

SINGULAR PHENOMENA.—About midnight on the 19th ult., a singular phenomenon was witnessed on board the Stornoway royal mail packet, in the Minch, by Capt. Macaulay and his crew and passengers. The weather was serene in the extreme, and the water smooth and shining, when in a moment the ship was surrounded by lights burning as brilliantly as torches.
