.

Quote. "My sighting of the object was not over one full second at best. Having previously served in the navy and having been through their identification courses where a person is expected to be able to identify aircraft and ships by a flash of only a tiny portion of a second, I feel certain the time was no longer. The other two men were together at about two hundred feet distance. Allowing anything at all for time lapse and my reaction, etc., they must have had 3 or 4 seconds to see the object. The valley is narrow there, the field of vision in the sky is very limited. At the terrific speed it was moving, I do not believe it could have taken more than 5 seconds at most to have covered the entire field of vision. It was completely symmetrical. The thought I had at the time, which I have no way of improving, was that it looked more than anything else as I would expect an autogiro to appear, except; no sound, no motor nacelles no landing gear, no tail assembly, as well as a speed far beyond any other aircraft I have ever observed. This object did no maneuver whatsoever, but moved in a straight line of sight across the sky." Unquote.

The sun was high in the sky, making for excellent observational conditions in this rugged country. The UFO's color was that of dull aluminum paint, not shiney or bright. There were no reflections. Mr. Wright stated that he had never before or has since seen anything similiar to this object.

Statement of UFO Sightings

Dear Frank:

We were very happy to get your letter and the reprint of your article. This field of study has always been quite interesting to me as it is so foolish for us to believe that this one particle of the universe would be the only planet favored by life.

The article is well worn here at the plant with many of my associates having read it. The people I now work with are in research and development and although this is a trying job, it is very interesting. More specifically I have the managership of keeping the Plutonun Recycle Test Reactor running and installing such modifications as are needed to further research on this new form of power. This reactor is a pressurized (1050 psi) D₂O moduated reactor runny 70 megawatts thermal. Its basic study is the use of plutorum (man made) to replace the U 235 in depleated uranium. In other words the plutorum formed in the reactor is reused with the old uranium--much like burning coal and then burning the ashes time and time again. It probably will turn out to be a prime source of power in future power reactors.

The family here is fine. Ricky, who you mentioned in your letter, is going into 8th grade in the fall. He is a real character, a pretty good musician and a go-cart buff. Marion's husband was stationed at the Rivers Air Force Base as were his two friends. They were all returning to the base from seeing a movie in Brandon. The object was first sighted about 19 to 20 miles east of Rivers appearing suddenly to the left of the automobile and paced it at the cars speed of about 40 - 50 mph. Marion's husband, who was driving, brought the car to a halt, the object doing the same. The occupants of the car rolled down the windows of the car in order to observe this object better. They watched for about half an hour. During this time the object hung completely motionless just above the wires that bring power into Rivers. (see sketch).

The object appeared to be 25 feet long and made from one piece of shiny silvery metal. There did not seem to be any windows, doors, or seams. There was a dome-like projection on top of the main body of the object. The underside of the object gave off a very brilliant white light which illuminated the ground and roadway under and around the object. After about half an house, the object suddenly winked out like a light that was turned off. It was not seen again.

When the witnesses readhed Rivers, they reported what they had seen to an officer on the Air Force Base, who stated that he thought it could have been a secret plane and that they should not mention what they saw to anyone.

I am wondering if the Air Force has any record of these objects.





Arnold who weighs 210 pounds and who used to play football at the University of Minnesota, has spent a great deal of time and \$12,000 of his own funds in investigating this phenomenon which has puzzled scientists and governments ever since he first saw them. No one any longer laughs them off as a figment of the imagination.

"I HAVE INTERVIEWED more than 5,000 who have seen flying saucers or who have had some solid evidence to present", he said. "I have made tape recordings of conversations with 200 airlines pilots describing their experiences with flying saucers, and I have taken 150 feet of 16 millimeter film in color all showing flying sau-

thought them to be jets. Then from their speed and shape, he concluded they must be guided missiles with which the U.S. government was experimenting.

BUT WHEN he landed at the Yakima Airport, Arnold felt it his duty to report what he had seen. Nine whatzitts flying diagonally in an echelon formation.

Later when a reporter questioned him, Arnold said:

"They flew like a saucer would if you skipped it across water."

And if the flying saucer was not born at that moment, at least it was christened.

Arnold believes the "Saucers" to be thousands of years old. He says they are "perfectly" described by the prophet Ezekial in the Old Testament.

Arnold believes the "saucers" authorities are no longer worried about the flying saucers as a physical menace as much as a psychological factor in the national mind.

Arnold says that the air authorities never scoffed at his first report.

"I have had 5,600 hours in the air. I have a good reputation as a pilot. My report was never funny to the Air Force or to other pilots.

"I may have been the first pilot to see flying saucers in their present cycle, But I am by no means the first person in history to have spotted or described them."

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

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THE American Public, since July 10, 1947, has read a variety of newspaper stories, magazine articles and at least three books concerning a phenomenon which has become known, through an unfortunate selection of words, as the flying saucer.

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Some of these stories have been written by scientists and science editors whose opinions are highly respected; others have been official pronouncements from high sources (as high as the Secretary of the President of the United States) including all branches of the military and intelligence services; still more have been by writers and newspapermen addicted to yellow journalism; and finally, by outright crackpots. Much of this mass of opinion has been accepted as factual rather than theoretical and, in the case of authority, as an actual explanation for the mysterious sky objects. The truth is none of these respected and widely circulated statements were

written by persons who actually saw the objects they discuss and dismiss so officiously.

It has been strange and unjust that the testimony of reputable and highly trained observers of the sky objects has been denied the same widespread publicity that has attended the theoretical and skeptical statement.

Actual observers of flying saucers, such as myself and Captain E. J. Smith of United Airlines (who were largely responsible, in that order, for the initial impetus to the story which became the sensation of the world press for more than two weeks) have been the butt of such ridicule, of such newspaper notoriety, and the objects of so much irrelevant and even insulting investigation that it has served to cause other observers in responsible positions to keep tightly buttoned lips concerning their observations.

It is time we were heard, and it is also time that factual report-

ing replaces wild theory, fanciful imaginings and even outright falsification.

Officials and experts have explained the flying saucers by ignoring facts; and in some instances, by distorting them. I want to present these facts here, without advancing theories and avoiding conclusions. Any explanation that can be made thereafter must satisfactorily include every factor in the evidence which I am about to produce, otherwise it will have no semblance to true scientific method.

Since 1944 I have spent more than 4000 hours in the air, flying in mountainous country. I sell fire extinguishing apparatus by calling on customers in five western states by plane. I also take an active part in Idaho Search and Rescue flights as well as flying deputy for the Ada County Aerial Posse. Any pilot flying this vast and sometimes primitive territory must have good eyesight and a high degree of recognition and precision in his makeup, or he doesn't live long.

What I saw over the Cascade Mountains in the State of Washington is fact; I cannot logically classify my observation in the category of illusion, hallucination or apparition. My physical and mental health is a matter of record.

O^N Tuesday, June 24, 1947, I had finished installing fire fighting apparatus for Central Air Service at Chehallis, Washington, and was discussing a lost C-46 Marine transport supposed down in the vicinity of Mount Rainier with Herb Critzer, chief pilot for CAS. I decided, as a result, to spend enough time in the air on my flight to Yakima to make an attempt to locate the wreckage, since there was a \$5000 reward being offered for finding it. My plane is a specially designed mountainflying type, and with my experience in this kind of flying, I felt qualified to engage in the hunt.

I took off at 2:00 p.m. and flew directly toward the Rainier plateau (elevation between 9000 and 10,500 feet). While making a turn over Mineral, Washington, at approximately 9200 feet, a bright flash illuminated the surfaces of my aircraft. This alarmed me as I thought I was dangerously close to another plane. I searched the sky hastily in an attempt to determine the source of the flash. The only plane I saw was a DC-4 far to my left and rear. Then the flash came again.

This time I observed a formation of very bright objects to the north, approaching from the vicinity of Mount Baker. They were flying close to the mountain tops and traveling at tremendous speed.

At first I couldn't make out their shapes as they were still at a great distance, however I observed that the formation was going to pass directly in front of me. Thinking I was observing a formation of "jets," I watched the objects approach the snow border of Mount Rainier.

There were nine of the objects flying in echelon formation with a disproportionately larger gap between the first four and the last five.

At this point I was startled to observe there were no tails on the objects. I felt sure, being jets, they had tails, but thought they had been camouflaged in some way; I knew the military was very artful in its use. But when they flipped and flashed along with the snow behind them I saw their outlines plainly. They had no tails.

The aircraft were traveling from north to south at almost right angles to me, so I was in a good position to clock their speed. I made an attempt to do so. The bulks of Rainier and Adams made perfect markers. When the first of the craft left the snowbased cleft of Mount Rainier, going southward, the second hand on my clock was approaching the top ot my hour dial and the time was within a few seconds of 2:59 (Mountain time).

The aircraft didn't fly like any I had ever seen before. Their echelon formation was the reverse of that practiced by our Air Force; the first craft being at a greater elevation than the last. They definitely flew in formation, but erratically, in a weaving motion. Their movement was comparable to speed boats on rough water, or a formation of geese, in a rather diagonal chainlike line. As I put it to a newsman in Pendleton, Oregon, they flew like a saucer would if you skipped it

across the water.

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At the time I did not get the impression that the very bright bluewhite flashes emitted from their surfaces as they alternately tipped from one side to the other, were emissions, but rather that it was the sun's reflection from their extremely highly polished surfaces.

They held a constant direction. changed only by the necessity of swerving in and out among the peaks that form the hogback of the Cascades between Rainier and Adams. I determined my distance from their pathway to be in the vicinity of 23 miles. I knew where I was, and I placed the objects when they momentarily disappeared behind a jagged peak that juts out from the base of Mount Rainier proper. This estimation is approximate, because I was myself flying in the direction of the formation, but it is close enough for computation.

There is a very high plateau with quite definite north and south edges between Mount Rainier and Mount Adams. Part of the chain-like formation of aircraft appeared to be traveling above this plateau toward Mount Adams, while part dipped below the rim on my side. As the first unit cleared the southernmost edge of this background, the last of the formation was just entering the northern edge. I later flew my plane over this course and came to the conclusion that the formation had formed a chain approximately five miles long.

As the last of this group of objects sped past and seemed to gather altitude beyond the southernmost crest of Mount Adams, I glanced again at my clock. The entire time of observation covering the distance between Mount Rainier to the north and Mount Adams to the south had been one minute and forty-two seconds.

I was so amazed by my experience that I gave up the search for the C-46. I wanted to get to Yakima and tell what I had seen.

About 4:00 p.m. I landed at Yakima and asked Al Baxter, general manager of Central Aircraft, to see me in private. He dropped what he was doing, took me into his office, where I told him of my observation and drew him pictures of what I had seen. He called in several of his flight pilots and helicopter instructors to listen to my story. My enthusiasm was cooled a bit when one of the helicopter pilots said, "Ahh, it's just a flight of those guided missiles from Moses Lake."

I got back into my airplane and took off for Pendleton, Oregon. While flying, I remembered that I had forgotten to tell them that one of these craft was darker and of a slightly different shape, and that I hadn't told them I'd clocked their speed within fairly accurate limits. I took my map from its snap holder, grabbed my ruler and began estimating miles per hour. Flying my airplane at the same time was a little confusing, so I gave up, thinking my figures were wrong.

When I landed at Pendleton, there was quite a group of people to meet me. Before very long it seemed everybody around the airfield was listening to my story and figuring out the speed of the mystery objects. When it kept coming out at an excess of 1700 miles per hour. somebody said, "We're taking the measurements from too high up on both Mount Rainier and Mount Adams." So we took a measurement at the very base, far below the snow line and actually much shorter than the course I'd clocked. It was 30.8 miles. Even at this distance, which was so far on the conservative side that I knew it was incorrect, we still had a speed of over 1350 miles per hour. To me, that was that. They must be guided missiles, robotly controlled. I knew that at speeds of this velocity, the human body could not withstand the flipping, erratic movements of these strange craft.

I didn't get any sleep that night. Reporters, writers, press agencies and just curious people plagued me with questions. Nor can I begin to estimate the number of telegrams, phone calls and letters I tried to answer. After three days of this hubbub I came to the conclusion that I was the only sane one in the lot. From the number of reports that came in of other sightings, it wouldn't be long before there was a flying saucer in every garage. In order to stop what I thought was a

lot of foolishness, I flew to my home at Boise.

There Dave Johnson, aviation editor of the *Idaho Statesman* newspaper, a man whose ability and intelligence in matters related to military and civilian aviation I respected, called on me. When he had finished talking, I really began to wonder, because it seemed certain now that I was wrong in ascribing my sighting to a new military guided missile, and that the good old U.S.A. had nothing to do with my flying saucers.

O^N July 5, 1947, I had just land-ed at Seattle's Boeing Field with Colonel Paul Wieland, who had just returned from Germany where he had served as a judge in the Malmedy case and the Nuremburg trials. We nad been on a fishing trip off Seku, Washington, and had observed the mysterious "red tide" there. Immediately I was informed of the saucer sighting by United Airlines flight 105 out of Boisc at 9:04 p.m. the night before. Captain E. J. Smith, probably the most highly respected veteran pilot United Airlines has had seen the saucers too, and his sighting was supported and verified by his entire DC-3 crew.

I was so excited by their observation that I purchased every paper available at the Terminal Building newsstand. In one of the pictures was a photo of a flying disk taken by Frank Ryman, a Coast

Guard yeoman. He had taken the picture the night before.

I forgot about Colonel Wieland waiting for me at my plane and rushed uptown Seattle to the offices of International News Service to see the blown-up prints of the picture. Their reporter appeared happy enough to show it to me, but demanded to know who I was. I was reporter shy by this time, but had no alternative but to give my name. When I did, he grasped me by the arm and rushed me down to the ante room of the news building. There I met Captain E. J. Smith and his co-pilot, Ralph Stevens.

Here is the story as Captain Smith told it to me: "We landed our DC-3 at Boise shortly before 9:00 last night and not wishing to be late in our schedule, took off promptly at 9:04. The weather was perfect. It was a funny thing, but just before take-off, as I was climbing aboard our DC-3, someone in the crowd piped up and asked me if I'd seen any flying saucers. Up to this time I not only hadn't seen any, but really didn't believe there were such things. I yelled back at the enquirer that I would believe them when I saw them.

"Brother, you could have knocked me over with a feather when about eight minutes after take-off, at 7100 feet over Emmett, Idaho, we saw not one, but nine of them. At first I thought it was a group of light planes returning from some Fourth of July celebration, but then I real-

ized the things weren't aircraft, but were flat and circular.

"The first group of five appeared to open and close in formation, then veered to the left of the transport. I picked up my radio microphone and called the Ontario, Oregon CAA Radio Communication station, which was about 45 miles north and west from Boise. I didn't tell them what I was seeing, but said, 'Step outside and look to the southwest, about fifteen miles, and see what you can find.' The operator came back over the microphone and stated he saw nothing.

"At this time my co-pilot informed me the first group of disks had disappeared. It was then the second group, three together and a fourth off by itself, appeared. By then the transport had reached 8000 feet altitude and was cruising over the rugged country leading toward the Blue Mountains toward Pendleton, Oregon.

"My co-pilot saw exactly what I did when he stated that these objects seemed to merge, then disappear, then come back in sight, and finally vanish again to the northwest. This second group seemed to be higher than our flight path, and when they did leave, they left! Fast!

"I positively know they were nothing from the ground in the way of fireworks, reflections or smoke. I know they were not aircraft that I am familiar with. I don't know how fast they were going, but we all saw them. They were flat on the bottom, circular, and seemed rough on top. They were bigger than our aircraft."

I finally remembered Colonel Wieland and rushed back to the airport. I told him the story and we took off for Boise.

IN the next week I was requested to send in a full report of my experience to the commanding officer of Wright Patterson Field at Dayton, Ohio. I did so.

I was also visited by two representatives of A-2 Military Intelligence of the Fourth Air Force, Lieutenant Frank M. Brown and Captain William Davidson. They said they didn't know what flying saucers were. They quizzed me closely.

That evening at about 9:30, Captain Smith was coming through Boise. When I informed Davidson and Brown, they were elated, as he was on their list to question. We met at the Boise airport.

I was surprised to find Dave Johnson there, then it occurred to me that the military wanted to talk to him also. Only a few days previously he had observed and attempted to photograph a disk-like object which he had observed from his National Guard AT-6 while flying at 14,000 feet over Anderson Dam, east of Boise.

Captain Smith's stay between flights was brief; so none of us found out much, but I did learn that Davidson and Brown had flown to Boise in a military A-26 bomber

especially to see me. I was impressed, because these military craft are so big and powerful I had the idea that brains were sticking out all over anyone who could fly them.

Later, at my home, I laid all my facts before Davidson and Brown, but somehow, again neglected to tell them about the difference between the single object in the formation I had seen and the others. In fact, I had never even told my wife, because I attributed the difference to the angle at which I had observed this particular saucership.

The two A-2 men went through all my mail, selecting the names of persons, societies, organizations, who had written me asking for full accounts of my original experience. When I returned them to their hotel, they firmly impressed me with the idea that if anything of an unusual nature came to my attention, or if I needed help in any way, I was to phone them or wire collect in care of A-2, Fourth Air Force, Hamilton Field, California. They also cautioned me that it would be better for all concerned if I refused to discuss my experience further with outsiders.

THEN I received a letter from R. A. Paimer of Chicago, who told me of two harbor patrolmen at Tacoma, Washington—Harold A. Dahl and Fred L. Crisman—who claimed they had not only seen a group of saucers, but that they had in their possession some fragments

that came from one of them. Mr. Palmer offered expense money to investigate this report.

The next day, during a discussion with Dave Johnson, he revealed that he, too, had been requested to file a complete written report with the commanding officer at Wright Patterson Field. We didn't know it yet, but "Project Saucer" was already in full swing. I mentioned the Tacoma incident and the result was I flew to Tacoma on July 29, 1947, on an adventure that almost scared me out of the flying saucer picture. I took off about 5:00 a.m.

It was about 6:55 a.m. over the La Grande Valley that I saw a cluster of twenty to twenty-five brass-colored objects I took to be ducks. They were coming head-on and at what seemed a terrific rate of speed. I grabbed my camera and started shooting. Even though I thought they were ducks, I wasn't taking any chances.

The sun was at my back and to the right. The objects were coming into the sun. I wasn't sighting through the viewfinder on my camera, but along the side of it. As this group of objects came within 400 yards of me, they veered sharply away to the right, gaining altitude as they did so, and fluttering and flashing a dull amber color. I was a bit shocked and excited when I realized that they had the same flight characteristics as the large objects I had observed on June 24. They appeared to be round,

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rather rough on top, and to have a dark or a light spot on top of each one. I couldn't be absolutely positive of which, as it all happened so suddenly. I attempted to make a turn and follow them, but they disappeared to the east at a speed far in excess of my airplane. I know they weren't ducks.

Later, when the film was developed, I found my movie try had not been very successful. Only two of these objects could be found on the film, and could be seen only under a jeweler's glass.

I won't detail the trouble I had getting the reluctant Mr. Dahl to talk, but I finally got his story:

"On June 21, 1947, about 2:00 p.m. I was patrolling the east bay of Maury Island close in to the shore. The practically uninhabited island lies directly opposite the city of Tacoma about three miles from the mainland. This day the sea was rather rough and there were numerous low-hanging clouds. I, as captain, was steering my patrol boat close to the shore of a bay on Maury Island. On board were my two crewmen, my fifteen-year-old son and his dog.

"I looked up from the wheel and noticed six very large doughnutshaped aircraft. I would judge they were about 2000 feet above the water and almost directly overhead. At first glance I thought them to be halloons, as they seemed to be stationary. However, upon further observance I saw that five of these strange aircraft were circling slowly around the sixth which was stationary in the center of the formation. It appeared to me that the center aircraft was in some kind of trouble as it was losing altitude fairly rapidly. The other aircraft stayed at a distance of about 200 feet above the center one as if they were following it down. The center aircraft came to rest almost directly overhead about 500 feet above the water.

"All on board our boat were watching these aircraft with a great deal of interest as they apparently had no motors, propellers, or any other visible sign of propulsion. To the best of our hearing they made no sound. They were at least 100 feet in diameter. Each had a hole in the center, approximately 25 feet across. They were all sort of gold and silver color. Their surface second of metal and when the light shone on them through the clouds they were brilliant, not all of one brilliance, but many brilliances, something like a Buick burled dashboard. All of the aircraft seemed to have large portholes equally spaced around the outside of their doughnut exterior. These portholes were from five to six feet in diameter and were round." There also appeared to be a dark, circular, continuous window on the inside and bottom of the doughnut as though it were an observation window.

"All of us on the boat were afraid

this center balloon would crash into the bay, and just a little while before it stopped lowering, we pulied our boat over to the beach and got out with our harbor patrol camera. I took four photographs of these balloons.

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"The center balloon-like aircraft remained stationary at about 500 feet from the water, while the other five aircraft kept circling over it. After about five or six minutes one of the aircraft from the circling formation left its place and descended to the stationary aircraft. In fact, it appeared to touch and stayed beside the center aircraft for three or four minutes as if it were giving some sort of assistance.

"It was then we heard a dull noise like an underground explosion, or a thud similar to a man stamping his heel on damp ground. Immediately following this sound the center aircraft began spewing out what looked from that distance like thousands of newspapers from somewhere inside its center. These newspapers, which turned out to be sheets of a very light weight white metal, fluttered to earth, most of them lighting in the bay. It then seemed to hail, in the bay and on the beach, black or darker type metal which Jater looked similar to lava rock. We did not know if this metal was coming from the aircraft, but seemed that it was, as it fell at the same time the white metal was falling. However, since these fragments were of a darker color, we did not

observe them until they started hit-

ting the beach and the bay. All of these late fragments seemed hot, almost molten. When they hit the bay, steam rose from the water.

"We ran for the shelter under a cliff on the beach and behind logs to protect ourselves from the falling debris. In spite of our precautions, my son's arm was injured by one of the falling fragments and our dog was hit and killed.

"After this rain of metal seemed over, all of these strange aircraft lifted slowly and disappeared to the west, which is out to sea. They rose and vanished at a tremendous height.

"We tried to pick up several pieces of the metal and found them very hot indeed. After they had cooled, we loaded a considerable number of them aboard the boat. We also picked up some of the metal which had looked like falling news-

"The wheelhouse of our boat had been hit by the falling debris and damaged. We started the engines and went directly to Tacoma where my boy was given first aid at the hospital. I told my superior officer, Fred L. Crisman, of our experience. I gave him the film to develop. The negatives showed these strange aircraft, but they, were covered with spots similar to a negative that has been close to an x-ray room, except the spots were white instead of black."

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LATER, at his home, Dahl showed me fragments that I judged to be lava rock. But then I remembered the cinders or lava ash that had fallen to the ground near Mountain Home, Idaho, the 12th day of July, 1947, after a formation of flying saucers had passed over that area. The man who picked up portions of this ash sent it to the state chemical laboratory for analysis. I began to become excited. I decided to call in Captain Smith to help me in this investigation.

I flew to Seattle and brought Captain Smith back to Tacoma with me.

Mysterious things began to happen that gradually bewildered us. For instance, Ted 'Morello, of United Press, their head man in Tacoma, called and I started to hang up on him. He said, "Hold on a minute. Some crackpot has been phoning us here, telling us verbatim what has been going on in your hotel room." He proved it by relating some of the discussions we'd had. Both Smith and I suspected Dahl or Crisman of letting out the secret nature of our visit. We also ripped the room apart looking for dictaphones. We found nothing.

Crisman and Dahl brought in an armload of the black and white metal. We decided the white metal did not answer Dahl's original description, as it seemed ordinary aluminum from junked planes, except that the rivets were square instead of round. The black metal we could not identify, but piecing

it together, we found it would form a curve about six feet in diameter, and we concluded it might easily be the lining of a large rocket or jet tube.

Becoming more and more suspicious when we failed to turn up the film Dahl had supposedly taken, we finally decided to call in Davidson and Brown of A-2. I called Frank M. Brown person-to-person, heard him refuse to take the call on the base. Instead he called me back from an off-base pay phone. "Sit tight," he said. "We'll be there."

When Davidson and Brown arrived, they proceeded to question everybody thoroughly, gathered fragments of the two metals. During the conversation, Davidson took a piece of paper from his pocket and drew a picture. It was a disk identical to the one peculiar shaped saucer I had seen that first day, and which I'd not spoken of to anyone until this minute. Said Davidson, "This is a drawing of one of several photographs we consider to be authentic. We just received them from Phoenix, Arizona. We have prints at Hamilton Field, but the original negatives were flown to Washington, D. C."

Excitedly, I explained why and how I knew the picture was authentic.

At midnight Brown and Davidson revealed they had to leave, because they had flown to Tacoma in a B-25 bomber that had just gone through a complete major overhaul, bringing it up to date with the latest Air

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Force equipment, plus two brand new engines. It had to be on the flight line and ready in the morning. In front of the hotel, Davidson and Brown packed all their fragments, plus an additional Kellogg Corn Flakes boxful Crisman supplied, into their Army command car, and I helped lift the box. In doing so, I opened the flap and handled one of the fragments. It seemed to me to be more rocky and less metallic than the other fragments. I remember being suspicious of Crisman. I was suspicious of everything now, except the importance to me of Davidson's and Brown's visit.

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At 1:30 a.m. the B-25 carrying Brown and Davidson crashed near Kelso, Washington, killing them both. My first private investigation into flying saucers had resulted in the death of two government men and the loss of a government bomber. I suddenly didn't want to play investigator any more.

However, I did check the hospital records and found Dahl's son had been treated on the day in question. Smith and I also viewed the damaged boat, noting new repairs to the wheelhouse.

Project Saucer later reported this Tacoma incident had been a complete hoax. Whatever it was, out of it came several important facts which proved to me that what I had seen over the Cascades were the real thing, the flying saucers whose mystery I was trying to solve and doing so badly at it.

NTO testimony of this kind is complete without corroborating evidence. The incidents I present in the following are all from reliable and competent witnesses, and each one can be confirmed by the observers themselves at any time.

By July 7, 1947, the skeptics were crying, "Show us some pictures!" The big dailies were demanding such evidence as they wrote scoffing and sometimes hilarious articles about flying coffee cups, teapots and pickle forks. Then, on July 7, William H. Rhodes of Phoenix, Arizona. snapped two pictures of a flying disk circling over the city. He turned these pictures over to The Arizona Republic which published them on page one of the July o edition. These pictures were not merely dots in a negative, but showed the definite shape of the flying disks and revealed that they had a hole or bright spot in their centers. There were a great many witnesses, some of whom said later when asked, that the photos were reproductions of the object they had seen in the skies. Here was proof positive that these objects were not "spots before the eyes," but actually flying disks of an aeronautical design unrecognized by experts. These were the pictures Brown and Davidson (whom I discovered were high in Special Services Intelligence, highest in the land) had declared authentic hours before their tragic death.

Those pictures never reached any other newspaper, in spite of the fact

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that they were the hottest news in the world on July 9, 1947. On July 10 complete silence descended over the saucer story. An unofficial, but effective, censorship had been tightly clamped down. Project Saucer had become a reality which was to cost the taxpavers millions before it was officially "dropped" although it continued its investigations unabated, since they are still going on, as witnessed by most recent saucer observers' experience, some of which I will mention.

Later, on a trip to Hamilton Field, I was shown these photos, and actually given prints since at that time Intelligence was extremely interested in cooperating with competent observers, and obviously considered me to be such in view of their complete confidence in me.

Photographer Rhodes gave several interesting facts concerning saucer performance which were corroborated by other witnesses at Phoenix. among them competent military observers. "In three flights over the house, on a clockwise course, the saucer flew at 1000 feet elevation and made absolutely no sound of motor or jets, but only a 'whoosh' of passage. When it disappeared, it turned on its thin edge and shot straight up into the ether at incredible speed."

Rhodes also said there were "twin trails of vapor trailing from the points or edges to the rear of the heel-shaped object."

Next came an official release from

Lt. Colonel Donald L. Springer of the Fourth Air Force at Hamilton Field. It stated on August o that there were no such things as flying disks. It also stated that Springer went to Tacoma and brought back fragments resembling molten metal found on the Maury Island beach. "Similar material appears in great quantity in the area and other Tacoma areas." It was finally stated that no trace of a box of such fragments had been found in the wreckage of the crashed B-25. To me this last statement poses a great mystery, because I was there. I know the fragments were aboard. The answer must lie in the statement by Major George Sanders at McChord Field, Tacoma, from which the ill-fated B-25 had taken off that the plane contained "classified material," which means, in Intelligence parlance, "highly secret."

For those who wish to classify the Tacoma incident as a hoax or as a reality. I present here the analysis of the mystery metal:

High Constituents-Calcium, Iron, Zinc, Titanium.

Middle Constituents - Aluminum Manganese, Copper, Magnesium, Silicon.

Low Constituents-Nickel, Lead, Strontium, Chromium.

Traces-Silver, Tin, Cadmium.

Nothing of an unusual nature exists in this combination of metals except the unusually high quantity of Calcium. Calcium oxidizes when heated, and its presence in a high-

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constituent quantity in a fused metal which has been subjected to extreme heat is hard to explain. Technically, it would involve a very difficult processing procedure. Its presence in this material is mystifying. If it is a manufactured substance, its purpose in the mixture is equally difficult to understand.

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It is interesting to note that Titanium, one of the high-constituent metals, is now believed to be the key metal in constructing missiles or ships capable of space travel. Also, Calcium has an affinity for radioactive particles, and the ability to capture them and prevent contamination of surrounding areas.

great deal of publicity has been A given to two Air National Guard incidents. One involves Captain Thomas F. Mantell, Jr., who crashed to his death near Franklin, Kentucky, while chasing what he described as a very large metallic object, and which was described by Colonel Guy F. Hix, commander of Godman Field, who watched it for two hours from the observation tower as "to the south, very white and looking like an umbrella." Project Saucer reported this as the planet Venus, although it obviously was not, and later it was identified as a balloon.

The second incident is that of Lieutenant George Gorman of Fargo, North Dakota, who staged a twentyminute dogfight at night with a small, luminous flying disk which

he twice tried to crash into in an effort to bring it down, but which eluded him at speeds up to 600 miles per hour.

On June 5, 1949, Walter Winchell reported: "Air Force people are convinced the flying disk is real. The clincher came when the Air Force got a picture recently of three disks flying in formation over Stephensville, Newfoundland (the great transatlantic air base). They outdistanced our fastest ships."

At 2:45 early one July morning in 1948, Captain Clarence Shipe Chiles and co-pilot John B. Whitted were 20 miles southwest of Montgomery, Alabama, at 5000 feet. Chiles' story is as follows: "We had our eyes focused on the point from which the thing came. From the right and slightly above us came a bright glow and the long rocketlike ship took form in the distance.

"'It's a jet job,' I said to Whitted.

"Then it grew larger and pulled up alongside. It appeared to be about 100 feet long with a huge fuselage three times as large as that of a B-29.

"'It's too big for a jet, but what the devil is it?' asked Whitted.

"There were two rows of windows and it appeared definitely to be a two-decker. The lights from the side were a ghastly white, like the glow of a gas light—the whitest we'd ever seen.

"There was a long shaft on the chip's nose that looked like it might have been part of the radar con-

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trols. The ship acted that way too, for just after it pulled alongside us it whipped quickly upward at a very sharp angle."

Both craft veered to their respective left. The mystery ship passed about 700 feet to the right and above the airliner.

"Then, as if the pilot had seen us and wanted to avoid us, it pulled up with a tremendous burst of flame from the rear and zoomed into the clouds, its prop wash or jet rocking our DC-3."

The wingless craft gave the impression of having a pilot's cabin at the front of a cigar-shaped fuselage. The cabin was brightly lighted but the fuselage itself approximated the brilliance of a magnesium flare.

"We saw no occupants," Chiles said. "From the side of the craft came an intense, fairly dark blue glow that ran the entire length of the fuselage, like a blue fluorescent factory light. The exhaust was a red-orange flame, with a lighter colorpredominant around the outer edges."

Both Chiles and Whitted agreed that the exhaust flame extended 30 to 50 feet behind the object and became deeper in intensity as the craft pulled up into a cloud. They estimated its speed as being about one-third faster than ordinary jets, or about 700-900 miles per hour.

MARCH 31, 1950, Captain Jack Adams, veteran of 7000 hours in the air and seven years on the

Chicago and Southern Airlines, and co-pilot G. W. Anderson, Jr., who has 6000 flying hours time to his credit, saw "one of those things" at 9:29 p.m. It was a lighted, last-moving object, definitely not any known type of aircraft.

"It was about 1000 feet above us about a half-mile away. It zoomed at terrific speed (perhaps as much as 700 to 1000 miles per hour) in an arc ahead and above us, moving from south to north.

"This object remained in full view for about 30 seconds, and we got a good look. It had no navigation lights, but as it passed ahead of us in an arc we could plainly see other lights—as though from eight or ten lighted windows or ports—on the lower side.

"The lights had a fluorescent quality. They were soft and fuzzy, unlike any we'd seen before. The object was circular, apparently, and the lights remained distinct all the time it was in our view. There was no reflection, no exhaust, and no vapor trail, That's definite.

"There was a bright white light flashing intermittently from the top of the thing. The speed attracted our attention first, that and the blinking light. It was the strongest blue-white light we've ever seen."

April 27, 1950. Captain Adickes and First Officer Robert Manning flew their airliner over South Bend, Indiana. Adickes has been flying for 13 years and has been a TWA captain for 6 years.

"I had just had my dinner and was wide awake when this object flew alongside. It was definitely round, with no irregular features at all, and about 10 to 20 per cent as thick as it was round. It was very smooth and streamlined and glowed evenly with a bright red color as if it were heated stainless steel. It was so bright it gave off a light. It left no vapor, no flame. It appeared to fly on edge, like a wheel going down a highway.

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"I went back to show the passengers. Most of them saw it but they couldn't see it as clearly as we did because cabin lights were on and their eyes weren't adjusted to the darkness."

Adickes banked north in an effort to get a closer look. "It appeared to be controlled by repulse radar. As I'd turn toward it, it would veer away, keeping the same distance. "When I turned directly toward it, it took off at a speed judged to be about 400 m.p.h, about twice

to be about 400 m.p.h, about twice my speed. It went down to 1500 feet and streaked out of sight northward over South Bend."

ON May 20, 1950, Captain Willis T. Sperry of American Airlines, out of Washington, D.C., at 9:15 p.m., saw coming toward his DC-6 a brilliant, diffused, bluish light of fluorescent type. Momentarily it seemed to stop, possibly five seconds, and changed its course to parallel the DC-6 on the left.

"Three of us, First Officer Bill.

Gates, Flight Engineer Robert Araholt and I got a good look at it. Silhouetted against the moon, it appeared to be the shape of a torpedo or submarine, except there were no protruding fins or external structure of any kind. It appeared to be a perfectly streamlined object of a dark, metallic color, but at night it could have been pink or any other color and looked the same.

"In comparing the speed of this object with jet aircraft (which I have observed many times at close range), I would say without a doubt that the speed of the object was far beyond the limits of any known aircraft. In comparison the speed was fantastic."

January 20, 1951, Captain Larry W. Vinther and co-pilot James F. Bachmeier, flying a Mid-Continent Airline plane, saw a strange object over Sioux City, Iowa. The object had straight wings, no exhaust glow and no jet pods or engines were visible. Vinther was on the ground getting tower clearance for take-off when the tower asked him to check on a strange light in the sky. After take-off, Vinther spotted the light and climbed toward it. He saw a plane which had an unknown kind of navigation lights in addition to a strong white light underneath its fuselage. The object's lights all blinked on and off five or six times as the two craft drew close to each other, approaching from opposite directions.

"I had just turned my head from

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watching him go past our wing when there he was again, flying right beside us about 200 feet to our left and going in the same direction we were. You just can't turn an airplane around that fast at that speed." The strange plane flew alongside

for about four seconds, then dropped down and was lost from sight.

These saucer sightings I have mentioned I consider to be, and they are, of the strictest veracity and the most incontestible accuracy of observation. Their reliability cannot be questioned. And yet, now comes an explanation of the flying saucers in the person of Dr. Urner Liddel, chief of the nuclear physics branch of the Office of Naval Research.

Says he, the flying saucers are huge cosmic balloons called "skyhooks," which have been released in various parts of the country as part of a gigantic cosmic ray research program.

According to Dr. Liddel, their changing appearance under varied light conditions account for all responsible saucer reports. Light conditions, Dr. Liddel claims, make the balloons appear variously cupshaped, give them the appearance of trailing an exhaust, give them the appearance of having a strong glow on one side. The instrument-filled tail appears to be a rocket exhaust when illuminated by the sun under certain conditions. Dr. Liddel also claims that the reports of flying saucers began about the time balloons were first launched, and have

increased or decreased in accordance with the frequency of the launchings.

Dr. Liddel says that his explanation has never been publicized before because the project was secret. "Now there is no longer any need for secrecy on a scientific basis," he says. "And certainly, there is no longer any need to keep the public in the dark about what flying saucers are."

Nothing could be further from fact than Dr. Liddel's incredible solution.

LIRST of all the Skyhook balloon program has not been a secret as Dr. Liddel claims. One of the first articles ever published on saucers in a national magazine mentioned the cosmic balloons as the basis for some reported saucer sightings. This was, of course, Sidney Shallett's two-part article in the Saturday Evening Post. One of the parts was illustrated with a huge photograph of such a balloon. Incidentally, the first part of this article appeared on the same day Project Saucer issued its voluminous report on the flying saucers which stated definitely that "flying disks are no joke."

Next, the statement as to the correlation between flying saucer sightings and balloon launchings is a complete myth with one exception —flying saucers and balloons have both been in the sky since 1947. The actual fact is that flying saucer re-

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ports, many of them as reliable as the ones I have quoted, appeared all during the war. More, these same sky objects have been observed for several hundred years. Notable instances are contained in the collections of newspaperman Charles Fort, who included them in his books on mysteries he encountered and unearthed in his lifetime of research into unusual phenomena. I have talked to numerous war-time pilots who saw flying saucers before any balloon experiments were going on. Further, saucer sightings are not limited to this country, but have been sighted and photographed all over the world.

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In addition, Dr. Liddel states that his balloons travel at such tremendous speeds as 200 miles per hour at elevations up to 100,000 feet.

Based on Dr. Liddel's own statements, I cannot help but realize that his balloons account for only scattered and irresponsible sightings. By ignoring facts, Dr. Liddel has made a very weak case for himself indeed.

I challenge Dr. Liddel to fit his balloon hypothesis to a single one of the instances I have given here, with the possible exception of the Mantell incident.

I, and thousands of responsible Americans also, know the flying saucers are a very real, though unexplained, phenomenon, and that they are in no way related to "skyhook" balloons. I have seen mysterious sky objects myself five times,

but I have yet to have the pleasure of observing a cosmic ray balloon. The sun alone confounds the

Naval expert, since most of the instances I have quoted occurred at night, when the sun was absent.

It's about time an *honest* investigation of flying saucers was made, and a genuine report given to the American people. And contrary to the amusing legend that has grown up around Orson Welles' "Martian Invasion" broadcast concerning the panic it caused, the American public isn't going to be scared out of its pants at the realization that something almost all of them already know is real, is an actuality.

If Crisman's age of 47 as given in 1969 is correct, he would have been about 25 at the time of Maury Island, old enough to have flown fighter planes over Burma in World War II, a claim he reportedly made at the time and which none of the accounts appears to question. Otherwise, there is not a single detail in the published accounts regarding his life prior to then.

At the time in the summer of 1947, he was operating what was called a harbor patrol on Puget Sound and apparently living in Tacoma. The nature of this harbor patrol is nowhere explained, but judging from a statement made by his assistant, Harold Dahl, about recovering a log boom worth \$5,000, it appears to have been a sort of waterborne trash-collection service operated by these men in which their compensation consisted of salvaging whatever they found worthwhile in return for keeping navigable waters free of debris.

No further details substantiate such an inference, but on the other hand the accounts contain nothing to contradict it. They do make clear that while this arrangement may have been some sort of contract with the Coast Guard, Crisman andDahl were not members of the Coast Guard, as one account assumes. Wilkins and Menzel both spell Crisman's name "Chrisman," but the Arnold-Palmer version uses Fred Lee Crisman and there appears little doubt the man they are talking about is the same one living in Tacoma today -- unless identities have been switched.

In any case, Dahl was the principal in the actual incident at Maury Island. Crisman was not there, but played an important role in what followed.

The incident did not become known publicly for almost two weeks. There was obvious confusion at the time, and still exists, as to whether it was genuine or a hoax. The evidence at this late date appears weighted in favor of a hoax, with Crisman playing a major role.

The story actually begins on June 24, 1947, when a Boise, Idaho, salesman of fire control equipment was flying his private plane east of Mt. Ranier in Washington and sighted nine metallic-looking, saucer-shaped objects flying at speeds of more than 1,000 miles per hour and behaving in ways no known aircraft could duplicate.

While there had been many earlier sightings throughout recorded history of equally strange aerial phenomena, none had received anything like the enormous publicity or achieved the world-wide impact of the Arnold sighting. With seismic suddenness, it posed the possible existence of an alien technology far advanced beyond any known to terrestrial man and fully able to get at him. Arnold, a go-getting business type who flew his own plane, appeared fully normal otherwise and credible as a witness due to his experience in the air. He was impossible to ignore.

Whether one believes in flying saucers or not, it was Kenneth Arnold's sighting that put them irrevocably into the consciousness of the human race, and with them their disturbing implications to the ethnocentric concept of the cosmos.

It was around a week later that the Maury Island incident became public knowledge, but to a much lesser extent. By this time there had been still other sightings, some apparently genuine, but some obviously fakes. The news media were beginning to be wary of handling such items. and apparently viewed the Maury Island account with enough scepticism to ignore it to a large extent.

According to Palmer and Arnold, Crisman telephoned Palmer at Amherst, Wis., where Palmer was publisher of Fate magazine, to tell himm of Dahl's story and apparently tried to sell him the story. Palmer apparently stalled, got in touch with Arnold, and asked him to fly to Tacoma to investigate, sending him \$200 in expense money.

Arnold went, and first contacted Dahl, who initially was reluctant to talk, appeared very frightened, speaking of telephoned threats to himself and his family if he didn't keep his mouth shut. Gradually, Arnold got his story, which was that on June 21 (three days prior to Arnold's own experience near Mt. Ranier) Dahl had been patrolling near Maury Island three miles north of Tacoma when he saw six large doughnut-shaped metallic-looking craft overhead. Five were circling around one in the center that appeared to be in trouble. They drew close to it, and presently debris began falling from the center craft, some of it damaging Dahl's boat, killing his dog and injuring his young son. Then the craft all shot up into the sky and disappeared. Dahl picked up some of the fragments (he estimated many tons were left on the island) which were of two kinds: slag-like chunks which appeared to be parts of a cylindrical object such as the refractory jacket of a firing chamber of some kind, and thin sheets of aluminum-like metal similar to those that make up the skin of an airplane.

Arnold writes that for several days he stayed at a hotel in Tacoma, talking intermittently with Dahl and Crisman and trying, with the aid of an airline pilot friend, to check out their story. Yet he never was taken to Maury Island, and although Crisman showed him the boat allegedly damaged by the falling fragments, Arnold did not believe the old boat he was shown was capable of functioning as a patrol craft nor that the damage it showed was anything like as extensive or severe as Hahl and Crisman had represented.

In the meantime, Arnold had contacted two Army Air Force intelligence officers at Hamilton Field in California who had investigated his own sighting. They flew to Tacoma, interviewed Arnold, Dahl and Crisman, took some of the alleged fragments, and then were killed when their plane crashed in flames shortly after takeoff from McChord AFB. Also during this time, two Tacoma newsmen, one from International News Service and another from United Press, somehow learned that Arnold was in town and repeatedly called him up. They not only told him they had been warned to stay away from the case and advised him to do so too. They also told him they were receiving mysterious telephone calls from an unidentified man who was giving them exact, play-by-play accounts of what Arnold was doing, with whom he was talking, and about what. Arnold and his airline pilot friend turned their room upside down, but could find no evidence of bugging.

Menzel and Ruppelt both say that Crisman was the mysterious caller. However, Arnold goes out of his way in his account to relate how he suspected Crisman, but was able to establish in at least one instance that Crisman was in the room with him at the time one of the mysterious calls to the newsmen was being madd. He makes it clear he thinks someone else was doing the calling.

Arnold left Tacoma profoundly disturbed over the death of his two Air Force friends, by the apparent inconsistencies and internal contradictions in the Dahl-Crisman story, and by certain other inexplicable circumstances connected with the whole encounter which are too involved to detail here.

If, as appears likely, the Maury Island incident was a hoax, the conclusion appears probable that Crisman was at least the straw-boss of the whole operation. Dahl is described as a beefy, rather simple young man, manifestly incapable of dreaming up such a complicated story. Crisman emerges as smooth and articulate, tending toward the gregarious but always somewhat evasive and even mysterious. Arnold remarks that he never was able to find out where Crisman actually lived. The identify of the mysterious telephone caller remains a major problem.

Treatment of the whole story by various writers adds considerable color to it. As noted, the press at the time appeared afraid of the story. It did not become widely known, even among saucer enthusiasts, for some time. It is believed (relying entirely on memory, since the book is no longer available) that the first major account of it was given by Maj. Donald Kehoe in his first book, THE FLYING SAUCERS ARE REAL, published probably around 1950. If the same memory is correct, kehoe accepted the story as genuine and indicated Crisman and Dahl soon afterward were "transferred" from Tacoma for some probably sinster reason and no longer could be located. Arnold and Palmer, who published their account of the incident in 1952, clearly regard it as a hoax, and in prefatory material Palmer appears to indicate he thinks it was an intelligence job.

Harold T. Wilkins, a British saucer enthusiast, probably published his version in Britain at about the same time, but it did not appear in an American edition until 1954. Wilkins appears to accept the incident as genuine, but is gravely suspicious about the way it is handled.

In 1963 Dr. Donald H. Menzel published his well-known and painstaking book debunking the whole idea that saucers actually exist, and, apparently relying mostly of Ruppelt, also dates the Maury Island sighting at June 31, not June 21.

Menzel's account is extremely interesting, however, in the way he concentrates his scorn on Ray Palmer, the publisher of Fate who got Arnold to investigate the Maury Island affair. To build up his case against Falmer, he excoriates him for publishing, during World War II, the so-called Shaver Mysteries. These were accounts, purportedly written by a man named Shaver, dealing in detail with claims that mankind all along has been under surveillance by extra-terrestrial beings in alien spaceships. These were published years before flying saucers or spacecraft concepts had become part of the public consciousness. Menzel calls the Shaver Mystery series a clever combination of the works of Charles Fort and Ray Palmer's imagination, but he attacks Palmer as though his offense were far more -- and unforgivably -- serious.

Menzel appears equally intent upon discrediting Arnold, whose personal reliability no one else has attacked, and his fervor in recounting the Maury Island hoax in order to undermine the credibility of both Palmer and Arnold is a little difficult to overlook.

It suggests, as a matter of fact, that if the Maury Island story was a hoax, it was elaborately and expertly contrived by someone who had a very precise idea of just what had to be discredited. The intricacies of the Dahl-Crisman story (which have only been hinted at here) could scarcely have been developed and coordinated so quickly merely on the basis of the June 24 Arnold sighting. It is reasonable -- indeed, it is almost necessary -- to suppose that the complicated fabric of the Maury Island story could only have been woven by someone who was fully aware of the much broader issues at stake, such as those posed by the so-called Shaver Mystery series. It is therefore logical to postulate that the Shaver series may have been based on knowledge uncomfortably close to what was considered to be highly dangerous if it became generally known under circumstances of increased credibility such as that provided by the Arnold sighting.

To continue the postulate, if Menzel's attitude betrays a genuine concern over keeping whatever may be the facts about unidentified flying objects from the realm of credibility, then the Maury Island hoax may have been an intelligence operation originating in very high places. If so, Fred Lee Crisman played an important, although probably not the most important part, in it. Palmer is quoted as saying that when Crisman telephoned him trying to sell him the Maury Island story, he (Palmer) recognized the voice as that of a man who repeatedly had called him through the years he was publishing the **Winner** Shaver Mystery series, arguing and threatening him in an effort to get him to stop it.

If a high-level intelligence operation was involved, it may have set precedents that appear to have been followed faithfully in later operations — the introduction of strange, inexplicable and often conflicting details, the barrage of ridicule, intimidation and even terror against some of those trying to get at the facts, and the almost universal implication that any departure from accepted norms is the creation of kooks or charlatans. The question may be: whose charlatans ?

As a footnote to the above, there is a later incident in the same area, possibly totally unrelated but which should be checked out because of the propinquity factor.

On Jan. 3, 1966, Maj. Gen. Irving L. Branch, commander of the flight test center at Edwards AFB in California, was flying a T38 jet trainer solo from Edwards to Mechord AFB near Tacoma. At 3,000 feet (one account says 1,500 feet) his place vanished from the radar screens at about 10:22 a.m.

The next day his jacket was found floating in the Sound. Still later his body was recovered by scuba divers from the wreckage of his plane found in 60 feet of water off Point Jefferson. Stories in the Seattle Times for Jan. 4 and in the Seattle Post-Intelligencer for Jan, 5 and 6 said his plane clipped the tops off trees for half a mile before crashing into the Sound.


If the cause of the accident ever was explained publicly, it was not reported. The Air Force insisted Gen. Branch was flying alone (in the presumably two-seat trainer) but never described the purpose of his trip except to say it was to confer with officials at Boeing.

Before the wreckage had been located and Branch's body found, police on Jan. 4 investigated reports that a man wearing a wet, orange-colored flight suit walked barefoot into a Seattle waterfront bar, the Cove Restaurant at Pier 56, at about 6 p.m. on Jan. 3. He appeared confused, asking where he was and asking to borrow a dime framex to call an unidentified Air Force sergeant. "e was given the dime by two other unidentified men, with whom he then left the restaurant-bar. The woman quoted as reporting this, Mrs. Judy Brown, a cocktail waitress who lived at 14805 Linden Ave. N., told Patrolman Chris Holevas about the incident, even though at that time she had not yet heard about Gen. Branch's crash. She said the two other customers left money on the sable when they left with the man in the flight suit and said they would be back, but did not return. She described the wet man as appearing in shock, holding his left side, and muttering "Roger and out" several times. Police said they had no further reports on any of this.

Due to the lack of any explanation of Gen. Branch's crash, which is disturbing because of his disappearance from radar at either 1,500 or 3,000 feet, it is reasonable to ask whether the incident of the three men was something more than a drunken hoax. If so, who was involved, and what was the purpose ? Gen. Branch was no ordinary airman. He had been in charge of special weapons development at Kirtland AFB in Mew Mexico (which suggests nuclear weapons) and apparently was an important figure likely to be surrounded by maximum security. Were the three men part of it ? Was this the beginning of a distraction operation that later was found unnecessary and abandoned ?

REPORT ON THE CBSERVATION BY MRS. ADELINA BOTTERI.

Information on this observation came to this investigator through Mr. Fred Drew, an American citizen living in Lima. Mr. Drew, an elderly gentleman, explained briefly what Mrs. Botteri had told him. This investigator later telephoned the witness and requested a meeting, which took place on October 27th, 1968. Professor Enrico Mattievich, of the Faculty of Sciences of the San Marcos University, participated in the meeting. Professor Mattievich, an APRO member, conducted his investigation for APRO-PERU.

The witness, Mrs. Adelina Pacheco de Botteri has been the Director of a State 2nd. grade school for 36 years. She is 70 years old. She cannot remember exactly when the observation took place but thinks it was between 1948 and 1950. She says that she had never heard of "flying saucers" or UFOs at the time, which at first made me think the observation took place before 1947. However, Professor Mattievich says that "flying saucers" were not known in Peru until about 1949 or so. The month was February or March and she lived in a house just 3 blocks from her present residence (and where Mr. Drew now lives). The weather was good. It was about 7.30 or 8 p.m. Mrs. Botteri's maid entered the house saying that the boy(Mrs Botteri's grandson) had left his tricicle in the garden again. Mrs. Botteri got angry and went out into the garden and bent down to pick it up. Suddenly, some light above her attracted her attention and she looked upwards. She saw an oval object, "vibrating" soundlessly, and she became completely paralized, probably with fear.

The outer edge of the object was very bright. It was similar, Mrs. Botteri said to the color of lightning. She had seen lightning twice before at close range. It had an electric-blue color. Inside the rim, the central part consisted of little circles, like a bee-hive; little red-orange sparks were discharged from these circles. The object appeared to be very large, about 40 centimeters at arm's length. The witness couldnot say how large it really was. She is not able to give any altitude. She thinks the object was about between 70 and 80 degrees elevation. Later, she altered this to Maybe 50 degrees. She was not really sure any more so we did not press her on this point.

After some moments, the object moved towards the north, very quickly and in the following flight pattern:

When it stopped, it returned to its original position, in the same manner. Then it moved back north again and stopped again. It then turned around

and a "tail" appeared. This "tail" commenced at about the middle of the object and and had a strange, animal like appearance. Mrs. Botteri described it as a fishe's tail when it is swiming in the water. The "tail" was bulky, but not as thick as the object itself. A good comparison is a squid and its tentacles. The object then inclined upwards at an angle of about 45 degrees and its "tail" straightended out stiff. In a second the object was gone, leaving behind a few sparks which quickly disappeared. Mrs. Botteri went into the house and told everyone about her observation. For twenty years friends and relatives have listened to her story and have all laughed at her. She was very frightened during the observation and says that whenever she stmats thinking about it or retells the story whe gets exdited again. She has never seen another UFO although she has looked for them for many years.

We told Mrs. Botteri of a recent theory which connected biological life in the upper atmosphere with some UFOs. She immediately said that, if such life existed, that is what she had seen (before she believed that the object was extraterrestial). She said that the object itself seemed mechanical and metalic but the tail had an organic appearance - not mechanical. She has no explanation for this.
