The sighting lacks important details—even as to whether the discs appeared solid or not.

On June 24, 1954, between 10 and 10:30 P.M. (EDT), Don fund and I were saucer-watching on the hill when we heard the rumble of jets. We looked up and high in the south, flying from east to west, were four short green streaks in a square formation. The craft sounded so much like jet planes that we dismissed the streaks as jet exhausts. Jimmy Barrick, 12, and his parents also saw three green streaks in a triangle lower in the sky at about 10:30 P.M. The objects were flying at a good clip.

Now the question is: do jets have green exhausts?

Four nights later, on June 28, Barrick, Lund, and I held a four-hour saucer-watch. I invited Jimmy to bring his new 23/5-inch refractor to the hill. Lund and I were equipped with our telescopes. Almost as soon as we set up the instruments, at 9:52 P.M., Barrick and two visitors, Jim Herman and Roy Barbers, saw a faint, light-colored object move northward between Altair and Lamma Aquilae, some 20 above the last horizon. Its path was the often characteristic short, wavy, undulating type.

at 11:45 P.M. Lund called our attention to a light moving westward through Cassiopeia. In the 6x finders we saw it as two yellowish lights, one above the other. Then Don saw a small object shoot away from the lights, leaving a trail which melted away. This was seen in his finder . Turning to his 80x exercise, he first saw the two lights, then suddenly one vanished. We continued to follow the UFO past the north point. In my binoculars I noticed another object crising along below the yellow light. When I put down the binox, Lund relayed to me that the yellow one had very abruptly turned around and was now heading east. It finally disappeared in the northeast. High-flying jets may have been involved here. It is difficult to separate jet navigation lights from the "mystery lights" the same goes for five "lights" that flyw overhead at 12:40 A.M. They circled, criss-crossed, and raced each other. They very easily could have been jets on maneuvers. But it also could have been a chase - jeto and UFO's.

Lago related that he and his father and brother were at home talking about 10:15 when their attention was drawn to an object in the sky, appearing round in shape and radiating a white light.

The object, he said, appeared at times to be moving at a high speed, then to be standing still.



Navarre (pop. 1,760) is located 25 miles southwest of Alliance. That same evening (Sept. 22) firmmy Barrick was observing near his home on Shunk Ave. when he saw a cluster of moving lights. Barrick's written description: "It looked like a mass of lights. There was no shape to it. I came from the SE to NE. I saw it about 10:00 Wed. P.M. I lost it in a street light." His "map" follows (an exact reproduction):



On Lept. 23 Barrick was riding his bike downtown when he saw two large flying tubes. His written description: "The object looked like two cigars, one on top of the other. It on they came from the northeast and headed northwest. They were long and silver. I saw them at about 3:50 P.M. It just disappeared right before my eyes. I saw it for about 5 seconds. It had no wings at all. It looked very weird! His drawing—



Again, on Sept. 27 Barrick was observing when, at 8:10 P.M., he said he saw a round, reddish object in the sky mear Vega. It circled through Cassiopeia and Ursa Major. To the naked eye the object was not well defined, but in a quick look through his telescope Barrick said it had a distinct outline with a hagy birder, or "ring". It was noiseless. Professor W. A. Rice, a steadfast disbeliever in flying saucers, told me he had been outside about this time and thought Jimmy had seen a jet. Indeed, Jim remarked about the abundance of jet aircraft shortly after his sighting. Barrick is an excitable young-liter, but I don't believe he is overimaginative in his observations.

apr. 14, 1954 — I drove to Cleveland to hear Maj. Keyhol speak at Hotel Carter at the dinner meeting of the Cleveland ariation Club. Keyhoe arrived in Cleveland early this

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week and has appeared on the local TV and radio. Over 300 members and guests had bought tickets, and only 100 of the public could be admitted to the talk. I kindly allowed to buy the first ticket (I had driven 55 miles to hear the Speaker). Keyhoe's talk lasted an hour and a half. He reviewed the important events of the past ten years. There was a 20-minute question-answer period after the talk. This was followed by a book-autographing session. I examined a blueprint of adarnoki's Venusian ship, which Keyhoe believes is a fake.

Apr. 25, 1954 — The <u>Cleveland PD</u> previewed Ralph C. Mayher's article 'I Proved Flying Saucers are Real "in <u>Pic</u>, June issue. You remember when he, as a marine, photographed a UFO at Miami Beach on July 29, 1952. Mayher claims the AF has his film and won't return it (that's understandable!).

May, 1954 - Fate's special saucer issue. This little mag is doing a wonderful job on covering the saucers!

May, 1954 - Irue's article by Capt. Edward J. Ruppelt, "What Our air Force Found Out about Flying Saucers"

June 2, 1954— "UT SOPHOMORE REPORTS SEEING FLYING OBJECT.
Ed Rawlings, 20-year-old University of Jennessee sophomore
from Oak Ridge, reported last might (June 2) he saw what he
thought was a flying saucer over West Knoxville. "I was walking west on Rose avenue and it was northwest from me; Rawlings
said. He described the object as a "long disc sort of thing — kinda
oval shape and a little smaller than the moon appears to us
with the naked eye. It came to a point in the back. It was
traveling very fast but didn't make any sound! Rawlings said
he noticed the object at 9:22 P.M. Rawlings lives in Knoxville at
the Sigma Nu Fraternity House, 900 South 17th Street." (from

- June 23, 1954 "'SAUCER' BUZZES PILOT FOR O.N.G." (Harry Roe, gr., Ohio National Guard F-51 pilot, was followed by 'a round white light" that maneuvered just behind him.) The <u>Cleveland Plain Dealer</u> article is rather long. If you don't have the information on this sighting, I'll be glad to copy the clipping in another letter.
- June 23, 24, 25, 1954 "7 AT ELYRIA SEE FLYING SAUCERS." Qui defense observers here are reporting seeing unidentified flying objects, usually resembling flying saucers. This latest sighting was reported by seven observers, the first of whom was Herbert Young, who early Wednesday morning saw a strange pink object in the northeastern sky, he reported. On the next night, observer Horace Woodruff declared he, saw a bell or lampshade type object which emitted a green ray on one side and a red ray on the other. It was on Thursday morning last that James Wansley sighted two objects in the northeast which flashed red and green, he said. Others who saw strange objects were see Skelly, Norma Wisser, Bernadine Kolasky, and William Morgan, who reported sighting unusual lights on Thursday and Friday mornings." (from Cleveland Plain Dealer, June 28, 1954)
- July, 1954 Hung Saucers on the attack by Harold T. Wilkins.

 I read the book and didn't think too much of it. The book is loaded with fantastic theories and ideas. He blames forest fires, plane crashes, explosions, mysterious disappearances, and a host of Fortean phenomena on the saucers. He claims some types of saucers are "very definitely hostile", have terrestrial apies, and weapons in the form of death rays or heat rays.

 Wilkins continually "quotes" sensational sightings and hearsay widence from anonymous "friends". He seems to record this evidence as the absolute truth.
- July 22, 1954 This evening a strange crloful object in the sky over Alliance caused much excitement among residents, thinking it might have been a "flying saucer" (no such luck!). As WFAH news announcer till steffy put it: "residents dusted their telescope lenses, football fans dug out their field glasses, and the unequipped skipped to the telephone and dialed the local radio station". At 9:00 P.M. I was notified by phone that there was a strange object high in the eastern sky. I hurried out and sure enough high in the sky was a tiny glowing ball.

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Binoculars showed it to be a weather balloon. I followed it for a while in the telescope. The enlarged view showed a translucent balloon with instruments suspended below it. As the sun got lower and lower, the balloon took on beautiful hues—yellowish to reddish to purple—like high clouds at sunset. The object was still visible in the telescope at 10 P.M. as a colorless dark ball.

July 28, 1954—"O.N.U. ENDS STUDY OF FLYING SAUCERS." (Cleveland Plain Dealer, July 29) "FIND LITTLE EVIDENCE OF FLYING SAUCERS. Ada, Ohio—Project A, a study of "the phenomenon of the flying saucer" has been brought to a close by Ohio Northern University. And it was the conclusion of investigation that little concrete widence was uncovered in two wass of research. Dr. Warren Hickman, dean of the university who headed the project from its start, said "we needed basic sightings and these we didn't receive". The first year of the study the university received reports of 54 sightings but such reports dwindled to 18 in the final year. The study group said the information received indicated that a sightle fraction of the total sightings were of material objects but not standard aircraft, lack of sufficient sightings from the general public made a scientific choscheck of the data impossible, researches said. Dr. Hickman soid widespread interest in the "phenomena" through the United States was observed through the project with many of the observers advancing their own themis. In the course of the study, the university received hundreds of letters seeking information, but offering none, Dr. Hickman said. (from the Alliance Review, July 29, 1954)

Aug. 2, 1954 — <u>Time</u> carried an article about producer Paul Coates and his TV show <u>Confidential File</u>. To create realism on the show, Coates brings in real characters off the street and "exhibits" them on the air. Coates has hired a lie-detector expert, who weeds out phonies trying to get on the show, sometimes uses the detector on the program itself. Once he

"used the detector on a so-called jet-propulsion expert who claimed that he had flown in a flying saucer from White Sands, n.m., to New York in half an hour. He failed the test on the air and got furious in front of the cameras."

Aug., 1954 — Weird Science-Fantasy, one of the best science-fiction comic magazines, put out a special issue "Flying Saucer Report". All fiction laid aside. About 20 famous case illustrated.

Aug. 10, 1954 - In place of the usual political cartoon, Cargill drew this one in today so the alliance Review: -

Sept. 27, 1954 - another landing report. This time 6'7" men are picking flowers near their space ship. almaseda, Portugal. (you undoubtedly have the article.)

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Oct. 3, 1954 — The Cleveland PD contained an excellent editorial this morning called "All We ask are the Facts, Uncle Sam!"

—an appeal to the avernment to release what it knows about flying soucers. The article states: "It has been charged by some that the United States government is withholding what information it possesses in convection with 'flying saucers', the inference being that release of such information would frighten the citizens to death.... if such information is in existence, we agree with the Detroit Flying Saucer Club that the lid of secrecy should be lifted, and that everyme should be permitted to know what is going on But it is difficult to explain away the sightings on radarscopes; it is difficult to believe that experienced pilots, used to most of the strange manifestations in the heavens, could be wholly wrong in what they say they have seen. Not one earthling has been harmed by the saucermen—if there are saucermen. They might have two heads and three arms and one eye right in the middle of their foreheads. But from all the stries told of them, they act like nice people, and we'd like to meet 'em if they're real. Come on, Uncle Sam, tell us what you know?"

The editorial mentioned Desmond Leslie's talk before the Detrint Flying Laucer Club on his investigations. He believes the U.S. is withholding information. The article also told of a saucer landing mear Lyon, France and of a sighting near Chambery, France (Reuters dispatch, Lept. 29).

Oct. 7, 1954 - "A Harvard astronomer [I wonder who!] assures us that the flying saucese scare is nearly 3,000 years old, so we should quit worrying. If the Martians have observed us that long they probably know enough by now not to make a landing." (from Wes Lawrence's column "The Breakfast Commentator" in the Cleveland PD, Oct. 7)

Oct. 10, 1954 — Published in the editorial letter column of the Cleveland PD, Oct. 10, was a letter by a 0. W. Johnson of Heneva, Ohio, in reply to last Sunday's editorial "All We ask are the Facto, Uncle Sam!" Johnson believes the government should keep the lid on saucers! He thinks "it would be senseless to the government to "spread news" just for the satisfacish of "a set of foolish, thrill-crased minds" He speculates on the possibility that the saucers might be revolutionary test craft of the U.S. or some other cointry. Mr. Johnson, of course, hasn't really looked into the situation, and he doesn't realize how terribly foolish his own statements are. He doesn't see the mess the AF, and the government have gotten into — and the problem of hysteria and panic in great proportions if they don't begin opening up to the public pretty soon.

Oct. 11, 1954 — In June, I see where John Steinbeck is planning to write a play about flying saucers, because saucers "symbolize ... the disquiet of the world today"

Oct. 11, 1954 — "SAUCERS FLYING, CINCINNATIANS SAY. Cincinnati, Oct. 11 — Cincinnatians say they are seeing 'flying soucers' again. The fifth report in a week of seeing objects — "orange-red colored, silent, disc shaped and 60 feet in diameter" — allout 300 feet in the air was made today by two Cincinnatians to Leonard H. Itrinfield, a director of civilian research. The reports were made by Keith Wildeson, a local radio announcer, and John H. Lundstrom, a neighbor of Stringfield. All of the reports have been that the objects were traveling in groups of three." (from Cleveland PD, Oct. 12)





As Jim turned into the drive, which was on an upgrade, we were shocked by what we saw. In the air, to our left about 100 feet from us, were two yellow glowing, oval shaped objects. They were quite close together in a straight line. They were rotating in a circle both in the same direction. Each had a shaft of light coming from the underside and touching the ground. They were hovering above a field next to the drive we were in. They were about 50 feet from the ground and were approximately 6-10 feet long each. I do not remember or could not tell their height. On our might was a large house completely dark. Jim started to get out of the car but I was scared and asked him to stay and take me home and then return if he wanted to. He agreed. We quickly turned around and headed north in the direction of my home. About a mile down the road, Jim slammed on the brakes and directly opposite us, over a field, were the same two objects. By this time I was begging to go home, which we did. Jim stayed long enough for us to tell my sister and her boyfriend a-



Neighbors who doubted the Bassett's tale soon changed their minds when they too witnessed unidentified fiving objects "class-ing each other in even circles around the sky."

Credit for the original sighting goes to George a 14-year-old stu-dent at East Hartford High School, who discovered the ob-

When he thought he spotted one he summoned his mother who interpreted the disk-like objects as something other these falling stars.

Each subsequent evening siter George's aighting, the Bassetts spotied the UFO's. The only explanation affered so far came from officials of Pratt and Whitney, who advanced the theory that jets might have been sperating over the Bassetts' residence.

But, this failed to check out when it was determined that the jets were not in the East Hart-

Mrs. Bassett told The Herald that the "saucers" are white and soundless. She says they do not change colors but claimed that at one time two saucers chased each other in a bizarre display over their house and then she watched one of them disappear.

Dear Mrs. Lorenzen:

I have been meaning to write to you for some time concerning an incident that took place near Oscoda back in 1954.

We were remodeling our home, six miles north of town and two miles from a large Air Force base named Wurtsmith, and on the night of Feb. 28 a visitor to our home and myself witnessed a strange flying object passing low and about a thousand feet to the south of where we stood. This incident has a special significence for me and I am sure, anyone interested in U.F.O. research, and especially for me personaly because of a very recent happening in the same area.

highway. It was spreading slowly over the ground moving to the
west and preceding an object we were to witness a moment later.
As the glow spread slowly over the highway we were startled to
see an egg shaped object, brighter, much brighter, than the
glow cast from beneath it, drift slowly along just above
the tree tops. Its bottom was flat and its color was the same
intensity throughout our viewing time and changed cally in
volumn do to the objects side to side tipping motion. More of
its top would be showing then more of its bottom, etc.

It made no sound and for its size was moving impossiably slow. Sixty feet long, sixty feet wide and fifteen feet perpindicular through its center would approximately describe its size with a reasonable amount of error. But there was little room for error because of its nearness to where we stood in awe and due to the crisp cold clear stillness of the night. We knew then as now, with a 13 year lapse of time that we had seen something that defied any logical discreption.

I rushed in and immideatly called an off duty civilian employee assigned to a crash truck at the near by military base which is now a S. A. C. base. His home was down the road from us and to the east on the shores of Van Etten lake, and I asked him if he had heard anything go over his house or had saw anything unusual.

He informed me he had not, but that his television set had went out (both sound and picture) and his house lights had dimmed and flickered for a minutes or so time.

I told him what we had just seen and knowing that

I was well aquainted with knowing the various types of aircraft

from the near by base, having lived near it all my life, he
said he would call the control tower and check.

He called back shortly and told me that no aircraft from the base was up and no transient aircraft had been in or out since late afternoon. He also told me that I had a very good sighting of something the Air Force was very touchy about and that phakkak pilots were even being racked over the coals for talking of such things. He was of the opinion that I best not mention the happening in less a lot of people reported a similiar sighting. And I never mentioned it except to the immideate family. Back then there were several reasons for this, as you are most likely aware. Number one is that immideatly you would be called our thought of as some kind of nut.

The second reason was due to my own individual nature. Meaning that kakk for me to believe then that this strange craft was not of a man made nature was out of the cuestion. Also, then, and for years afterword my own explanation to my questioning and baffled mind, was that this flying thing was a secret weapon in testing of ours and I felt honored at having had a brief glimpse of it when so many were scoffing

at the existence of such things. For years I felt sort of a pride in being in on such an important secret and applauded every time the Government came up with their wild descriptions concerning U.F.O.'s to quiet down other people that had similiar experinces of seeing Flying Saucers.

And the years went by. To many, to be rather frank.

My beleif in what I had saw that wintery evening, just could

not stand up all of this time. Such an impossiable aircraft

and the Government kept repeatedly denieing that such a

thing existed; never released it or placed it on the

operational flight line.

my viewpoint of what that flying object was that I saw in I954. This first was your book: The Great Flying Saucer Hoax, and the second was the recent money grant by our Government to this guy Condon to solve the mystery behind and concerning the Flying Saucer. They just would not do this if this flying thing was ours. Also this fantastic thing I witnessed I3 years ago was so unbeleivable then, to what sophistication would it have risen to now if it were a secret weapon in the testing.

For the person that has yet not witnessed such an object, and millions have not, there is indeed little room for undue emmotion or concern, but for those people such as myself that know they are real; as real as existence itself, then the situation becomes very alarming.

The area around Oscoda has had more than its share of Saucer sightings through the years and it is suprising and puzziling to me that not once has some of these very fantastic sightings had national press releases. The nearest to this was a write up in the local press about a year and a half ago of a Saucer viewed by over twenty eye witnesses cavorting over a town named Tawas located on the shores of Lake Huron, I5 miles below us.

I can personally attest to several well confirmed sightings besides my own that never became public knowledge at all. Seven brick masons constructing our local theater halted their labors to watch 5 Flying Saucers, about a mile up, following Lake Hurons shore line, traveling twice the speed of a jet and moving in a jerky, knamath unsmooth motion. Although years have passed by, in talking to one of these masons recently and assuming the joking attitude concerning this sighting that I was trying not to let him know I was really serious and questioning him, he repeated it convincingly and as it happened. Adding that if I didn't beleive him, just ask them. Them, meaning the other masons, two which still live in and around Oscoda.

The next time was in the fall of 1954. I was walking my deg near my home in Ferguson, Mo. The weather had been bad all day with low pleuds and visibility. The dog was on a leash and we were walking but the street approaching a well lighted parking lot of a shopping center. The dog had been smelling the ground when it stopped, listened, then looked up. I looked up and there were seven silver objects flying along just under the cloud base of about 600 feet above ground. The were moving south to north in a ragged formation. I was called by aschool friend to come quickly to see something in the sky. When I got to the window of the class room, I kwx saw several girls in the room and outside in the grounds, looking up. When I looked up, I saw what looked like a cigar-shapped object. It was alluminium coloured and reflected the sun. I could see the clouds moving behind it while it remained stationary. It was at a 45 degree angle and at arms length was approximately 2cm long and 1/2 cm wide.

I was told (although I myself did not see it having come a little later) that they had seen 5 or 6 small sound object that had come out from somewhere at the base of the object, and had departed in different directions. Several girls had seen this. There were also School teachers present at the sighting.

Below you will find a rough sketch of the school grounds and the sighting which is still very vivid in my mind. I remember when I saw it I had a distinct feeling of hapiness and my arms were covered in "goose flesh". I thought I had had a hallucination so I questioned several girls and their description was the same as mine. I don't beleive in "collective hallucination" especially when all the girls present had the same xight sighing, and the same descriptions.

At that age already (15 years) I had read a couple of books on UFOs and have kept up the research since then, A lot of the girls did not beleive in UFOs and were very sceptical on what they saw, but their descriptions concorded, but some of them have changed their ideas since then...

The object remained there for such a long time without moving, that we had to go back to class, and when we came back, the object was no longer there.

I was jeered by the sceptics but they admited that they did! not know what they had seen but they knew they had seen something!

On Tuesday, January 17th, 1954 at 12.25 p.m., an unusual aerial phenomenon was observed in the sky from the beach at Kwinana, Western Australia by six people. Mr. A. Dickerson, the first member of the party to observe this, remarked that a peculiar shaped cloud had formed in an otherwise clear blue sky and called it to the attention of the other members of the party. was in the form of an isosceles triangle of a heavy dense white vapour and being very sharply outlined. After approximately 15 seconds observation, it was noticed that a vapour trial was ascending from the apex of the triangle; this ascending vapour trial was Further observation disclosed a in a modified zig zag path. round silvery blue object at the head of this ascending vapour trial. Within approximately 30 seconds this object had disappeared. The colour of the object was a silvery blue that gave it the illusion of transparency.

The triangle shaped horizontal vapour trial broke up slowly drifting across underneath the ascending vapour trial which remained for several minutes after the lower vapours had disappeared.

One of the members of the party, Mr. A.M. Dryfhamer, a former pilot in the Dutch Air Force estimated the altitude of the phenomenon at approximately 25,000. If this estimation is correct, the size of the object leaving the trial was 100 to 200 feet in diameter, also based on this altitude estimation, the triangle vapour trial would have been approximately 1 mile wide at the base by approximately 1 mile long.





REPORT OF "FIXING SAUCER" SIGHTING.

TIME OF SIGHTING: 6:15, Sunday evening, February 14, 1954. FLACE: Near the home of Mr. Henry J. Hall, Bernardston Road, Greenfield, Mass. WEATHER CONDITIONS: Partly overcast.

DETAIL: About 6:45 p.m. on Sunday evening the local police received a cull from Mrs. Henry Hall. She said that her little girl, Mary Ann. 14, had been terribly frightened by an object which had "followed her" as she passed from their home to Mrs. Hall's mother's home about 100 feet to the north of them. She said that Mary Ann was "in hysterics" and the two other children, Pearl (12) and Edward (6) were very excited by what they had seen. She asked the police to come out and investigate. The police did so and talked with the children. On the following marning a member of the police force phoned me (Albert Baller) and akked me if I would care to look into the matter further, since he happened to know that I had made some general study of the "flying saucer" problem. I agreed to do so and met the Hall family on Monday evening at six oclock for an hour and a half. I asked their permission to tape-record our interview for reference, which permission they gave. Mrs. Hall said: "I sent Mary Ann over to mother's with some cake. It was 6:15. Edward went slong. Pearl stood on our back porch to watch them go. After a few minutes, Pearl came running in and said: 'Mother, an aeroplane is following Mary!" I said, 'Why, that's impossible! No plane could FOLLOW anybody! What do you mean! She said, 'But it IS' In a few more minutes my mother came in with the two other children. Mary Ann was in hysterics. She said that this saucer-like thing had flown right between the houngs (their house and Mrs. Hall's mother's) and had CHASED hor! Mrs. Hall talked with Edward who said that he, too, had seen it and that it had flown right over him. Mrs. Hall tried, with Mr. Hall's help, to break down the children's story and to convince them that they had really seen an airplane or a helicopter. But the children insisted that what they had seen as it had flows into the area lighted by the back yard flood light was a saucer-like thing with LOTS OF WINDOWS! Edward kept saying, 'It was ROUND, like the world." (Later, he explained to me that by this, he meant it was round, like the upper half of the globe he sees in his school-room.) Just as I got about 2/3 of the way there this thing came flying around the front of our house and came right at me between the houses. (See diagram.) I started to scream because it looked so strange and was coming right at me and it was slowing down. I ran to grandmother's house and couldn't get the door open, so I screamed so more and pounded on the door. I could see the thing slowly turn and come toward me. Then the door opened and I rushed int

EDWARD SAID: "I was walking behind Mary and when I saw it coming I started to run too. But I stumbled over some snow and fell down. I looked up and saw this thing. round like the world, go right over me and I put up my hands like I had guns and said, "BANG! BANG! BANG!" I wanted to scare it. It was a cool windless day, bright sunshine, no clouds. I was standing in a line of people awaiting the opening of a charity sale when I observed an object in the sky about one foot above the gable of the house. I was facing west. My first thought was that it was a star as I am accustomed to rising early and noting a "late star" now and then. Realizing that it was too late in the day for a star I settled for an airplane shining in the sunlight. When it seemed to remain stationary for long I began to watch it intently and after a while was able to note that it had an almost impresceptible movement which followed a straight line directly above the peak of the gable.

I finally got up enough courage to ask the woman next to me if she could see it. She had no trouble seeing it and although not too interested she stopped talking to her companion frequently to ask me if it was still in sight. We agreed several times that it occasionally assumed a sort of cigarlike shape. Her companion, an elderly woman, was neither interested nor able to see it. The first woman maxablaxts was unable to see what I could hardly swear so but sort of sensed and that was a cloudy ring of gray smoke a slight distance from the point of light which appeared to be a star. I might describe it as a broken wreath or a wispy gray broken circle, perfectly round but very vaguely defined. The cigar shape when it appeared always seemed to be tilted at the same angle, thusly:

As the starlike object continued to rise it seemed to increase its still very slow speed. This may have been due to my then being able to line it up better with overhanging twigs from the tree nearby. When the doors of the sale opened the line pushed forward and I was unable to continue looking upward but just at that moment I lost sight of it inthe treetop anyway.

I was inside of the shop barely ten minutes but when I again got outside there was nothing in sight altho I crossed the street and looked from various angles both in sunlight and shade.

At no time during my sight of the "star" did it change color or size in spite of the occasional cigar shape it assumed. About two thirds of the way up the sky it began to curve gently off course to the south. My impression was that it was extremely high up at all times.

I might add that I have watched the sky all of my life as I have spent many years living out of the city and I have seen many common phenomena but this is the first time I have seen anything that I could not explain.

I want you to know that I am not one of the people who are always seeing things because some one else has also I never had heard of anyone seeing one that shapped before. 

Reports still come in from in and near Greenfield, Mass. of saucer sightings. I will give you a brief account of the most recent.

On Friday Thursday, March 18 at about 2:30 p.m. with a very clear sky, a Mrs. Theles condraski of Log Plain Read, Greenfield, phoned, saying that a strange object was at the moment in the sky above them. Since she lives in North Greenfield some three miles away, we were not able to see what she was seeing, even though we immediately ran out to look in that direction. She described it to me in person yesterday as an object, like a small silver ball, apparently very high, which flew in a wide circle trailing a very peculiar tail. She was not sure whether the "tail" was a vaper trail or not, but if so, it was also a peculiar vaper trail, since it did not "feather" out at the far end, but stopped abruptly and the "end" moved right along too. In other words the "trail" looked more like a very long tail to a kite and hence a "part" of the object itself. It disappeared in a minute or so.

Another report comes from a Mr. Crepeau, a barber here en Main St. in Greenfield who reported that he and his assistant stood and watched two "saucers" fly over the center of Greenfield, stop and hever for a few moments, then dash eff at terrific speed. I have not as yet had a chance to interview these men personally, but will try to do so very soon and send more detailed report. Their sighting was about a week ago.

Also yesterday, I met a Mrs. Travis who lives on Bernardseon Road, North Greenfield. She told me that "about a year age, she thought", she was walking from her daughter's house to her own some 50 yrds. away, when she happened to look up (sky very clear) and saw "these two round things like silver pie pans up there in the sky". She said that she looked at them as they hovered there and thought, "those must be some of those things people are talking about". Then without further ade she went on into her house. (Can you beat it!) And because she was afraid that people might make fun of her, she never mentioned it until recently to anybody. It was her daughter who told me about it.





Subject seemed to be a very fine individual. In addition to working for American Oil Company, he is the Deputy Coordinator for the Southern District of Civil Defense. He is held in high esteem by Colonel Frank Milani, Chief of Civil Defense for Baltimore City who attended interrogation. Subject has, of course, heard of unidentified flying objects but had never read any books on the "Saucers." Subject's home is in poorer neighborhood, but is nicely furnished and in excellent taste. He appears to be a man of very moderate income. Subject's wife appeared to be very nice and equally as competent in judgment. The wife did not see the objects reported by subject because she had already retired and claimed she did not get to the window in time. (This seems to be an odd point in the report by subject as he suggests he watched objects for almost five minutes.)

APPRAISAL:

No identification of objects can be attempted from the description given by the Subject. It is reasonable to assume that subject definitely observed some unconventional objects in sky. The possibility of a hoax or a fraud does not deserve strong consideration. The only weak point in subjects report is the behavior of his wife who failed to get to the window in time" despite the fact that subject claimed objects were under observation for approximately five minutes.

Dear Mrs Lorenzen:

As usual, I enjoyed your July Bulletin, and the comments on the various sightings and saucer-seers. From all reports, the saucer sightings appear apt to keep you going for quite a while--and it as evident that you already have your hands full.

Not much has popped up in the Miami area lately, but enclosed is one clipping you may not have, Vand I think the following will interest you.

On page 5 of the July bulletin, you have listed a sighting of a aphere-like object with a Saturn-like ring around the bottom, and from your comment that this is a new type of sighting, I assume you have not heard of the two sightings, I'll describe below for you, which I have taken from my records.

SIGHTING BY MARINE JET PILOT

On Thursday, March 25, 1954, Captain Dan C. Holland U.S. Marine jet fighter pilot, 33 years old, 5196 E. fifth St., Hieleah, Fla, was flying a jet fighter in a formation with 2 other jets. In a phone conversation he described the experience as follows. "Our formation was flying at 20,000 ft., crossing the beach going Eastward at Fort Lauderdale (Fla). We had started a turn to the West thru North, when I saw what looked like a falling star dropping vertically from above us. It was broad daylight- 3:20 P.M. I Moved out of the way- thought the thing was going to hit us, and called to the others to look. They never did see it, though. It startled me by suddenly stopping 3 or 4 thousand feet above us. It looked like a gleaming white ball with a gold ring around the lower 1/3 of the ball, and it was about 2 times the size of our jets. Then the thing accelerated faster than anything I've seen before and disappeared to the East at an amazing speed in about 15 seconds. We were doing over 400 and it made us look slow. I always thought anyone who said he saw a flying saucer should have his head examined, but I'm damned convinced now that saucers exist:"



On Sunday, March 28, 1954, an unidentified flying object was seen over parts of Eastern Connecticut composing the towns of Danielson, Flainfield, Moosup, Jewett City, Norwich, New London and others. The object was viewed for an approximate hour between 5 % 6 p.m. by hundreds of people throughout the areas mentioned above. The object caused enough consternation to have the local paper besieged with telephone calls requesting information on the sighting. Police barracks were also alerted by some citizens.

The Harch 29th issue of the Borwich Bulletin had a short account of sighting, they listing the event as probably wither a balloon sighting or a sighting of Venus. The article also said other reports on object varied, as in direction object moved. The article made no effort to actually identify object.

The following is a resume of several eye witness reports as given to the author of this article:

Time of Sighting: 5:00 - 6:30 p.m. approximately. Date: Sunday, March 28, 1954. Weather: Exceptionally clear with no clouds visible. Shape of Object: Round - A few observors said object had depth roundness like a ball - Fost would not hazzard guess as to this fact, they saying only that object appeared round from bottom. Many observors said object was definitely eliptical in shape. Two observors said it appeared hollow in center. Movement: All but one or two observors claimed movement was in different directions - horizontally and vertically but movement was in general easterly direction. This did not coincide with ground wind at that time. All observors said object appeared lower at times. Then it disappeared it moved off straight up until it could no longer be seen. Color: At most times object was a bright metalic color. Observors felt that object was too bright to watch, and they felt the neces ity of shielding their eyes. All observors agreed that object seemed to change color at times, especially when moving. At this time, the top portion seemed to glow orange and red. Those observors watching through binoculars or scopes arreed that there seemed to be fire around object. Height: Height could only be approximated. All observors agreed object was far above regular transport planes' path, as some planes went over during sighting time. All observors agreed object was higher than jets usually fly when jets are mere dots in the sky. At this height, object appeared through the naked eye about the size of an orange. Through 7% power binoculars, object appeared to be approximately 2 feet in diameter. Speed: Reports of speed differed. Some observors said object was moving slowly at all times; others said object moved very swiftly at times, so much so that it was impossible to keep object in sight through binoculars. Sound: Object was soundless at all times. One observor claimed he saw some sort Peculiarities: tail assembly at bottom of object, while locking at object through binoculars. Some observors claimed object had spinning







Dear Mrs. Lorenzen,

After reading the article about you in the 'Interesting People' section of the April American magazine, my interest in your organization was a aroused.

For years I've been deeply interested in astronomy, and have read many books and listened to lectures on the subject, but recently my attentions were turned to 'Flying Sausers.' No doubt you've read George Adamski's book, 'The Flying Saucers are Real.' This was the first material I'd read, outside of newspaper accounts of the 'saucers.' Since then I can't help being curious about these 'scout ships' as Mr. Adamski prefers to call the saucers.

Needless to say, I too have been scanning the sky every opportunity. However, being the mother of five small children limits my time to some extent. I have also been reading as many books as possible relating to natural phenomonae which may occur in the sky. One such book is Ninninger's book on meteorites, which to me explains away some of the saucer reports. He wrote of many wierd aspects of meteorites and meteors, especially the after glow which in some cases lasts several hours. In case I ever saw a saucer, I wanted to be certain of what it was.

My curiosity did bear fruit. However, I'm still not sure of what I saw. Though I'm not positive of the date, I believe it was May 1st, 1954 The time was between 1:50 and 2:60 p.m. when I first glimpsed at something very unusual. One of my little boys and I had been to the grocery store, and were in the car. As I started the motor I glanced out the windshield at the sky, for my eye was attracted to the white spectre of a thin, round moon. The sky was clear and blue except for one or two tiny white clouds, and of course the daytime moon. My car was facing due east. Slightly to the right, and down about an 'inch' from the moon I saw what I thought at first were two seagulis covorting through the sky. I paused to admire them, but something didn't look quite right about them. I then decided they were jet planes, but realized at once that they couldn't be. We have a lot of jet planes around Fortaand, and I've watched hundreds of them. I know that when the planes fly so high as to appear not much larger than a silver speck, they leave vapor trails. Also, in all my observations of jet planes in action I'd never seen any that could go at such terriffic speeds as these. The 'things' were definately not birds or planes. They were making passes at each other coming very close, narrowly missing, then zooming upward again. They circled one another many times, and their 'wings' were continually outstreched. No bird could possibly be in a soaring position that long even on a windy day, which this certainly was not. I then compared the distant trees, hills and buildings which were directly under them, and of course realized that the objects were far too high to be

birds. They stayed in on very small section of the sky, (about 15 inches square) and we watched them about 12 minutes. Approximately 10 minutes later, around 2:15 p.m., we were home. I imediatly got the binocculars and tried to locate the objects from my back yard which faces east, but they were gone. The airport is about two miles north of our home, and I watched a jet plane ascending into the blue. Where did it go? It went directly to the exact small section of sky in which I'd noticed the two 'things.' It flew around for some time as though searching for something. How fortunate this was for me. as it gave me an excellent comparison soon after the objects had disappeared. The jet plane was so much slower than the things I'd watched, it looked sluggish, and seemed to merely crawl, also the jet was black at that distance. The objects had been very small from my distance, but appeared elliptical in shape, and either bright white or silvery in color. They resembled beautiful white birds, and were fantastically graceful even at the speed which they attained. In a matter of minutes the sky was suddenly full of planes, jets and cubs alike. Previously, there hadn't been a plane in the sky. All of the planes flew around that same patch of sky. I looked for a notice in the newspaper the next day, but could find nothing.

My next experience which occured about two weeks ago, was well written in our local newspapers. Every night before retiring, I take one last scan of the sky. I looked out my kitchen window, which faces south, and saw, fairly low in the southeastern part of the sky, a bright light. It looked exactly like a planet, only it was a bit too large, even for Venus at her brightest, and there isn't supposed to be a planet in that location. It was too low to have been Mars. It didn't descend as a flare might do, it hung as though suspended in that one spot. It didn't move, so it couldn't have been a light on a plane. My husband, who is somewhat contemptuous of 'things' in the sky suggested that it was a new plane warning light, but admitted that it would have to be on a pretty tall pole to appear as high as it was. I watched it a half hour and went to bed reluctantly, as I was hoping that something would happen to the light. Next day the newsmen on the radio and papers were full of stories about a strange unexplainable light that appeared in the southeast. You've probably heard some of the reports yourself. My vision was partly obscured by a large tree, but I don't believe it was the afterglow of a meteor because it was a small ball of light, not spread out as in the case of meteor light.

If possible, I would appreciate more information about your club. Can anyone join, and if so, what are the dues? I'm very much enthused.





R.F. "About 1954 in June, I sighted one of these flying objects. I was out in the middle of the yard pumping water and I just happened to stop and I could hear this thing coming, and it sounded just like one of these Hondas that you hear nowadays. I kept looking to see what was coming because we actually didn't have a road coming from the north at that time. And all of a sudden this object came over right between the house and the shed there; about 15 - 20 feet high, 50 - 60 feet around I'd say; it looked to be something transparent, you know, metal of some type, or plastic, with two men sitting in it with their helmets and goggles on. There was kind of a stick shift in the middle like today's cars which you see. As for a propeller, I never actually noticed that, but it sure sucked the groundwhen she went over, just like a big whirlwind or big vacuum. Actually made the hair stand up on the back of my neck -- I couldn't believe it. I guess that's about it. I would think it was going about 80 miles an hour - 90 - it wasn't that terrific a speed at all. But as I say there was no variation in motor rhythm; it sounded just like a Honda, you know, going down the road, not too loud. Just like a big whirlwind, kind of an uplift to it. It wasn't a downdraft, it just seemed to be, you know, a suction upward, or a creation of air swirling; something that if you didn't see it you wouldn't believe it."

D.C. "Was the air (Dust) rotating in a specific direction?" R.F. "This I can't really recall because at that time, you know, you just don't maybe take everything into consideration. That was the farthest thing from my mind when it passed over. The yard had always been prairie-xxxx like, still the same; of course the power is in the middle of the yard now, which you know is 16 years later. But it flew from north to south, you know, you couldn't see it in no time at all; you couldn't see it at all but the sound was there, of the motor." D.C. "You mentioned 15 feet high - was that the altitude or the

thickness of the object?"

R.F. "No, that would be the height of the machine, 15 or 20, you know, somewhere in that neighborhood. The thickness of the object, it just looked like the lid of the old washing machine type, with this windshield on the front/something like a speedboat that you see in pictures, only in-a-one-piece winshield. The two object, or men I presume, you could see their helmets and goggles quite distinctive, but it looked to be just like a luminous material, you know, I couldn't say what kind of material it might be."

D.C. "Was there any color to their uh --"

R.F. "No clear. Actually their goggles were a darker color, and the helmet, but as far as the rest, it was just like transparent." D.C. " Are you talking about their clothing?"

R.F. "Well, I would say their clothing, there was no color to it, or there was no color to it looking into the machine from the ground, either their luminous uniforms or clothing. There's nothing there to actually, you know, say what color, size, or anything else, but this was a long time back; that's about all I can say. But when you've seen one -- this was about 10:00 o'clock in the morning -- you don't forget you've seen one. It was a fairly clear day, it was very calm, something like today. The air was very clear, there was no mistaking the motor

But it does have a resemblance to a speedboat, only the speedboat are tipped back more; this one was straight up and down, looking at it from the ground up.

D.C. "Did you at any time see it from the side?"

R.F. "I can't say I did because it was actually coming over me before I realized it. I could hear it for a few seconds before, and I was looking to see where the heck it was coming from, what it was. The stick in the centre was standing straight up and down, more or less, with a man on each side of it, or object or whatever -- it didn't have to be a man.

D.C. "Was anything attached to the stick?"

R.F. Not that I could see, but looking up, everything is more or less that transparent look, whether it's made that you can't see through it, I don't know. Or you know a certain type of metal or plastic that's illuminous or transparent or something -- I don't know."

D.C. "When you first heard it did you look around?"

R.F. "Well I looked all over because there's only this one road into Harptree there. I looked up and down that and, of course there was nothing coming, but since the Honda came out, you know, I often think of that -- a kid driving with one of them -- it's just that type of motor, as it comes down the road."

D.C. "Did you see it before it was directly over your head?"
R.F. Well it was more or less, I'd say, 50 feet, 60 or 100, to the
north in front of me, before I caught on to what the heck it actually

was -- something passing over.

D.C. "So you did see it in front of you."

R.F. "That's right, but not knowing what what was coming, you know, I guess I was just more or less dumbfounded. It's pretty hard to believe that, what I found; I've never seen one, or anything like it since, or before, you know. I don't even read up on the thing. I read whatever is in the paper on it, but it has to be an oddity. I know they existed, whatever it was."

D.C. "Were there any fins on the object?"

R.F. "Not that I could see, no."

D.C. "What purpose do you think the stick served?"

R.F. "Well, this is something I couldn't tell you, whether it was radar or what it could be. Whether it was for up or down, I couldn't tell you. For all I could see into the thing, it might have had a lot to do with it. But, as far as speed, it didn't have that great amount. You think if it was a helicopter, or anything like that, they'd have a tendency to raise up in your yard, at least."

D.C. "Did you watch it until it disappeared?"

R.F. "Yes, as far as I could see it, which wasn't very far, but the noise was a half mile or more. As far as I could see it the motor never changed revs, you know, it was no variation, just a drone."

D.C. "Harptree is about half a mile north of here, how many ele-

R.F. "Three."

D.C. "Where are they located relative to your farm?"

R.F. "Well, they're a little to the west of my farm, of where the actual --- well, like I say, I wouldn't even see it coming from the other side of Harptree, but I could hear it, no doubt. But, they're, oh I guess they'd be 100 feet to the west of my house, the first one (from there) west. The only actual obstruction from here to Harptree is the telephone line -- it runs east and west -- and telegraph line on the railroad."

D.C. "Were there any poles along the roadway?"
R.F. "Not at that time; there is nown we have the power."

D.C. "What would be your assumed route of the object?" R.F. "Well, I would say it passed over the lake, probably, north of us, I wouldn't know." D.C. "What side of the elevators would it pass by?" R.F. "The east side." D.C. "You said that the object was transparent -- could you see the sky through it?" R.F. "Well no, I don't suppose I could, but on the other hand I don't think I was looking for it either. D.C. "Do you think that it was under control?" R.F. "Well, I sure it would be under control. Why wouldn't it crash have to into the house or the shed? Why didn't it follow the road allowance it was a hundred yards to the east of it; it could have went straight down the road allowance, just as easy, wouldn't you think?" D.C. "It could have been following the road allowance, I suppose?" R.F. "Yes, well --" D.C. "Being to one side of it." R.F. "Like I say, a hundred yards off the road allowance; why it wouldn't pick that for a route, I don't know. It's got to be controlled coming through a yard, that's for sure. About all it's done for me, was give me kind of a hair-raising experience. But I never said anything about it because I figured, well, you know what people think, they'd figure I was just another kook, and why bother? R.F. "Well, I still think any way you want to look at it, it's human beings; they're not from outer space as far as I'm concerned; there's no such thing as outer space men controlling these objects. I figure this is a well-protected experiment. I wouldn't say in Canada; I wouldn't even say in the United States, but it could be in Mexico. As far as small people manning these things, I would say there's lots of small people in Australia and some countries that could be trained to man these ships, the same as what people are thinking they're from outer space. In no way will I connect them with outer space men."

D.C. "Would it be this dimension which would be 60 feet?"
R.F. "No, it would have to be in circumference I suppose."

D.C. "I thought you had meant 60 feet in diameter."

D.C. "In width?"

R.F. "Yes, I would think so, (following the thing), maybe not that big, it's pretty hard to tell. If it had been yesterday I could probably vision it more clearly, but it was definitely round, with a slight dish in the bottom, you know.

D.C. "was that windshield flat or curved on front?" R.F. "It was curved, not a great curve, it din't stick straight out across the thing, it followed the body in a more or less straight up and down fashion. The amazing d--- thing about it was -- these goggles you know, and helmet; they're very distinct. D.C. "Regarding the stick:" R.F. "Straight up like that with a cross here." D.C. "Would that be a handle?" R.F. "Just something like the old -- them little old trikes, you know, that you see there with a stick handle there." D.C. "A scooter?" R.F. "Yes, something that fashion." D.C. "If those figures were like human beings, did they have any legs or arms?" R.F. "That I couldn't see. But, you know, it's hard to be exact. If a man would be suspecting something, I suppose he'd take a darn good lookif he's going to be that close. D.C. "How much of a 'basin' did the bottom have?" R.F. "Well, you know, actually, whether you could make a fair judgement of that, but, there is some dish there all right, not too it was sloped up, but no great basin to the bottom." D.C. "Could you see the transparent front as it flew away from you?" R.F. "That's right, more so. This is the part you could see more distinctive as it moved on." D.C. "Where was it then, on the top or the bottom?" R.F. "It would be just like you were driving a boat, I suppose, straight ahead, going straight south. It didn't circle or anything like that, that I could see, unless the bottom circled. I couldn't tell you. But something would have to create that vacuum there." D.C. "What was the shape that you saw as it went away from you?" R.F. "Well, as it went away, it was just more like the outline of the object. You could still see this windshield in the front end and the outline of the object. To say anything real distinctive in size or colour, it wasn't that type of object. Mind wou, I'm not saying it couldn't be more distinct. Still to me it was illuminous (indistinctive? or something that's pretty well camouflaged." D.C. "Was it feflecting light?" R.F. "No, no glare that I could see or remember. Mind you, from the north it wouldn't reflect I suppose as it went south. Maybe if I'd x taken more notice it would have." D.C. "Where was the sun at that time?" R.F. "Oh, it'd be -- well, here when it's noon on the old Mountain Standard time, it's directly north and south; it'd be two-thirds in D.C. "Would the sun be south of your position?" R.F. "South-east." D.C. "Let's assume that it's a car that you see. As it goes over top of you, you see the bottom, and as it goes into the distance, you see the back of it." R.F. "Well, actually, there's no back to it. There's just the base with this slight basin to it, and the windshield.. There's no back to the object." D.C. "Was it the same shape in every view, then?" R.F. "It was round, there was no back. Just like I say, it had a windshield on it, and that's about the extent of the shape of it. Naturally, if you have a car above you, the back end is going to be the last thing you see. In this case, the windshield is the last thing you see; it's the most protruding or outstanding thing about it. R.F. "If you look into a wash-basin as it flies away, (if it were to fly away), all you're going to see is the bottom and the top rim; there's nothing else to see. There's no back to it; there can't be on an object that is round and not very deep.

D.C. "I still can't figure out how you were able to discern the

helmet and goggles there."

R.F. "Probably, that's what more or less upened my eyes, because, it's definitely no mistaking two objects sitting there. And that's the most distinctive part of these two objects that I noticed, was their helmets and their goggles. Just a gol-darn rarity, I suppose, more than anything.

D.C. "Would these figures have been seated or standing?"

R.F. "Oh no, I would say, for the height of them, they'd have to be seated. I've never been in the air in a plane, but I imagine that they would have to be seated as they couldn't stand the pressure if they were standing up."

D.C. "Where was the object when you observed the goggles and the

helmets?"

R.F. "Actually, I never noticed until they just more or less passed me, you know. I wouldn't know whether it would be sideways or front-ways, but it was there. This is what made me think it was a flying object, I suppose. If there had been nothing but this thing going over, I suppose I'd figure it was -- well I don't know what you could figure it was."

D.C. "Were there any markings on it?"

R.F. "No, not that I could visual. I imagine that a man could miss an awful lot; and it's pretty hard to really believe that you've seen it. This is probably why you wouldn't take as good a notice of it as you should. If it would be today, I imagine that a man could give you a pretty good description, because there's more of them being sighted. I don't know whether they'd correspond in any way, shape or form with this, but at that time you'd kind of hate to even think you'd seen one. I know if it I was to see one today, I'm sure I'd take a pretty grant good look at it."

D.C. "Is there anything else you could possibly recall?"

R.F. "No, the only thing, like I say that sticks in my mind, was that motor, that steady, no variation in motor speed, just like a Honda gou know, kind of a muffled sound, but very distinct, distinct enough that you can still remember it. It don't even sound like a high-powered motor. Of course, in 15 to 20 years they could probably change that a heck of a pile, I don't know.

D.C. "You mentioned a suction; did that suction have any effect

on your clothing or the grass on the yard around there?"

R.F. "No, it just seemed to -- well I could feel like air, you know, just ordinary air like you'd feel in a whirlwind. Whether it was around me or going straight up -- it seemed to be more or less an upward motion but quite a little breeze around. Pretty hard to explain, you know, that close, but I know d--- well it was there anyway. In fact, I don't think anyone has sighted any around here; that why I never said anything. I figured, well, there can't be too gol-darn many of them because nobody's ever opened their mouth, so I won't open mine. That isn't the attitude a man should take."

D.C. "When did you start talking about it?"

R.F. "Well, about 14 years after, when somebody else claimed they seen 'em and were trying to convince people they weren't gone hairy.

D.C. "Who were these persons?"

R.F. "They were N.K. and N.D. from Bengough. We were talking about it in his shop one day, but knowing them, I know they weren't stretching their imagination. There's a lot of changes can be made in a few years".



SAUCERS

It was on the night of June 23, /1954. I experienced my greatest, saucer flight and seeing exhibition.

It was shortly after eleven o'clock p.m. I had just been aroused and had gotten up to look after some maneuvering of a car in the neighborhood. Noting the time of evening, 20 minutes 'til 11, I lay down again for might's rest, and though unusual, I lay down with my back to my window where I had just been watching for something outside in the way of mausers, shooting stars, or whatever e slong. My intention now was sleep. I think I had not been in bed again more than 20 minutes. Something eaused me to open my eyes and glance toward the window. I do not know the cause of my sudden apprehension, but it was such as to sause me to get my head into the window and against the sereen in a hurry.

A great distance to the North and East, and a little above my lovel, seemingly, a great Cardinal Red Ball, probably five or six feet in diameter and glowing in brilliance, seemed to be resting in mid-air. A moment told me it was just starting to move and toward the West. In a moment the speed was becoming terrificand within the second a complete turn had been made and it seemed to be headed into the South East and at a downward angle, which made the machine cross my main line of vision and, for the first time I could see length, like a great flying serpent, spread out behind.

This total body now seemed to me to be about 1/4 mile long. New, of course, this length I'm speaking of, is simply my length of vision of this flying machine which I could conceive and analyze at any given moment. The length to me, seemed a constant, but in form second to change constantly - from wide to marrower, from mooth to weightee as rough. Now, I think this irregularity in form I'm speaking of is due to banking, when a machine is on a curve. For instance, if the saucer was flown on an even keel at your eye level, you could only see a strip or path the width of the edge of the saucer. Then, if it should bank until the saucer should stand nearly perpendicularly on the edge, your vision would take in the width of the sausor. These are the extremes. With all the variations, and with such terrific speed, your vision line would be irregular in width and texture.

Now, I think I was facinated that the machine kept within my line of vision so long. As I have said, the machine was headed Southeast and downward but in a second or so it had turned upward and to the left and seemed getting far from me, but as it leveled toward the West again as it made this turn Westward, my Vision widened until it seemed 12 or 16 feet wide and then leveled off and came directly west and very high and headed immediately, straight over my house. As it passed over I sould trace the entire vision strip through the foliage of the trees, leaving the green edges on the sides.



Britain Silent on Enquiry Into 'Flying Jellyfish'

LONDON, Aug. 14 (UP)—A spokesman for the British Air Ministry said today it chose to remain silent on its investigation of the July 1 report of a "flying jellytish" in the skies off Labrador.

"This doesn't necessarily mean there's any element of mystery in the matter," the spokesman said. "We simply do not make statements of such enquiries except in very rare cases."

The pilot of a British Overseas Airways stratocruiser reported seeing a dark speeding object escorting his airliner near Gander. The hig object which kept changing shape like a jellyfish was accompanied by a half-dozen smaller objects, crewmen said.

It'S ALL CLEAR

There has been newspaper speculation here that the objects was simply shadows of the plane windows reflected against the clouds, but the experienced plane doubted this explanation.

The Air Ministry said at time it would investigate but aday the spokesman said "we not anticipate issuing any report.

"We were able to identify it immediately as a balloon and so we announced the identification."

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
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

On three different occasions I have observed strange objects

in the sky. Twice at night and once during the day. Twice at a drivein movie I have seen "fireballs" come down at about a 50 degree angle and then disappearing just above the horizon. They had a long tail of what appeared to be flames, which were a kind of bright red, orange, green, and blue mixed together and the whole thing seemed to have a blue green glow about it. It traveled at a terrific speed and made no noise what so ever, and being dark you couldn't see any shape about the object. It didn't seem to burn out like a meteor would do, but stayed the same color all the way down and then with a bright burst of color it disappeared just above the horizon. They were going almost due north and I saw them at

about a month apart in March and June.

The third time was in July, one morning, I happened to look up and saw a bright silvery object about the size of a dime helt at arms length, come down at about a 45 degree angle for a ways and then come to a stop and stayed in the same place for about 15 seconds and then go straight south for a ways and come to another stop and stay for about the same time, and then shoot up at about a 50 degree angle into a small cloud and I watched for about 30 minutes and it never reappeared. The object was traveling from north to south. There were only a very few clouds in the sky that day and a light wind was blowing from the south west so I don't believe that it could have been a weather ballon as it was traveling into the wind.
