
## **Announcement:**

## COMMENTARY:

### WHAT'S AHEAD FOR UFOLOGY?

As we look forward to the 1987 MUFON Symposium in our nation's capital, forty years after Kenneth Arnold's historic sighting, the question arises: WHAT'S AHEAD FOR UFOLOGY?

At present, UFO'ogy appears to be in a rather paradoxical position. On one hand, just about all UFO literature has virtually vanished from the bookstores; UFO stories have been pretty much reserved for the sensational tabloids, and are all but entirely absent from the serious national media; many UFO research organizations have faded into oblivion; membership in serious UFO organizations has either dwindled or remained at only a little better than status quo, and attendance by so-called "serious UFOlogists" at annual UFO symposia has been mediocre at best. On the other hand, we have never before had access to such a wealth of UFO data and documentation from such highly placed sources as we now have. In addition to this data and the 8000+ pages of previously classified documents on the subject released under the F.O.I.A., we now have a massive amount of new data gleaned from hundreds of cases involving abductions of UFO witnesses. This data has presented researchers with some tantalyzing questions and kernels of information and has also begun to depict some extremely intriguing patterns and similarities in case details.

It is plain at this point that there is no further need to prove that UFOs exist. That point has well been established. This observation was stated repeatedly at the 1986 MUFON Symposium in Michigan.

What, then, lies ahead for the infant science of UFOlogy? From a totally realistic perspective, it seems to me that the survival of UFOlogy is now in the hands of a small but determined and dedicated group of researchers across the country. It also appears that it is incumbent upon that group of researchers to preserve the literature and data that has been accummulated on the UFO subject and to ensure that it is made available to future generations of ... researchers.

It also appears that since the documents released under the F.O I.A. state unequivocably that our govt. is vitally interested in the UFO subject, and since our govt. has persisted in maintaining a policy of publicly disclaiming any interest in this supposedly "non-existent" subject, that govt. officials cannot publicly investigate the UFO subject, but must do so secretly. Since we hold the UFO data and we perform the field investigation of sightings. it is possible that we are involved in a silent partnership with Uncle Sam. Ironically, though the public may never know the truth about the UFO subject, we may have to content ourselves with the knowledge that we have been permitted to enjoy a vantage point that very few people ever have, to view one of the most vital and intriguing mysteries of our time.
