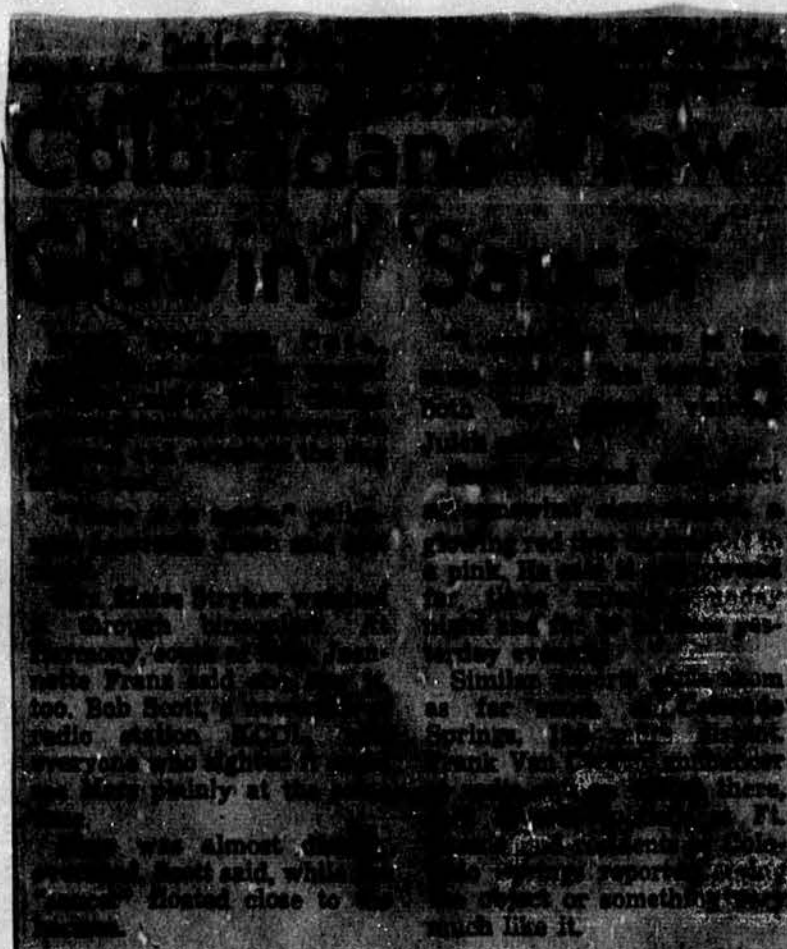

ISLETON, Calif., July 25, 1956: Judge Milo Dye, who has been Isleton Municipal Judge and Judge of the Isleton Judicial District for the past 16 years, telephoned the Sacramento Union tonight that he had seen a "cornucopia-shaped object" in the sky near his home at Walnut Grove, about 27 miles southwest of Sacramento on the Sacramento River.

Judge Dye said it was traveling from west to east at high speed, but police in Lodi and nearby airbase towers said they had had no reports of unidentified flying objects.

"I got a good look at it," said the veteran Judge. "It was traveling low and fast and in the direction of Lodi."

ANTIOCH, Calif., July 28, 1956: Three women in a rural area near Brentwood, 12 miles east of Antioch, notified the Contra Costa County Sheriff's office at Martinez tonight that they saw "a green flash going through the sky" shortly before 11 p.m., Pacific Daylight Time.

Mrs. Dorothy Rawlings, her Mother, Mrs. Ellen Morse, and a neighbor, Mrs. Mary Harrington -- all living on Minnesota Ave., a rural road -- said it appeared to come to earth "about a mile or less" from their homes.

Deputy Sheriff Barrett Cox investigated but said he found nothing "except several pieces of material that looked like cardboard. They were impregnated with some oily substance," he said. "Two of the pieces are large. One is perforated and the other is pleated." Cox said, however, he had no way of knowing whether they were connected in any way with the reported flash except that they were found in the general area where the three women thought the green object had come down. 5

Both Hamilton Air Force Base and Travis Air Force Base said they knew of no planes in the sky at the time which could have caused the flash.

JUST MID-NIGHT FANTASY, AF-CALLS DANCING LIGHT—

This Resort Community was excited today over a night-time phenomenon called by local citizens, "the dancing light" but the Air Force officials - "midnight fantasy."

The Air Force said nothing showed on its Oscoda Air Base radar, but Tom Thurber, 17 of Cadillac, yelled at a pal, Robert Cronkrite, 18, tinkering with an auto in a back yard, "Look at that - a space ship!"

"I thought he was crazy" said Cronkrite, but I looked where he was pointing and there was a speeding, arc

shaped light in the sky
running by the stars. It
was more three miles up,
going North by East and had
a reddish tint."

The youths called the
Cadillac State Police Post where
Trooper William D. Lasphear
politely "logged" their report.
Logging is writing down
something on which no action
need be
taken.

him with calls about the
light.

Willard Woods of Covert
told Cadillac Police Desk
Sgt Willard Lewin about the
light saying it "was alternately
bright and dim."

Woods used to practical
jokers, looked out the station
window -

"There was a bright light
moving in a tight circle
east of the city hall" he
said "As it began to
move, first up and then
down, it left no doubt
in my mind that it was
not a star."

Detective Merrill Taylor
and John Langley told much
the same story, and Allen
Hawe and his wife driving
200 miles south of Cadillac
toward their Sterling Ill.
home, said the object in
the sky was - "round, red,

fast, and formless."

Observers said there was no noise such as a plane might make.

All such reports as this caused Sgt. Lewis D. Cooke, Commandant of the State Police Post, to get out of his bunk and call the Air Force Base.

He was firmly told that no unidentifiable objects were seen on radar, that no weather balloons were overhead. Cadillac's ground observer corps also saw nothing unusual except a lot of stars, but they went home to bed at 1:00 A.M.

LIKE A BULB

About 40 minutes after the last star had disappeared with the morning light, Langley reported, the object moved into

the distance and disappeared. None of the observers was able to define its size or shape.

Wood told Irwin that the object resembled "a light bulb with clear glass or like sunlight off the windshield of a car." He said it was some 3,000 or 4,000 feet high.

Langley and Taylor said the object moved about quite a bit and appeared several times to be withdrawing, but it always came back. They said it seemed to increase in brightness as daylight approached.

FOUND NOTHING

Air force planes from Osceola Air Force Base said they could find nothing and radar at the base was unsuccessful in locating any object.

The closest the object came to the ground was 300 feet, observers said. Wood said there were occasional red flashes in the intense white light.

The object was also reported seen by Howard Slocum and Robert Cronkright of Cadillac.

Planes Seek 'White Light' Over Cadillac

CADILLAC (AP) — Air Force interceptors scrambled to investigate an intense white light that moved through the sky over the eastern limits of this resort town before dawn Saturday.

But the Osceola Air Force Base reported the sky was empty. Neither radar nor pilots could find the cause of what at least six tourists and police described as a "bright shiny object."

Cadillac Police Sgt. Willard Irwin received the first report of the object from Willard Wood of Covert, who said he had seen it moving north toward the city.

Patrolmen John Langley and Merrill Taylor, alerted to the report, said they saw "a brilliant white light" that "left no doubt in our minds that it was something besides a star."

The light, which Wood said had red flashes in it, moved back and forth in a circular fashion, Langley reported. He said it appeared to near the earth, and then to withdraw again.

It continued, Langley said, even after stars had faded in the early dawn light. As the sky lightened, the light got brighter. After the stars had disappeared, the object seemed to withdraw, and about 40 minutes later, it disappeared, Langley said.

Wood told Sgt. Irwin that the object looked like "a light bulb with clear glass or like sunlight off the windshield of a car."

Green Flash Seen to 'Land' In Orchard

BRENTWOOD, July 30 — A three-hour search failed to solve the mystery of a "sparkling green light" which reportedly appeared to land in an orchard on Minnesota Ave., 1 1/2 miles northwest of here.

Six Brentwood residents and an Oakland man visiting the area reported to sheriff's deputies that at 3:35 p.m. Saturday they saw a "green flash going through the sky" and then fall or land in an orchard nearby.

Television reception was reported temporarily interrupted at 3:35 approximately time.

Four sheriff's deputies and several reserve officers searched a square mile area at the reported "landing spot" but were unable to find anything which could be connected with the flash.

Officials at Oakland Airport and Hamilton and Travis Air Force Bases said they knew of no planes in the Brentwood sky at the time which would have accounted for the sparkling light.

The six Brentwood residents reporting the incident are Mrs. Dorothy Rollins, Mrs. Mary Harrington, Mrs. Ethel Morris, Frank Martin, Mrs. Tim Middleton and a Mrs. Danford. Carl Price of Opal St., Oakland corroborated their description of the unexplained light.

Last Tuesday night, Municipal Judge Milo Dye of Ileton, 30 miles north of Brentwood, told the Sacramento Union he had seen a "discus-shaped object" over his home at Walnut Grove, moving eastward at a high speed.

See Strange 'Light' In Sky Over Thumb

BAD AXE, July 31 (AP) — A Michigan radio announcer said he saw an unidentified object over Port Austin last night that "looked like a monstrous streak of orange fire."

William Gravlin, an announcer with Radio Station WLEW in Bad Axe, described the object as "a solid streak of light."

Gravlin said Huron County Deputy Sheriff Fred Cuhernuss also witnessed the phenomenon.

The two were riding on M-53 between Bad Axe and Port Austin in the Thumb area when Gravlin spotted the light shortly after midnight. It was streak-

ing in a southeasterly direction, and had the general outline of "a large comet." He

said it wasn't like any comet he ever seen before.

Gravlin said the luminous object was visible for about 10 or 15 seconds. Then it disappeared out over Lake Huron. He estimated its altitude at 500 feet.

Gravlin said he checked with the air force radar observation post at Port Austin, but air force officials told him they had spotted nothing unusual on their scopes.

Last Saturday tourists and at least two policemen said they saw a red-flecked "brilliant white light" circle near the earth over the eastern limits of Cadillac.

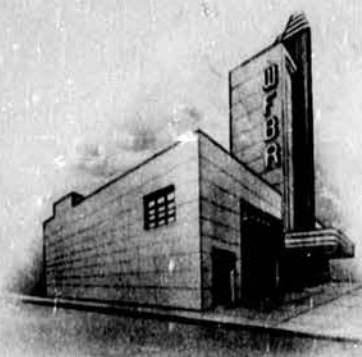

It has been some time since I wrote you, this is due in part to no local sighting and in part to my being in the Hospital. I am back to work now and feel fair to good. I have a little information for you. First a hot story.

On Wednesday June 5th at noon just north of Baltimore, height 45,000 feet speed 800 MPH direction N-NE one UFO three to four times as large as known aircraft circled area and proceeded N-NE as mentioned. One only.

On Thursday June 6th same thing but TWO objects same speed same height.

Friday June 7th 11.30 AM Baltimore and Vicinity had a full BLUE alert. No dress rehearsal but the real thing. Five UFO over Canada heading for U.S.. Two squadrons of interceptors (from New York State) were ordered up to intercept. No report from the interceptors has been received here in Baltimore. *md*

August 1956 (during last 10 days) exact day is being checked. At the same location as above sighting, at 8 PM a blip at 40,000 feet speeds up and slows down several times then went up to 65,000 feet and traveled at 1,000 MPH and circled Aberdeen Maryland several times then went in NE direction. *md*

On August 23rd (Saturday night-early Sunday morning the 24th) at 3 AM witnessed by several people, one I have known for three years and consider him a very capable person, a UFO took off after landing in ESSEX Maryland, (just East of Baltimore). It burnt a tree near by and the tree has since died. It was a large white round object. At about the same date (Baltimore Sun paper) and others stated a UFO landed at Camp Holibird in Dundalk, Maryland. Two Officers saw it and one walked toward it, when he did the object took off and he was burnt. Now ten months later I have been unable to get further information about the burnt officer not even his name. The Sun paper carried the information in only one edition.

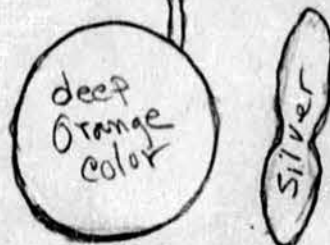

REPORT OF U.F.O. SIGHTING BY MR. AND MRS. GEORGE KENDRICK OF BROOKSIDE KNOLL, GREENFIELD, MASS.:

(Experience related to me-- Albert Baller-- by Mrs. George (Jaenne) Kendrick.)

Mr. K. awoke at about 2 a.m. Wednesday, August 1. From his bed he could see through window to the East. His attention was drawn to an extremely bright, orange "star" of enormous size which hung about 10 degrees above horizon and almost due N.E. He wakened Mrs. K. who was so impressed by this strange sight that she went outdoors to get an unobstructed view of it. Because it was so large and so bright, she remained awake from 2 until 4 a.m. watching it. She gives its apparent size as "about half the size of the full moon", but much more brilliant with a "deep, deep orange color". Not noticed at first, but later in her two hours of observation, was a "narrow, rope-like beam of light" which emerged from one side of the disc and extended vertically for "considerably distance" (see her illustration). Also, after watching this object for a short while, she noted another object (not clearly visible at first, because of the brilliant light of object #1) which was a short distance in front of the disc and of a dull, silver color. Also, this second object, which looked "like a large silver peanut, standing on end", showed a rather irregular contour and its edges were not sharply defined as with the disc. (See illustration).

After watching this spectacle for a time, Mrs. K. reports that a new development took place. Suddenly the bright, orange disc began to "spit out tiny, white stars" which began to fly every which way over Greenfield and the area about Greenfield. They flew with no obvious pattern....sometimes one alone, sometimes two or three together in a "completely crazy series of maneuvers." She counted them as they appeared and found that there were eight of these smaller, star-like objects. When Mrs. K. took a final look at the disc at 4 a.m. these smaller, star-like objects were no longer apparent.

Mrs. K. retired at 4 a.m. with the object still there, but she realized that it was "moving with the stars" as time passed. When she retired it had moved from about 10 degrees above the N.E. horizon to approximately 25 degrees and appeared to be shifting from N.E. to E.

At 7:30 a.m. Mrs. K. looked again and saw the disc, now at about 80 degrees above the E. horizon and appearing as a silver disc. She did not watch to observe when or how it finally disappeared. However, the following morning at 2 ~~xxx~~ o'clock it appeared again in the same place, and again on the third morning at the same time. She did not check to see if it was there on Saturday or Sunday mornings, but I did check last night (at 3 a.m. Monday) and saw nothing aside from the usual pattern of stars.

On the day of July 19, 1956 as I was returning home, I decided to pick up a camera. I stoped at a camera store and got a camera and film. This was the first time I had had a camera. I took a bus home and when I arrived I started to take some pictures of my home at random so as to see if my camera took good pictures or not. I was lying on the grass in my back yard about to take a picture when a movement caught my eye. I turned to see it and saw a disk shaped object not too far away which was receding rapidly. Immediately on seeing it I turned my camera and took a quick shot at it because of its strange shape. After taking the picture I tryed to watch the object and crank my film at the same time. The result was that I over cranked the film and the next shot turned out to be a blank. The object did not disapear over the horizon, but seemed to shrink or dwindle as it disappeared. It disappeared because of distance only, not going over the horizon. It was gone within thirty seconds after I spotted it. I wonder what this strange disk could have been or where it came from?

FLYING SAUCER?

Youth Sights, Films Strange Object in Sky

Did a 15-year-old San Bernardino boy get a one-in-a-million photo of a flying saucer the first time he took pictures with a new birthday camera?

That is the belief it or not question raised by a photograph which is the proud possession of Michael Savage.

Mike, son of Dr. and Mrs. P. M. Savage Jr., 3479 Valencia Ave., says it happened this way:

"As I was returning home, I decided to pick up a camera. It was a birthday present. My folks had given me the money for it.

"I stopped at a camera store and got a Brownie Holiday Flash and film. This was the first time I had had a camera.

SEES OBJECT

"I took a bus home and when I arrived I started to take some pictures of my home at random so as to see if my camera took good pictures or not.

"I was lying on the grass in my backyard about to take a picture when a movement caught my eye.

"I turned to see it and saw a disk-shaped object not too far away which was receding rapidly.

"Immediately on seeing it, I turned my camera and took a quick shot at it because of its strange shape. After taking the picture I tried to watch the object and crank my film at the same time. The result was that I overcranked the film and the next shot turned out to be a blank.

"The object did not disappear over the horizon, but seemed to shrink or dwindle as it disappeared.

"It disappeared because of distance only, not going over the horizon. It was gone within 30 seconds after I spotted it."

A professor, (name withheld) reported that, at 6.15 p.m. on the fifth of August he was having a walk in the terraces behind the luxurious hotel Tamanaco, South East of Caracas in company with a friend, when he saw a luminous body descending from the skies at a great height, slowly, and leaving in it's trail something like smoke; the body seemed to be falling over the suburbs of Santa Monica. 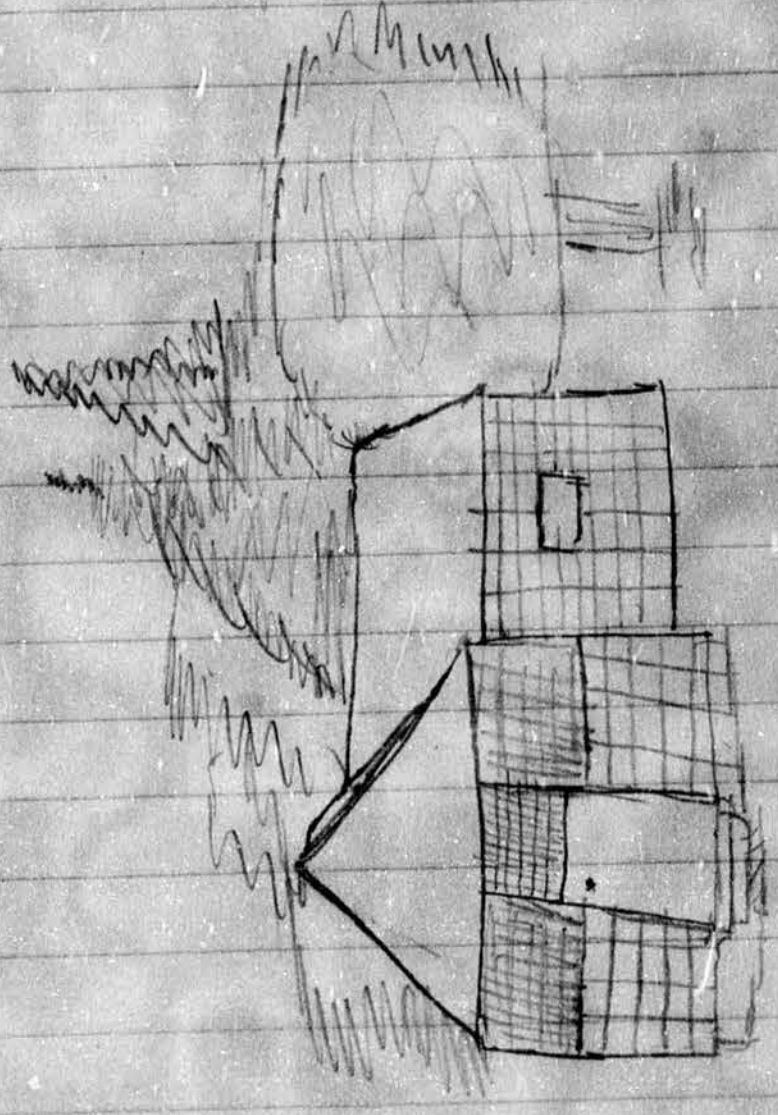
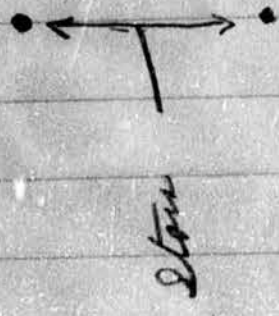

'Strange Objects' Fly Over Creston

By a World-Herald Staff Member.

Creston, Ia.—The log book of the Ground Observer Corps here indicates that a number of "unidentified objects" have been flying over Creston during the past year.

"We have reported them to the Des Moines Filter Center and have received no further word about them," Mrs. A. P. Weisshaar, post supervisor, said Saturday.

Reports about the "objects" being investigated by an Air Force official from Washington "are unfounded as far as I know," she added.

Like other GOC posts in the nation, Creston went on a 24-hour "skywatch" duty in July last year.

Some of the "25 to 50 objects" cited:

September 26—"A blue-white light moved rapidly across the sky." It was seen by observers Joe Hanrahan and John Mulford from the observation tower on top of the City Hall in the Creston business district.

September 27—Radar in Des Moines was alerted when

an "object" was seen moving to the west by observers Susie Evans and Nora Haught. They said it was visible for two minutes.

October 19—About 2:30 a.m. "an unusual large light seemed to flare out for a brief intense moment and then settle down over the city."

October 29—Observers Mr. and Mrs. E. L. Carroll noticed smoke that "turned pinkish." Officials at the Filter Center suggested "it might be a rocket."

December 6—An object following a jet "appeared to be shaped like a football and then changed to a silver square. It disappeared." The observers were Grace Bryant and Frances Mudra.

December 12—Mrs. Carroll reported seeing an object that was pear-shaped that turned bright red as it streaked across the sky."

Last December 30, the post received its first pair of binoculars and since then there haven't been seen so

many "objects," Mrs. Weisshaar said.

However, on June 30 "dancing lights" were reported to have been seen "but the filter center ascertained they may have been airplane beacon lights."

Creston is one of eight GOC posts in Iowa which is on 24-hour watch. There are 177 observers.

While refusing to identify the observer, Mrs. Weisshaar said last fall a report went to the filter center that several "unidentified aircraft" are bobbing along over Creston.

The "unidentified aircraft" turned out to be a flight of geese.

A mysterious oval disk, blazing with white lights, appeared in the sky over Denver early Sunday to add fuel to the current flying saucer season.

It had the same general description as the curious football-shaped craft, brilliantly illuminated, which was sighted by a Durango weatherman last Wednesday.

And both resembled the unidentified flying objects which the Ground Observer Corps spotted in May over Pueblo for six successive nights.

ONLY TWO WITNESSES

Only reported witnesses of the saucer which hovered over downtown for five minutes were Mrs. Mary M. McCaffrey of Tacoma, Wash., and her 13-year-old son William.

The two were gazing west from the window of their room on the eighth floor of the Cosmopolitan Hotel when they saw the saucer move west from the mountains.

"It was bigger than the largest airplane and the edges were very clearly defined," Mrs. McCaffrey told The News Sunday.

"It had blazing white lights, and we could see it very plainly. It stopped fairly low in the sky and remained stationary for several minutes.

"Then it moved west in the same path as it approached. We watched it until it moved out of sight."

FOURTEEN IN 1948

Mrs. McCaffrey said that her son William was not frightened. And they were positive the strange object was a saucer.

"We've seen enough space films and read enough science fiction stories to know what a saucer should look like," Mrs. McCaffrey stated.

The most popular time for visits from the nebulous sky objects is July and August, according to Air Force, which keeps records of flying saucers.

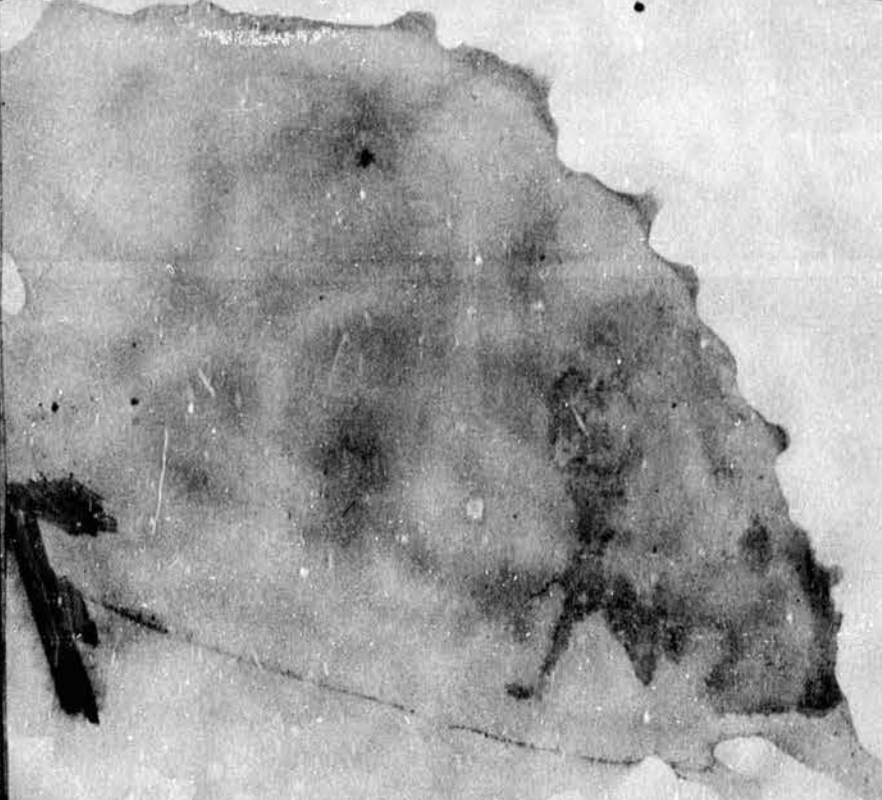
The saucer season coincides with the annual summer meteor showers. And also with Mars' summer position in the sky. But Weatherman Malcolm Day-

ton of Durango was convinced that the object he saw in the sky last week had nothing to do with Mars.

Dayton watched the mysterious shape for nearly an hour through powerful field glasses. He described it as a bluish-red, football-shaped craft, which moved with phenomenal speed.

He said "one side was pushed in, and the blue-red radiation was occasionally obscured by a steam-like haze."

A fighter plane was sent from Kirtland Air Force Base in Albuquerque to investigate the phenomenon, and later reported it as "an unusually bright light reflected from Mars."

All the witnesses state that these details and facts have been reported from time to time and undoubtedly indicate the presence of strange beings in the region. They had however maintained a strict reserve on the matter for fear of being ridiculed but as the geologist Spith had reported seeing the strange tracks also, they had now come forward to say what they had seen.

AUGUST 17th, 1956: Reported to me personally

Mr Alfonso Trillanes was watching the moon through his 4" reflector with a 190 power eyepiece. He was studying the crater formations on the Moon's limb North of the crater Plato. The method he was using to make his observations was to set the telescope on the region and let the Moon pass through the visual field of the eyepiece. As he was observing, and with the Moon's border in the center of his field of vision he saw a "star", small and brilliant which seemed to be following the Moon across the visual field. This struck him as strange, as to see any star in the background he would have had to readjust the setting of the eyepiece to capture the image of the star so clearly. Not only that, the little brilliant star seemed to be reducing the distance between the moon and itself. This also struck him as being strange as, if it was an occultation of a star by the moon, the moon would apparently have to overtake the star and not vice-versa. He took out his watch and noted the time. It was approximately 10.30 p.m. when he saw the little star and he continued watching. In effect, the object was overtaking the moon as he had, repeatedly, to bring the moon's border back into position. When he first saw the object, it was at an apparent distance from the Moon's limb of about three inches and the apparent diameter of the Moon about $8 \frac{1}{2}$ " seen with the naked eye at a distance of about two feet if drawn to scale on paper. At 10.55, the object had reduced considerably the distance and on nearing the border ($8 \frac{1}{2}$ " scale) it suddenly gave two flashes and disappeared entirely. He remained watching the region closely for another hour but saw nothing further unusual. Mr Trillanes would appreciate receiving reports from any other observer who was watching the moon that night at that time so his observations would receive corroboration.

August 20th, 1956: "El Universal" Front Page Item (United Press)

Numerous persons affirm that they saw, at dawn this morning a strange apparatus flying in the skies. It seemed to be made of two spheres joined together by some sort of cone. The two spheres were of an intense brilliant red colour and shot off sparks of a greenish colour. It would remain still at times then rush around the skies at terrific speed. (NOTE: When such an item makes the front page of the "Universal", I know that it was considered of sufficient importance to be printed there)

AUGUST 30th, 1956: "El Universal" (Transpen News Service)

This report comes from the Andean City of Merida. Here is the report. Mr Marco Tulio Hernandez stated that as he was returning home around midnight he saw, flying from West to East, a brilliant object, round, of huge dimensions, of an intense yellow colour. It flew at terrific speed and left a trail of the same colour. He watched the object for the space of about one minute and as it neared the Sierra Nevada, in which direction the moon was visible, he saw CLEARLY TWO SMALLER DISC-LIKE OBJECTS EMERGE FROM THE GIANT SPHERICAL OBJECT. The smaller discs were of a brilliant bluish colour and also followed the big object at the same speed. The objects passed behind the roof of a house which prevented him from seeing precisely if they were going to land or were continuing their flight East.

Editor Plain Dealer—Sir: A few weeks ago one of your subscribers requested correspondence on flying saucers.

I have been and still am a firm believer in these fabulous space visitors and read every bit of literature I can get on the subject. There is a group of us out here in Wickliffe who watch their maneuvers on the very few clear evenings that we have had.

They can generally be spotted towards Mentor or about Madison-on-the-Lake, over the lake. They look like an ordinary star, sometimes hovering in the night sky. The light is comparable to a star's light, but when it gets ready to take off, it glows in an orange color and shoots off at tremendous speed.

I might add that the stars do not travel up. Most of them seem to hover at about a 30 degree angle to the horizon. Another interesting thing that we have noticed is the fact that sometimes they disappear altogether and then a few minutes later a large one will pass by. They always take off if an aircraft or plane comes taken it near where the saucer was seen.

This story sounds fantastic, but 25 or 30 people cannot all have the same hallucinations, especially since we are scattered all over Lake County as far as Wickliffe.

A group of my friends say what must have been a mother ship, because the orange light was about as large as Mars is seen through a telescope. When looking at Mars from Woughby it was at about a 45 degree angle in the southeastern sky and this big light was at about 30 degrees over what they estimated could have been Ashtabula and

was northeast of the watchers over the lake.

Periodically, smaller orange colored lights were seen leaving and coming back to the big one.

These folks are all normal and considered intelligent people, most of them with responsible jobs in which hallucinations could very well cost their jobs.

Boys Sight 'Saucer' Over Covina Knolls

COVINA.—A brightly-lit, unidentified object startled a group of four Lakewood Park youths on a night swimming party in the Covina Knolls area, as it flew over them twice.

CHASING A UFO

The following is a true account of an experience I had last year involving a UFO.

I was living in Bridgeport Conn., when the incident occurred but since have moved to my home in Northville, N. Y.

On August 23, 1956, a fellow worker at Sikorsky Aircraft named Joe Berck, of Trumbull, Conn., and myself rented a light plane from Monroe Airport near Bridgeport. We took off at 6:05 P.M. and flew northeast at about 140 degrees which took us directly over the Sikorsky Stratford plant at about 6:10.

After passing over the plant to the east side of the Housatonic River we spotted what appeared to be two small balloons drifting side by side down the river on the west side to the north of us. Thinking perhaps they were weather balloons, I turned to the west and flew toward their path of flight in order to get a better look at them.

As we approached them they seemed to gain great speed and moved to the south side of the

where the sun was shining through. The cloud base was very low only a few hundred feet above us but the visibility below was perfect. After it passed us I made a steep 180 degree turn to give chase but by that time, which was only a few seconds, the object was well up the river again about where we first spotted it, moving away from us at tremendous speed. I then gave up the chase and returned to Monroe field.

We were only gone from the field 20 minutes and must have spent about 10 minutes chasing the "thing."—Elwin Cramer, Northville, N. Y.

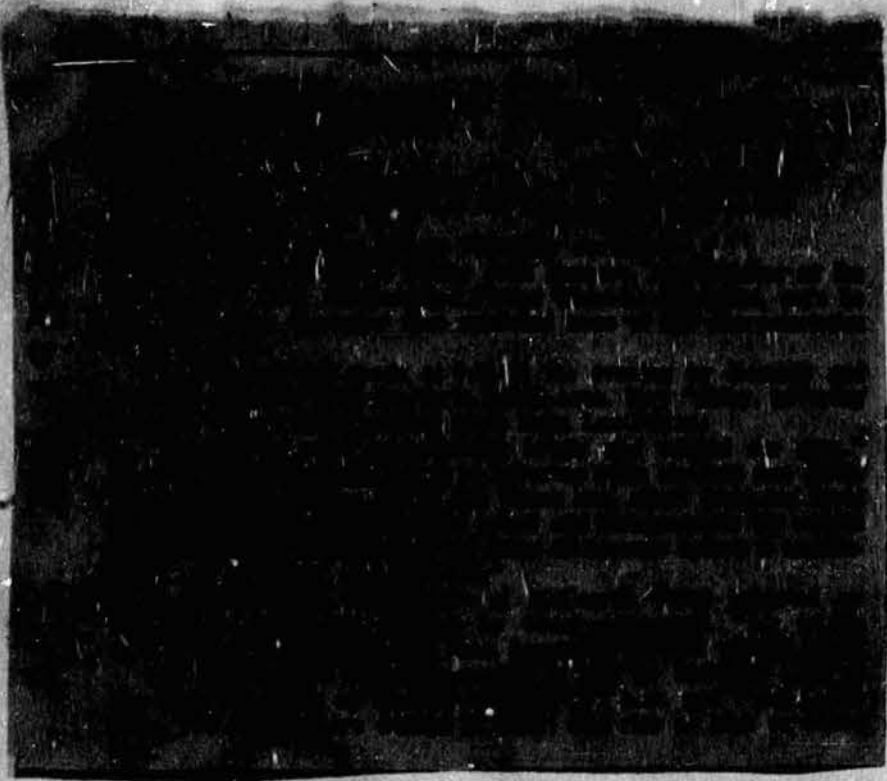

FLYING SAUCERS SEEN ABOVE TWO SUBURBS.

People in two Sydney suburbs saw "flying saucers" in the sky yesterday.

The suburbs are Naremburn and Northbridge. Mr. Leo Haylen, of Adolphus Street Naremburn, and his son Brian, 14, saw the "saucers" from the gardens of their home at 10 a.m. Mr. Haylen said: "Brian and I watched them for 3½ to 4 minutes. The first saucer had the form of a white circle or disc. When we first saw it it was due west of us and travelling north-west at a great height.

It seemed to be travelling about the speed of a fast aircraft and rising. Our attention first was drawn to the saucer because of a noise like a plane, but when we saw it the noise had stopped. The object we saw was distinct. Behind it was a similar disc or circle, much less distinct. Both objects disappeared to the north-west. I would say they were the size of an average aircraft. The first object glistened when the sun caught it."

A Northbridge man said he and his two young daughters, 11 and 9, saw a strange object in the sky yesterday morning. The man said he was in his kitchen when his children called him about 10 a.m.: "Daddy, come and look at the flying saucer." The man went into the garden and saw a large whitish object in the western sky. He said: "I am not an expert on heights or speeds, but I can make a rough estimate that the object seemed about 11 000 feet up and travelling more than 600 mph. I base the speed estimate on the jets I have seen from my house. The object was roughly egg-shaped, whitish in color, and made no sound that any of us could hear. It was not an ~~unusual~~ aeroplane or an optical illusion like a "spot in the sky". I have often seen both these. The children and I watched the thing travel from south to north, then suddenly turn left and disappear."

The man gave the Daily Telegraph his name and phone number, but did not want his name published.

Mr. George Clark, of Burra Road, Artarmon, said he saw two Vampire jet fighter planes flying high north-west of Artarmon between 10 and 10.15 a.m. yesterday. Mr. Clark served in an anti-aircraft unit in the war.

R.A.A.F. headquarters last night said that Vampires were on training flight yesterday from Williamstown, north of Newcastle.

The Northbridge observer said: "The objects I saw definitely were not Vampire aircraft—nor any other kind of aircraft."

REPORT

Las Vegas, Nevada — On August 26, 1956 at 7:40 P.M. I watched the Union Pacific train pull out from the Depot northward. As her last car reached the other end of the platform I made a left turn on my way to return to the city.

The sun had already dipped down below the horizon about half an hour before. A short distance to the southwest on the other side of the tracks a water tank loomed dull gray high above the ground on a tower against the last gold and red reflections of the sun in the clear western sky.

Right then something that shot out from behind the water tank arrested my attention. It was a queer flying object. I stopped and ~~the~~ watched it. It flew in a general west-east direction. It resembled a tadpole. A big round head dragging a long tail behind it. The tail could have been ten diameters of the head long and looked of uneven width along its length. Like a ribbon with hunches and peaks along both edges of it, top and bottom.

The head held a steady, unwavering course in its flight. But in the twilight I could see the tail fluttering freely in the air. Its ripples threw off silvery reflections while the whole body was chocolate brown in color. A light south breeze that blew at the time seemed to have forced the tail to turn and point to the north a couple of times. Otherwise, the tail came up straight behind the head most of the

time in an east-west direction not even hanging downwards due to gravity.

As it flew across the southern horizon I judged the distance to be not less than a mile from where I stood. I guessed its speed to be 300-400 mph. Pretty low above the city, too. It cleared the horizon by not more than 10 degrees, I'd say, probably less. I watched it for about 15-20 ~~more~~ seconds. Then a big tree came between me and the object in its course of flight. As I moved to the other side of the tree I hoped to see it again. But it wasn't there. I looked and searched for it in vain. It vanished in the empty sky.

I ruled out the possibility of it been a formation of military aircraft with the atmosphere playing tricks on my eyes. For if it were aircraft they would in the twilight show their lights, which they did not in this case - the city lights were on by now. Besides there was no sound whatsoever coming from it.

Then it occurred to me that it might have been a kite that the neighborhood kids were flying down there. Taking into account the direction of flight and the particular section of the city, a kite could not be flown from the ground. The power cables in the streets and over the buildings would interfere with its operation. It could only be flown from a tower high as the plane of the cables ~~up~~ at least, then to clear them. There are a couple of ~~of~~ such towers in that direction that I know of belonging to the railroad. The kids could

not have access to them.

So, I asked ~~the~~ a railroad man that happened to walk by at the moment, the improbable question whether the rails fly any kites for signaling. The answer was negative as I expected.

Flying Saucers Are Back Over New York State Now

© New York Times News Service
Willsboro, N. Y.—This Essex county community in northern New York state is buzzing with stories of newly sighted "flying saucers."

Mark Berman, assistant cashier of the Essex County National bank, is one of at least a score of residents who claim to have seen—more than once—an unidentified object hovering over Lake Champlain.

Here is how Berman described what he saw:

"It was a round, basketball-like object that glowed with an orange light. I could not tell how high it was or how far away it was."

"It seemed to be moving in the sky with a weaving motion."

The banker said he sighted the object on three separate occasions at about 10 p.m. His last sighting was on Aug. 27.

William Lancton, 45, of Willsboro Point, also claimed to have seen the "glow" four times this month, three of them on consecutive nights.

Cast Light on Lake

Mrs. Lancton said that all her sightings occurred on warm, clear nights. The light cast by the "saucer," she reported, was bright enough to form a glowing path on the surface of the lake.

The most spectacular sighting in this area occurred on Aug. 27.

At about 1:30 a.m., Mr. and Mrs. Fred Smith of Albany and John C. Voss of Spring Valley, N. Y., all three guests at the Camp of the Pines, a lakeside resort, decided to try some night fishing.

"It was 'pitch black,' they said, so dark that they had trouble finding a white, keg-shaped buoy in front of the camp.

Then, suddenly, a white flash "bathed the lake in light."

It lasted for about 30 seconds, they reported, and appeared to

Dear Mrs. Lorenzen,

I see from the September issue of the APRO Bulletin that you stress the importance of forwarding anything that may have any bearing on the saucers, directly or indirectly. Therefore taking you at your word I am enclosing several newspaper cuttings that may have some significance, though you are probably the best judge of that. The missing aircraft may be just a regular crash, again it may not, these things seem to make the papers just once, you never do see the follow up on the investigation, so I've clipped it out just for therecord. The empty boat found at sea, well I wondered if this was another in a long chain of ships at sea found with no crew aboard, note again the mast is down, ... coincidence? Several recent publications have pointed out that in these empty ships funnels have been damaged, and masts broken, as if from above.

To turn to something more concrete, I wish to a quote on a recent saucer sighting that made the local paper. I have the original, I was'nt able to get a copy, though if it was necessary I could get a photo-stat I imagine for you. Word for word it reads as follows.....

"MAN, 57, SAYS HE RAN 6 MILES
FLEEING SAUCER 900 FEET UP"

Special to the Toronto Star
Woodstock, Ontario, Aug. 28th 1956..... A 57 year old Hamilton man, William Corbett stumbled exhausted into the OPP detachment office early today and told the officer in charge he was chased by a flying saucer for six miles. Mr. Corbett said he was driving from Hamilton to Tavistock when his truck broke down two miles south Innerkip, eight miles from here. "I got out of the truck and noticed a strong white light emerging from a large hub 900 feet in the air

"I got scared and started to run, and it followed me."
This is the newest complaint of a saucer in the area since four Woodstock residents claimed they saw one last summer. Corbett a cattleman was on his way to Tavistock to trade in his truck on a newer model. Provincial police investigating Corbetts story are planning to be in the area tonight to watch for the saucer.

Throughout the summer I have made a practice of sitting on the balcony outside our apartment for a few hours every evening to watch the sky. I have a pair of 7x50 magnification binoculars I also use. My home is just outside the city of Toronto, subsequently I am greatly handicapped by city glare and noise from heavy traffic however on the night of August 16th 1956 at 10.45 pm I was searching the sky when I saw a light that I at first took to be a star moving in an erratic manner. As I thought myself responsible for this "movement" I held the glasses steady and watched the light move in a snaky manner across my field of view, necessitating an equal movement on my part to keep it sight. To make quite certain I was'nt seeing things I searched the sky without the glasses and soon located it moving at a steady pace in a westerly direction across the star covered, cloudless sky. The light was like any other star, and constant in strength. I had it in view with the aid of my glasses for about thirty seconds before it disappeared behind some trees. It was not a shooting star, as it moved far too slowly and travelled on a level plain, again it was no aircraft navigation light as at that height the pilot would have had to throw his plane one way and another every other second to execute the pattern of movement this light made. As we live close to a military and also a civil airport I consider myself to familiar with aircraft at night and I can honestly say in my

opinion it was none of these.

A party of people who are employed in the same hospital my wife works in attended a corn roast at a place called Thistletown, Ontario on the night of September 6th 1956. It was a cold clear night with a steady breeze, around 10pm. they saw a light that someone jokingly referred to as a flying saucer, this light that was estimated to be two miles up varied from white to pink and moved over the area for a considerable time in large circles. They heard no noise at any time and could only say the light was small.....

I had difficulty in securing any reliable information as the few people who witnessed this and were available for questioning refused to take the matter seriously. Opinions were expressed that it was an aircraft waiting to land at Malton airport which is within that region. But it seems strange that the remark "flying saucer" which would naturally attract their attention did not on later discussion provide the two vital answers that would have identified it as a conventional aircraft. A green starboard navigation light and the noise of its engines. Again with no adverse weather conditions it seems unlikely an airliner would have been requested to circle the airport at that height before landing as we see them pass over the city with undercarriage down preparing to land when still twenty miles away. This report is extremely incomplete as I am aware. I included it because of the significance of the date and the fact you might obtain another and more detailed report from someone else in this province.

Later in the month, on the 25th. September 1956, whilst scanning the sky around 5.45 pm a silvery object caught my eye. It was a clear evening, the sun was just about setting and a fair amount of cumulus cloud covered portions of the sky at around 10,000 feet. The object I estimated to be about 5,000

feet above the cloud was travelling in a south to north direction at a considerable speed. Allowing for its height I reckoned it must be travelling at least 700 mph and probably much more to travel across the sky in the time it did. I had my binoculars trained on it within a few seconds and was puzzled that no detail was apparent. A cigar shaped object with a blunt nose and tail it had no sign of wings or tail fins. I was also amazed that considering its height the object made no vapour trails,.... I am aware this is not a regular phenomena as climatic conditions play a great part..... I estimate I had the object in view a full three minutes before it went out of sight behind a nearby apartment block. The route it was travelling would have brought it in from the States (New York) across Lake Ontario heading in the direction of James Bay. Accustomed to constant air traffic I can assure you this is NOT a regular air traffic path. As the time it passed over is a very busy period of the day, most people are on their way home from business, I was very careful to study the morning and evening paper the following day for a report on this object. But I was not successful in this, either no-one had seen it...(incredible?)....or the papers did not consider it news worthy, assuming it was reported.

Since I started this letter two more newspaper cuttings have come to hand which I enclose, one dealing with a storm in England at Tunbridge Wells where FIVE FEET OF HAIL FELL IN HALF AN HOUR, am I wrong in thinking this is a little unusual? The other "snipit" is from your part of the world so you probably already know about it. It deals with these "static" radio signals from Venus, and the investigation of same.

Family Sees Space Object Shaped Like Black 'Dog Bone'

EDITOR'S NOTE: Last Labor day week-end J. Gordon Campbell and his family were flying into Billings, Mont., in the family plane. Here is Campbell's story of what they saw.

By J. GORDON CAMPBELL

As told to Paul P. Smith, Minneapolis Star Staff Writer
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We were flying on the airway between Sheridan, Wyo., and Billings, about dusk. The sun already had set, but there was a glow in the sky. I'd say it was after 8 p.m. This was Friday, Aug. 31.

We were about 8,000 feet above sea level. That's about 4,000 feet above the ground. About 40 miles from Billings.

We were going out to a duck ranch outside Lawiston, Mont., for the week-end.

Scotty (10-year-old son) noticed it first. He said, "What is that?"

I looked at it and said, "That's an airplane we're overtaking." The Billings (control) tower was talking to an inbound plane in our vicinity at the same time, and I commented it must be that plane. It wasn't very long before we knew it wasn't.

IT CAME right at us at what must have been a terrific rate of speed. A great big object.

When I found it wasn't a plane, I called the Billings control tower and suggested that they track it on their radar scope. They couldn't get it. Then it went away.

If you can imagine how a cartoonist would draw a dog bone, that's what it looked like. It had knobs at each end. All black.

It was just about calm and it moved too fast for a weather balloon.

It is awfully hard to tell how close we were. When it seemed to be a quarter mile away and hovering, it was about 150 feet long.

During the time it seemed to hover close to us, we had a true air speed of close to 180 miles an hour, and it was right

with us—between us and where the sun had gone down.

WHEN I CALLED the control tower and suggested it was the radar scope, it went in a northerly direction. In a matter of three seconds it went about 50 miles. (That would be about 1,000 miles an hour.)

When that one disappeared, four more came toward us and they hovered. I called the control tower again. They couldn't get them on the scope and they went away.

We landed and immediately started telling people about it. Another one came over while we were on the ground. It appeared. It was pretty dark, but a clear night—still light enough that we could see it.

THERE WERE two or three who saw it, besides us.

I tried to figure out if maybe it were a mirage. I'm convinced it wasn't.

I got a clipping from the ranch we were visiting, saying a lot of other people were seeing these things at the same time, following much the same description.

WE SAW something like this once before. That time it was pitch black, between Evansville, Ind., and Moline, Ill. About 4,000 feet above ground. That object was glowing, it had fire inside, and came awfully close.

It was at the same altitude and came toward us, so close we turned the airplane to avoid it. It could have been a

meteor or something.

At that time my family had the thing in sight perhaps 30 seconds before it reached and passed us on the left. It kept level. That was a couple years ago.

That one I think could have been a meteor or an optical illusion. I've not made much mention of it. This other one I cannot explain.

There Are No Flying Saucers, But...

...being of reasonably sound mind and eyesight, do now
apply the measurements in the UFO book, for I finally looked
straight up the other night and saw something.

It was an Unidentified Flying Object, all right. It was of
indistinct shape, but did not resemble a saucer. It was
smaller than a saucer, and shined about as bright as a second-magnitude star
appearing in my window. It is a dedicated star-gazer and first

Mars, however, I stifled my imagination.

Within 48 hours after I saw it, the Baltimore Civil Defense
Filter Center received about 30 reports of UFO's. Two weeks
earlier, Mars was only 33,000,000 miles away. Now, if they left
Mars on September 8 and traveled at 104,166 m.p.h.—but no, no,
no. There are no flying saucers, are there?

On the Tiller side of Tiller Trail Divide, Everett Cushman and companions had stopped their car on a ridge top overlooking the area of the Old Lausman Mill to watch an unusual number of bombers and escort fighters going by overhead and out of the customary formation. These planes were traveling from east to west. Then, in a northeasterly direction (near the area of Old Baker Camp and across the canyon) they noticed a "saucer" shaped object coming up the canyon in their direction and at about their same altitude.* It was estimated to be about 25-30 feet in diameter and around $\frac{1}{4}$ mile away. Its color was grey**and its estimated speed was 40-50 miles an hour. When it came opposite to them (across the canyon) and less than $\frac{1}{4}$ mile away it rose a short distance, hovered still for a moment, tilted at about a 45 degree angle and in that position and at that angle, disappeared at an extremely fast rate of speed.

At no time was there a sound from the UFO. It was traveling at a considerably lower altitude than that of our planes and it appeared just after our planes had passed by.

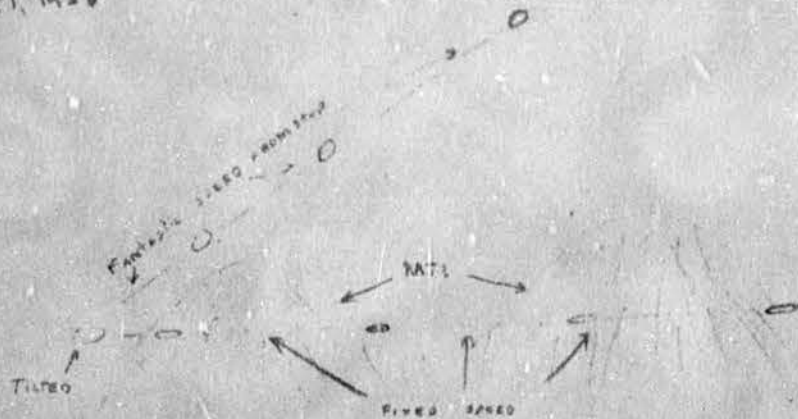

Since I just joined A.P.R.O. and have been thinking what I could first do for our organization, I thought I would try my hand at investigating a saucer report which took place in September of 1956. First of all, here is a typed account, word for word, of the exact way the Butler Eagle put it in print:

**'FLYING SAUCER' SPENDS HOUR CIRCLING YARD IN
BUTLER AREA**

Object Appeared Lost; Had Small Pegs On Its Top

By John A. Ammon

"A Butler man revived talk of flying saucers today by relating in detail how he watched one leisurely circling in front of him for an hour.

'I never saw anything like it before or since. It must have been a flying saucer', Charles W. McGrady, 406 Negley Avenue, retired car company worker, declared.

The 73-year-old Butler man is not alone, either. He said his brother watched the flying saucer with him.

He described the flying saucer he saw as being shaped like an upside down dishpan with small pegs on top.

It was gray in color and had a light on the front which gave off a grayish light. The contraption was about 2½ feet in diameter and eight inches thick.

It ran smoothly without making a sound and gave off a light gray smoke which appeared to have something in it that killed the leaves on a tree.

No One Aboard

'I don't think there was anyone in it--it was too small. It must have been run by radar or in some similar fashion', McGrady said.

But let's let him tell about it. He gave me this account:

It happened about a month ago when McGrady was visiting his brother at the McGrady homestead about nine miles out the Kittinging Road and off to the left a mile on a slag road.

At about 9 p.m., McGrady's brother called to McGrady from the front porch that 'something funny' had gone past the porch. Asked what it looked like, the brother told McGrady it was 'white'.

'I just presumed it was an owl', McGrady recalled today.

McGrady joined his brother on the porch and suddenly his brother pointed and exclaimed, 'there it is again'. They both had plenty of time to get a good look because 'it' made 25 or 30 trips in front of them during the next hour.

'I looked and saw it coming under a telephone wire. It was about 15 feet from the ground and came within 20 or 25 feet of me', McGrady related. He continued:

'It looked like a dishpan turned over and was not quite as big as a tub. It was kind of light gray and round. It had a light--a gray light in the front. The light wasn't bright like an electric or gas light.

'We could see it plainly. It passed under the telephone wire and under a tree by the porch. It made 25 or 30 trips in an area of about 200 feet and we watched it for over an hour.

'It kept the same elevation and went under the same wire each time, to a foot above the ground. It didn't make a bit of noise.

PEGS ON TOP

'There were pegs on top like on a battery in a car, six or eight little pegs. It was about 2½ feet in diameter and about eight inches thick.'

McGrady said he went to a shanty near the house where he thought he would get something to throw at the flying saucer. He found a heavy bolt.

'I was waiting for it to come through again. Then something told me not to throw, and I didn't throw anything at it. I was afraid it might have gas in it or might explode.'

He said he has read digests about flying saucers and 'would say this is one.' Asked how his vision is, McGrady said he only needs glasses for reading.

Finally 'it seemed to disappear, the last time it passed, in mid-air.'

McGrady said it was traveling so slowly 'if you walked fast you could have kept up with it.' Each circling trip took about 1½ minutes.

LEAVES ON TREE DIE

The brothers checked the tree near where the machine passed the next day and found the leaves were dying 'like there had been a frost, but there was no frost'.

'I'm pretty sure the smoke made the leaves die,' McGrady explained. He said the smoke 'rolled out' but not like it came from an exhaust. The smoke had no noticeable odor.

'It had no motor, or, if it did, it ran silently. I had never seen anything like it before and it kind of fit into what I've read. I don't know what else it could be.

'But I kept wondering why it would go around and around out there. It seemed to be lost.'

McGrady's account of seeing a flying saucer brings to mind numerous reports from across the nation of others seeing like objects in the air.

Talk about flying saucers practically died down several months ago only to be revived again today--this time in Butler County." END QUOTE FROM BUTLER EAGLE--October 2, 1956.

Today, being Sunday January 13, 1957, I had some spare time and thought I would go and talk with Mr. McGrady. Don't let the date of my letter throw you--I mostly date my letters for the day I'll be mailing them.

Butler is about 17 or 18 miles from Harmony, so I had to drive there, and the roads around here right now are pretty slippery.

I had no trouble, when I asked to talk with McGrady, and was welcomed into his house right away. Mrs. McGrady turned their T.V. off and left the room so I could talk with Mr. McGrady. This, I thought, was a swell way to be.

I started out by introducing myself and telling him I was interested in flying saucers and showed him my card from A.P.R.O., telling him that this visit was primarily for our organization.

I've taken notes and would like to give to you all over again just as McGrady told me. He also said that it is all right for you to put into print anything I write. *(His name also)*

The speed of the object was very slow (only about a fast walk)

The color of the object was white or gray, like the color of lead or the color of a zinc coated bucket.

The size of the object was around 20 inches or so, and about 7 inches thick. The top being flat and the bottom being flat, but the sides were tapered.

It had about eight pegs on top, forming two rows, and sticking up about 2 or 2½ inches. He said there was a row on each side. By this, he must refer to the part with the light being the front.

The object passed under telephone wires every round it made, and also passed under the one side of a tree, close to the porch. Mr. McGrady said he was only about 20 feet from it when it was closest to him.

It followed an oblong course, and gave off a whitish smoke from the rear, being about six inches in width. It had little or no pressure behind it and just sort of rolled out the back.

He told me that this took place about September 5th, 1956.

When he told some of his friends about what he saw, they wanted to know what he had been drinking. He said that as he was going to answer that he wasn't drinking anything, one of his neighbors told the questioning party that he too had seen several strange objects just recently. I haven't had time to dive deeper into that incident.

Somehow, Aerial Phenomena Research Group from 5108 Findlay St., Seattle, Washington got hold of this report and had sent him a letter, asking for a written report. I thought this might interest you. Other than that letter and the newsman (Mr. Ammon), Mr.

McGrady said that no one else has come to his house about this incident. But, I reminded him that someone else might come to see him and that, if that happened, he was to contact me by letter. I left my address with him.

There is nothing wrong with his eyes, that I am sure of. He was reading some literature I had with me, in a room that even I would have trouble reading in. I'm 19 and he's 73. He is far-sighted needing glasses only for close work.

I asked his wife, later on, what she thought of the whole thing. She only said that there has been a lot of talk, especially from her husband, about what he has seen, other than that she knows very little.

Airmen Report Glowing Object in Sky

A "flying saucer" was seen by Squadron Leader K. B. Smith, commanding officer of No. 40 (Transport) Squadron, at Whenuapai last night. Other reports were received by air traffic control at Mechanics Bay and by Herald correspondents at Rotorua and Tauranga.

Squadron Leader Smith, who was a member of the Queen's Flight during the Royal Tour, was coming in to land in a Hastings at 6.42 p.m. when he saw a glowing object with a white nose flash across the sky heading northward from Devonport.

"I was at 500 feet when I saw it," Squadron Leader Smith told the Herald. "I kept it in sight until I touched down."

Fantastic Speed

"At first I thought it was a jet, but then I realised it wasn't. The thing was travelling on a horizontal plane at a fantastic speed."

Squadron Leader Smith said that a colleague, Squadron Leader O. Staple, also saw the object. They thought that possibly they had seen a mirage, but on landing discovered that air traffic control had received "saucer" reports.

Squadron Leader Smith said he had no idea what the object might have been.

Mr L. C. Dwyer, of Otago, Tauranga (a former flight sergeant navigator with 1200 flying hours in the R.N.E.A.F.), reported seeing a "pinkish, purplish flame and the indistinct shape of a ball" about 1200 feet over Te Poi, near Matamoras. It was travelling faster than any jet he had seen.

Brilliant Light

A Reporoa farmer, Mr E. J. Alkin, said he saw a "pink and white pear-shaped object" travelling very fast across the western sky.

Mr and Mrs F. Thomas and their daughter, Francis, were standing on the cliff overlooking Takapuna Beach at 8.45 p.m. when they saw a brilliant white light over Rangitoto Beacon. The light moved from east to west toward Milford through an arc of about 70 or 80 degrees, gradually climbing in the sky. The object covered the arc in six or seven seconds.

A Pakuranga resident reported seeing the object over the Tamaki estuary.

FIVE JETS JOIN HUNT

Mystery Object Seen in Sky During Night

KALISPELL, Mont., Sept. 4 (AP)—An unexplained mystery object, described by separate witnesses as a "shining triangle" and an "orange ball," hovered in the sky near here during the night and then disappeared westward early today.

Five Starfire jet interceptors from Malmstrom Air Force Base were "scrambled" in an attempt to sight the object but were thwarted by low clouds. The planes were equipped with radar.

Alvin Robert Coleman, Cadaville, Wis., who coordinated the search for the object from the Helena filter center, quoted Clark as saying it seemed "to move sometimes to the east and sometimes to the west a few degrees."

Clark said it hovered about 4,000 feet in the air and was "located about seven miles southwest of Kalispell."

"At about 5 or 5:30 a.m. the object ceased off to the west and then disappeared with daylight," Coleman said.

"It remains a mystery," Coleman said.

Mystery Object Seen in Bozeman Sky

BOZEMAN UP — A mystery "object" or "objects" were reported seen in the sky over Bozeman late Wednesday by Civil Aeronautics Administration personnel.

The CAA quoted one woman as saying she ran into the house and got a pair of binoculars. She was quoted as saying she saw something "shivery with orange light coming from it" and she heard "a humming sound."

Others were quoted as saying "it" was silver in color but they could not make out a shape.

It was the second such series of reports in Montana within 48 hours. Earlier, an unidentified "object" was reported over the Kalispell area.

(A similar mystery object, "orange, moving fast"—was reported over Pattee Canyon Wednesday night. But a U. S. weather observer discounted the possibility of a "space ship." He said it no doubt was the planet Mars, which was moving up over the Pattee horizon about that time and that its size and unusual red color appear magnified and intensified when viewed through binoculars or a thick haze of air. And, he added, eye fatigue from looking at any celestial body for a long time makes it seem to move. Mars is in an orbit which brings it nearer earth this fall than it has been for many years.)

Strange Object Seen Over Pasadena for 47 Minutes; Air Force Baffled

Although in Northern Ireland they are able to grab their flying saucers, in Pasadena they merely spot 'em.

With due respect to Ireland's Thomas Hutchinson, who claims one escaped from his grasp, the observers who said they spotted an as-yet-identified flying object over Pasadena last Thursday are greater authorities at sky gazing.

They are members of the U.S. Air Force and civilian members of the Ground Observer Corps. Their observation points were the Air Defense Filter Center at 171 S. Grand Ave., Pasadena, another observation post in that city and one in Whittier.

The unidentified object was a strange light which moved

erratically in the night sky over Pasadena for 47 minutes.

"Pasadena police had many calls from people who saw it, starting a little after 10 p.m.," disclosed 1st Lt. Mark Matlock of the Air Defense Filter Center. "So did we. Our first call was from a Western Air Lines pilot."

"I hurried to the roof of our building and saw a white light in the sky. It was moving slowly northwest. It kind of paused and jerked in flight and then would snake along."

"I know it wasn't on a conventional aircraft and thought it must be a helicopter or dirigible. But telephone checks showed that none was aloft."

An AF radar station on San Clemente Island kept calling for information. Miss Patricia Pearson, a volunteer observer at the center, said she saw three lights, two white ones and a red one. All the observers agreed that the lights were constant.

Finally, two jets were "scrambled" from Oxnard Air Force Base. They found nothing.

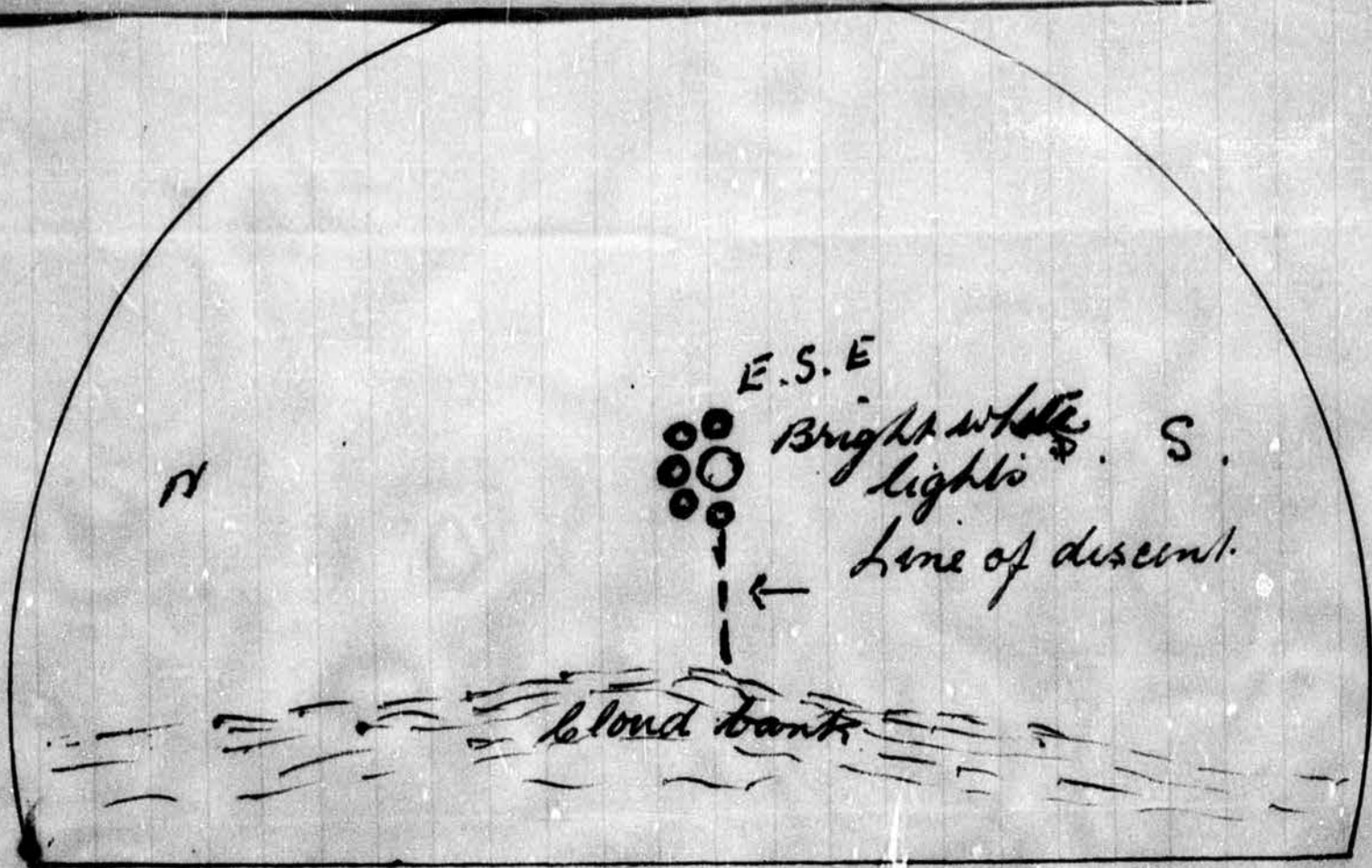

While sitting on a hill overlooking several rows of houses, my friend and I observed three bright lights - the size and brightness of Venus at its brightest - maneuvering in the sky (it was dark out and other stars were clearly visible). We pointed out the "flying saucers" to each other and decided to watch them. After a few minutes we looked out over the horizon and observed a dark circular object over the houses. It moved in toward us slowly. It was completely circular, black, with what seemed to be small pits in the surface. When it was about 50' from us and parallel to us it seemed to be about 15' to 20' in diameter. At this range we were rather frightened and took off for home. Upon arriving there (having broken all our previous running records), we observed that the three lights were still maneuvering. We attempted to call our local observatory for the next two hours without getting through. There was nothing in the papers the next day about anyone else making a sighting. As we were both teenagers, we didn't think our report would account for much, so we never reported it.

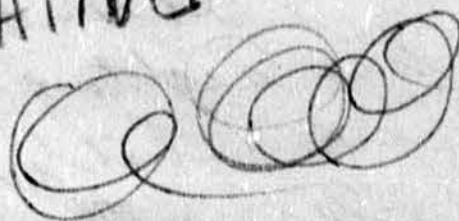

This letter concerns two "sightings"

I was watching my favorite T.V.
show when at 8:15 the phone rang. It
was my friend Tomas Kramer who said
he saw a strange meteor. He was with
Perry Mitchell age 10, (Tom is 13 and an amateur
astronomer) looking at the stars when
Perry spotted a meteor with a green tail
and a red ring or corona around its
white head. Tom saw it to but for only
a few seconds. They seem to disagree
on the head. Perry spotted it first and thus
saw it longer. He says the head was red
and the tail green. Tom, who is in the D.O.C.,
said it had a green tail with a white head
with a ring around it of red. The meteor went
from South to North at a speed below
that of an ordinary meteor and burned itself
out about 45 degrees from the northern
horizon. It was seen for about 30 1/2 seconds.
Indeed an odd meteor.

Well I told Tom to come over to my house and I would get the facts of the meteor sighting for the A.P.O.

After I jotted down the facts from his sighting I went outside with him to see what kind of a night it was. It was clear with a few clouds in the East.

~~My~~ We were standing on my front porch when Tom said "look at those red lights in the northern sky" I looked but could not see a thing. Then my eyes must of adjusted to the dark for they were there. About 20 lights as red as the back lights of a car. They were like red stars or sparks from a fire going in every direction. If you have ever seen ~~sparks~~ sparks come off of a fire, you have seen what they appeared like only extremely red and they did not go out and there was no fire under or near them.

I watched them for about 30 seconds then went into the house to get my binoculars. Tom came in with me, unfortunately, and when we returned they were gone. They had stopped in one part of the sky like they were in rendezvous. Every one was going in a different direction some were moving up and down, others were going in circles, all of them were going too fast for aircraft at a distance of one half mile.

Incidentally the first C.F.O. or "Meteor"

was also a bright red like the tail light
of a car.



August 28, 1954; at Denver, Colorado; 12:30AM -- I had been taking timed photographs of stars and saw traveling from east to west at tremendous speed a long yellow-orange light. It was fairly low as it came from over the trees and disappeared the same way--probably only two thousand feet or so. It was noiseless and in my sight for only 4 to 5 seconds. The object must have passed directly over or near Lowry Air Force Base since it is only several miles away. I think it's speed was too great and color too unusual to have been an aircraft from Lowry.

SAW FLYING SAUCERS, JETS OR METEORITES?

Minnesota, North And South Dakota Residents Report Strange Sights

(By The Associated Press)
Strange objects reported seen in the night skies by South Dakotans and North Dakotans brought a new round of "flying saucer" stories this past week.

TERRIFIED DRIVING FROM PELICAN

Marlen Hewitt, Redfield, S.D., dairy trucker, was terrified, he said, when he sighted a huge object that changed colors and moved with tremendous speed as he drove from Pelican Rapids, Minn., to his home.

Hewitt said the "thing" dropped down to 1,000 feet about half a mile from him. He described it as round, of grey color, apparently made of metal. "about a block square, around 12 feet thick and with an opening at the base about 10th the size of the object from which a brilliant light was shining." It flashed blue-white, to orange to a bright cherry red, he said.

Three Minnesota newspapermen in a hunting party also reported seeing the object at Ortonville.

Adam Bauhs, Faulkton, S.D., farmer, told of seeing a ball of fire with red and green lights, moving slower than a jet.

STRANGE LIGHT

At Des Lacs, N.D., Bernard Hall and his wife observed "a strange light, about 800 feet high, traveling at terrific speed and noiseless."

And at Dickinson, N.D., Laudie Dvorak said this week's stories gave him sufficient confidence to report that the week before something shot directly by him that "appeared to be a large black

spot, in front of a fire, about 25 feet long. . . with no noise to it at all."

SHOOTING FLAMES SEEN

At Rapid City, the Rev. Willis Mountain said he and his family saw a strange light in the sky about five miles south of Hermosa about 6:30 or 7 o'clock Friday evening.

He said the light appeared to be about 30 feet long. The object was bright at the front end and "there were flames shooting out the back." At first he thought it might be a jet plane but he could hear no sound. He said the object disappeared after 30 seconds.

It was the second time he has seen a similar object. About three years ago he reported a light in the sky which hovered over Buffalo Gap then disappeared.

At Bismarck, an object, described as a reddish-white ball of flame was reported to have been in the sky by several persons Friday night.

An airline pilot flying over the city said it may have been a meteorite.

Mystery Object Going 4,000 mph Eyed on Radar Here

BY NEST COLLIER
Miami Staff Writer

A mysterious flying object which apparently played aerial tag over the tip of Florida for several minutes before shooting out into space at 4,000 miles an hour was reported Wednesday by a Pan American World Airways radar expert.

Donald Freestone, 3025 SW 67th Ave., said he picked up the UFO (unidentified flying object) on the morning of Nov. 8 while testing weather radar equipment in the PAA shops at Miami International Airport.

Surprised by the unexpected target return on the screen, he called fellow employees, six of his colleagues confirmed the finding.

None knew what it was.

"I didn't believe in such things before," said Freestone. "But after this happened, I got some books and read up on it. Now I'm convinced it was something that is out of our experience, so far as aircraft is concerned."

Freestone said the UFO was "four to five times larger than any aircraft observed in the past."

It appeared to be egg-shaped or oval-shaped, he declared, and to have a double pattern resembling an hourglass or figure eight.

Freestone said there had been "much discussion" among PAA employees and technicians since the occurrence. One weather radar expert said the object might have been a temperature inversion, a natural phenomenon which produces an effect on radar screens similar to a mirage.

But with all this talk of inspecting artificial moons from the Florida coast, and flying satellites going astray, the ra-

dar picture has caused plenty of discussion and investigation.

The radar expert said he was working on a RDR-1A weather radar when PAA was in space planes to spot bad weather ahead. It is capable of "seeing" 250 miles and transmits 125 miles in the path of plane.

With the radar at "zero tilt"—that is, pointed straight out, Freestone first saw the flying object.

"It appeared at approximately 65 miles southwest of Miami, at an altitude of between 7,000 and 8,000 feet," he reported.

"It disappeared and reappeared several times. I found that by turning the antenna tilt up, it could be brought back on the screen. It disappeared once at 70 miles and

reappeared at about 75 miles. It moved back to 8 miles. The speed was estimated at 500 to 600 miles an hour.

"It then moved in to 20 miles and remained stationary for four to five minutes. Then it began going off in the north-south direction. It had come from."

"One time it was noted that the target moved 20 miles in about six seconds or less. The antenna, which rotates at a speed of 20 times a minute.

(Calculations indicate that this showed a flying speed of about 4,000 miles per hour which, if true, is faster than any controlled flight earth scientists are capable of producing. It is four times the speed of the earth's rotation on its axis.)

(About midway, such as the flying which was noted at Co. Fla., last week, altitude 4,000 miles an hour.

"The object was last observed at about 100 miles from Miami, still moving north-south. It was

Six Persons Report Seeing Flying Disks

Chicago — UP — Authorities Saturday investigated a rash of "flying saucer" reports in the Upper Midwest where at least six persons have sighted strange objects streaking through the sky.

The latest report came from Crookston, Minn., where a man said he saw what "looked like a falling star" plunge to about 500 feet from the ground, then stop and "hang motionless in the sky."

Bill Nimens, 33, Crookston, a former State commander of the Disabled American Veterans, said the object he saw Friday night was bright green and issued a white light.

"It resembled a piece of chrome with a brilliant light to it," he said.

Three other persons said they saw fiery objects over Bis-

mark, N. D., Friday night. Radio announcer Eldon Ray said he saw a "reddish-white ball of flame, trailing blue flame" speed westward. He said it was at an altitude of 1,500 to 2,500 feet and seemed to be erupting.

A Frontier Airline pilot passing over the City said he also spotted the object but thought it was a meteorite. His theory was discounted by a Civil Aeronautics Administration representative at the Bismarck Airport.

"It didn't act like a meteorite," he said. He described it as being "of a glowing nature . . . bluish green."

Two other persons have reported sighting glowing objects flying about Minnesota and the Dakotas during the past 10 days.

Bismarck, N. D., 11-17-56 — Three persons reported seeing a fiery object streak through the sky over Bismarck Friday night, stirring memories of "flying saucers."

A radio announcer, Eldon Ray, described the object as a "reddish-white ball of flame, trailing blue flame." He was only able to glimpse it for a few seconds before it disappeared, but said it appeared to be erupting as it sped west. He estimated it was traveling 1,500 to 2,500 feet in the air.

A Frontier Airline pilot passing over the city said he thought it to be a meteorite. A Civil Aeronautics Administration representative at the Bismarck airport discounted this.

"It didn't act like a meteorite," he said. He described it as being "of a glowing nature — bluish-green."

The conflicting descriptions were comparable to those received at the outbreak of "flying saucer" reports in recent years, especially 1947 and 1950.

Glow in Sky Evening Not Just Moon

Holloman Air Force Base, N. M. (INS) — Experiments conducted by the Air Research and Development Command revealed Friday that the glow in the night sky is not entirely due to the moon and stars.

A research team from the Air Force Cambridge Mass. Research Center, while carrying on rocket experiments at Holloman Air Development Center near Alamogordo, N. M., has verified theories that "moon-glow" is partly due to photochemical processes involving sodium vapor.

A November 1 rocket flight revealed data about the cause of "sodium glow."

Dear Mrs. Lorenzen:

Mr. Brings has now given me a report on the sighting he experienced Sat 27 Oct 1956, together with a direct statement, from him, which he asked me to submit.

At approx. 3 AM 27 Oct 1956, in East sky, two very bright objects were seen. Brighter than stars - He & wife had been active viewers for some time, due to excellent location of house, windows, high ground, top floor, etc. (Near Mitchell Airport) Reaching for his scope (30X60 Prism-Scope), he heard his wife exclaim, "It's moving!" He looked & saw one of the objects moving out of sight in what seemed seconds. Then it returned, getting brighter & larger. Training the scope, which was on stationary tripod, he saw it covered 2/3rds of the lens. It seemed to measure from to 1/8 inch to 1/4 inch. Colors beautiful, white center, red ring, turning to orange to yellow. It had four distinct shafts of white light. 15 Minutes passed & it started out of view, glowing very red with red-green-bluish haze, or tail. Counting, he figured it took 6-7 seconds to disappear from view & 3-4 sec. to return. But upon return it showed a slight angle or different direction. Then it took 6-7 secs. to come to what appeared a stop. While checking his scope for any deviation, he decided to try viewing it with a 4" - 100-power reflector scope. 20-30 minutes later object started to move again. With both scopes on it, his wife using smaller one, he compared distances, size, etc. It went out of sight in small scope but remained a white dot in larger viewer. Returning again, it appeared so large that all he could see were colors, like looking thru a prism. For several minutes it stayed in one place. His wife retired then, & while the above proceedings were going on, the other smaller object had remained visible all the time, at the same time, but was seen to blink on & off at intervals. This smaller object, when lined up with larger object, was directly below the larger object. It was whiteish yellow in color & shaped like a "small cigar." The "cigar" looked as if it was standing up on end. The light was more distinct & discernible than the other, which resembled a shaft of light. This "blinking" occurred only when the larger object was in view. In the course of 2 hours, the large object appeared & disappeared 3 times. Realizing the importance of such phenomena, he phoned the airport at Gen'l Mitchell Field, tower. Whoever he talked to, told him it was nothing but the "stars." He repeated the position & a

description of said objects & remarked that they seemed to be directly above the air field. Further explanations were given, such as "just a Strato-Cruiser" etc. They claimed they couldn't see the position clearly because of a cloud bank. However, there were no plane up, none had taken off & none had landed. From Mr. Brings viewpoint, there were no clouds - a clear black night sky. He stayed up the rest of the nite, watching, until 8 AM. Clouds began to move in them, & the objects were soon lost to view.

In the course of those $4\frac{1}{2}$ hours, the moving object seemed to travel from his viewing position about $1\frac{1}{2}$ feet.

Mr. Brings tells me he held off writing this up because he wanted to assure himself of the authenticity of such phenomena. Further discussion, in following days, brought up the possibility of "Jupiter" & other such explanations. But, the fact that Mr. Brings has viewed the area around his home & is completely familiar with astronomical facts, makes any such explanation seem improbable. So, he is not completely satisfied with these "explanations" & I can't say I blame him. It is just dawning upon us here, with a most frustrating results, how downright stupid & hollow-brained some people, who should be in the "know", can really be. Mr. Brings is in a fortunate position in his job, where he has the opportunity to talk to various people, in a sincere effort to dig up reports, etc. He has talked to papers, reporters & disc jockeys at radio stations & always, (as I have) received the rebuff & ridiculous answers. For example: On fri 16 Nov two friends of his had listened to a radio announcer report that a UFO had been seen over the airport. Upon calling the station, he was told no such report was on file. Ironically, on the nite he sighted the above objects, a jet had taken off, from somewhere in Wisconsin, on a training flite to Georgia, & crashed. The pilots had not used their ejection seats & weeks later, the bodies were found.

The following is a direct statement, which Mr. Brings is anxious to place in your hands. I quote:

" I know you're busy, so I endeavored to obtain all the facts before writing to you. I'm very much interested & have been all my life, in subjects along this line. My greatest ambition was to finish my schooling & get into work in this scientific field. I've had possibly 3 authentic sightings prior to the one mentioned. One during the war. I served in Europe with the 82nd Airborne Parachute Inf., Military Intelligence, attended & conducted

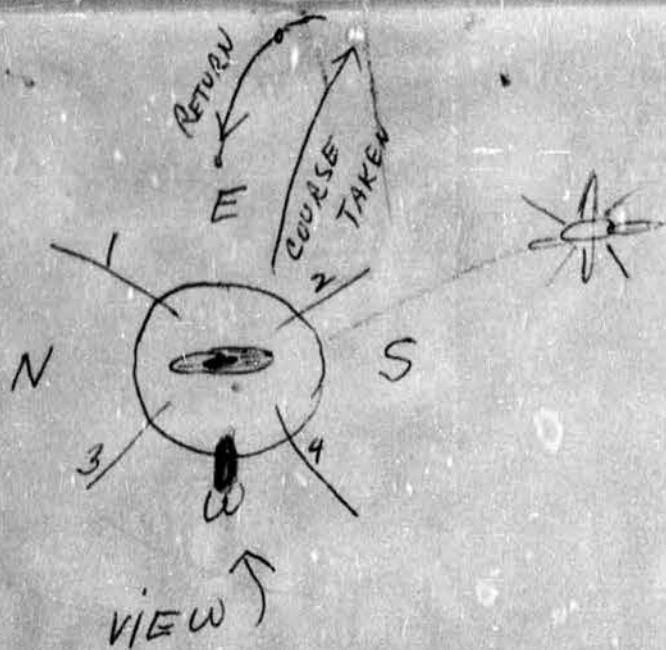
schools, when not in combat, in Military Intelligence, Chemical Warfare, etc. It was then, in 1944, that I met an Austrian who believed he had been successful in experiments in electro-magnetic propulsion. I've since lost track of him, much to my regret.

I'm sincere in my beliefs & the statements which I've made. I would appreciate if anyone could explain to me exactly what the objects were, that I saw. I'm going to join the local Astronomical Society here, in Milwaukee, & the Ground Observer Corps. And, because I'm anxious to learn all I can, I have chosen to embark upon the mentioned endeavors. In my application to APRO, I used my business address because I had expected to move my family to a new home, in a month, but now that is doubtful. 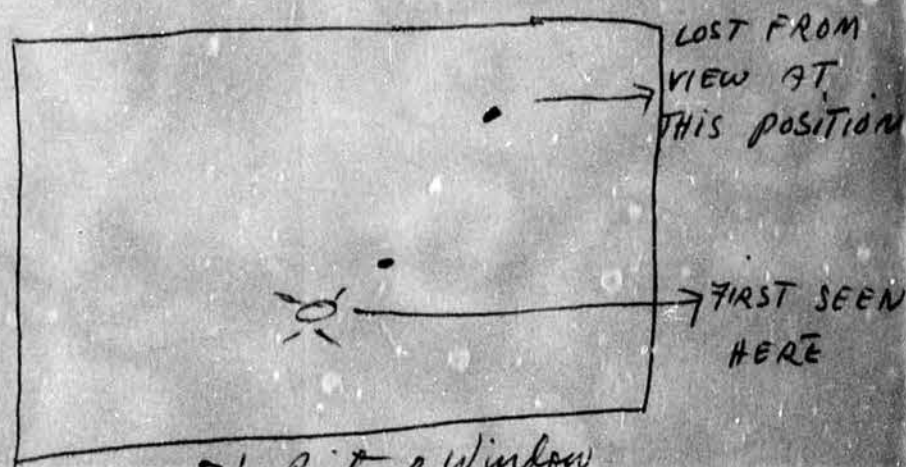

A rash of "flying saucer" sightings was reported Friday from Minnesota and the Dakotas.

Harold Thompson, 38, who farms near Cottonwood, Minn., reported he saw a "flying saucer" Thursday night and studied it several minutes through binoculars.

"My wife and I had been laughing about reports of flying saucers in the Dakotas," Thompson said. "I'm not laughing now."

Thompson, who was a student pilot for a while after World War II, said he was leaving his barn about 10 p. m. when he spotted a bright object hovering at about 400 feet.

He ran into the house for his binoculars and through them saw, he said, that the object appeared to have a number of

little windows, and that its color varied from light red to cherry red, purple and green.

After he had watched it a while, Thompson said, it shot upward and disappeared.

Meanwhile at Mitchell, S. D., a former city councilman and a group of six students were added to the list of those who have reported seeing "saucers."

Former councilman C. W. Klingman said he saw "a silver-colored object shaped like a balloon gondola with no balloon above it" north of Chamberlain Tuesday while hunting.

"It just hovered at about 5,000 feet," Klingman said, "then shot up at an angle into the clouds leaving a vapor trail." He said the object climbed into the wind. "I was just as skeptical as anybody before," Klingman said. "Now I know there is something to it."

Mary Jo Vermeulen, a sophomore at Notre Dame academy, said she and five other youths spotted a "saucer" at about 6:30 p. m. Tuesday about 10½ miles northwest of Mitchell.

"It looked like a merry-go-round and was real low. It glided along slowly and eventually appeared to come to a complete stop," she said.

An entire class at the Bismarck junior high school claimed it saw a "tiny flying object" Thursday afternoon during an arithmetic class. The object was first sighted by Richard Fowler. Then he yelled to the entire class.

He said it was white, round and shiny. The boy said the entire class saw the object for about 15 seconds until it passed out of view of the windows.

He said it wasn't a big saucer and estimated it was about 1,000 feet away.

Was it flying saucer the Moffetts saw?

A flying saucer visited Forest Lake Sunday evening and at least five adults are willing to testify to its presence here for close to an hour.

Mr. and Mrs. Ford Moffett, who live on the south shore of Third Lake, their son, Charles, 27, who lives with them, and their guests, Mr. and Mrs. Frank Moffett of St. Paul, all saw it and gave chase down highway 97 in the Moffett auto.

Ford saw it first at about 9:45 p.m. as he glanced outside thru the living room window. He saw a brilliant light low in the sky and commented that an airplane appeared to be in trouble.

All the Moffetts then went outside and saw the object, moving back and forth, up and down, at about tree-top height, a few blocks to the east.

They agreed it must be a plane in trouble but suddenly wondered

why there was no motor noise said, and described it as "an object that was definitely foreign to all of us."

At first, according to Mrs. Ford Moffett, it appeared to have two windows, one a luminous red and the other a luminous green in color.

She described the color as "luminous, like a halo or spray of color, with points flaring in all directions." She said it appeared to be oblong in shape.

It was definitely not a plane, she

said, and described it as "an object that was definitely foreign to all of us."

It hovered in the vicinity of Stralstrom's resort and then began drifting southeastward.

They followed it in their auto, east on highway 97, traveling at a moderate rate of speed. It continued to hover low over the tree-tops and did not move at any great speed at any time.

In the Scandia area the object moved toward the south, across

the fields, and it was about 10:30 p.m. when the Moffetts decided to give up the chase. They had been unable to drive directly under it, being always just a few hundred feet away from the brightly lighted "saucer."

They believe it was the same object which was reported hovering over St. Paul at about 5 p.m. Sunday. It was described as a "large, round, bright red object" which hovered for about 10 minutes and then drifted off to the north.

Report Jet Chased A Flying Saucer

WASHINGTON (UP)—Un-round object appeared directly ahead. official flying saucer investigators report that an Air Force jet chased a big and speedy "circular flying object" in the Far East last December.

They said the jet got within 3 miles of the object before it flew off at a speed between 1,800 and 2,160 miles an hour.

The report was made by the National Investigating Committee of Aerial Phenomena, a privately financed research organization, in its monthly magazine, "UFO Investigator."

The Air Force had no immediate comment.

800 M.P.H. Pursuit

The NICAP said a "Far East Air Force office" had advised that an unidentified jet pilot picked up the "UFO" (unidentified flying object) as a strange "blip" on his radar screen, and started pursuit at more than 800 miles an hour.

"At 3 miles range," it quoted the Far East report, "a large

round object appeared directly ahead. "By this time, the jet's radar was in 'lock on' position, automatically guiding the jet toward the UFO. A moment later, the radar was jammed by a strong interference. Using antijam procedure, the pilot switched frequency. For 10 seconds this eliminated the mysterious interference pulses, then they came again on the new frequency. But they were not strong enough to break the radar lock-on and the jet held its course.

Five Miles Away

"The jet closed to within 5 nautical miles of the object and could not close further."

The NICAP said the pilot reported that the object was "a golden tan" in color and "had the appearance of being circular on the bottom." It quoted him as saying it made a shallow left turn, then moved up and away at an estimated speed of between 1,800 and 2,160 miles an hour.

The message detailed that the captain of the ship, KARL HARS DERSSON, had been first to see the strange "body" when, at the above mentioned hour, was walking along the deck. Then, several of the crew could also see it, during 2 or 3 minutes. The message was received in a moment of absolute silence and distinctness. Afterwards, nothing else was heard about it. The message added at the final instant that ON APPROACHING THE SEA, THE STRANGE THING (body) WAS SEEN BRIGHTER THAN BEFORE, AND THE MOMENT IT FELL "AN EXPLOSION" CAME OFF, SO SLIGHT, AS ALMOST IMPERCEPTIBLE, THEN FORMING ON THE SURFACE OF THE SEA, AN EPHEMERAL (brief) COAT OF GLEAMING AND DIVERS (various) COLORS.

Once the shining colors went off, in the indicated zone THE SEA WAS STIRRED VIOLENTLY FOR ABOUT FIVE MINUTES.

(End of translation and sighting)

Time: Approximately 9:15 p.m.

Place: Backyard of 391 E. Baird Ave., Barberton, Ohio.

Event: Family returning from Girl Scout Christmas Party

Viewing time: 3 to 4 minutes.

Witnesses: R.G. Lloyd (Nuclear Engineer), Mrs. R.G. Lloyd, and two children.

Remarks:

We looked into the sky, noting the clarity of the stars after weeks of cloudy winter skies. We saw a bright light the size of a bright star arcing high across the sky. This light seemed to be rotating and displaying red glowing edges. When the object was directly over us, it wavered rather erratically. A few seconds later it hovered for approximately 2 minutes. This object was high or we would not have been able to watch it for this length of time. Before it seemed to hover, it was clipping along at a fairly fast rate of time. We checked for sound, and heard no sound.

I reported this object to the Barberton Sky Watch, then operating, at 9:45. The Sky Watch reported it to the Akron-Canton Airport.

The morning of December 21, I called a radio station to ask if there had been other reports. A man in nearby Stow, had reported a sighting after 12 o'clock, a few hours after our sighting. His sighting coincided with ours. He felt that the object was rotating at 90 degree angles. Radio carried the news of these two sightings December 21.

I received a call from G.O.C. that day for information and data to be used in their files. Information was given.
