Harrowing Tale of a Combat Between the Man of Medicine and the Aerial Navigator—Reports of the Performances of the Nocturnal Visitor at Other Points in the Northwest From Ashland to Deadwood.

The Times last night received the following telegram from Rice Lake, Wis.:

"The alrship came to anchor in the millpond here last night at 8:45, and signalled
for a physician. Dr. J. P. Valby went on
board and prescribed for the captain,
whom he found suffering from an acute attack of la grip, and spent about two hours
with his distinguished patient, who refused to give his name. About 10:15 the
captain concluded to resume his journey,
taking Dr. Valby along. To this the doctor objected. The captain presented a rifle
at the doctor's breast and threatened to
shoot if he refused to accompany him.
They scuffled for the possession of the
rifle, the doctor possessing himself of the
weapon, and the ship being then under
way and about forty feet above the water.
The doctor jumped overboard, alighting
upon a log in the pond, from which he was
rescued soon after by D. W. McClinch,
El. Bassett, P. Fournier and E. Miller.
The doctor has the rifle and the captain
has the doctor's prescription case and instruments. The city has gone stark crazy
over the event."
