This would greatly aid us in planning for the National UFO Information Week, which has now been tentatively scheduled for the week of August 18-25, 1984.

Southern California: - Bill Hassell,
State Dir. and PR Dir.; 40 members,
monthly meetings, hotline, no display,
VHS VCR, willing to do: display in mall,
guest appearances on media, one-day UFO
conference, newspaper press releases.
Needs to accumulate display materials.
Has a treasury.

Northern California: Paul Cerny, State Dir. and PR Dir.; approx. 200 members, bi-monthly meetings; hotline; display; (arrangements for display to travel to fairs with aerospace exhibits); VHS VCR; willing to do: county fairs exhibit; guest appearances on media; printed posters for display; no treasury.

Colorado: - Vance G. Reed, State Dir. and PR Dir.; 10 members; public meetings held every few months; no hotline, no display, Beta Max VCR, willing to participate—(needed a new flyer- sent on 10/24)

Michigan: Dan Wright, State Dir.;
Harriet Beech, PR Dir.; hotline, display,
meetings held quarterly; 25 members;
VHS VCR; willing to do: displays at fairs,
malls; guest appearances on media; press
releases; possibly one-day conference;
wanted: a UFOnaut or Gordon Cooper!
has treasury begun, and has plans to earn
\$ from sale of crafts items at fairs.

Maryland: Dr. Bruce Maccabee, State Dir. no PR Dir. listed; 15 members; no meetings no hotline, no display, no VCR. Indicates that Fund will handle all publicity in Washington, D.C. area, via Fred Whiting. Apparently not an active group---yet.

Hawaii: Dr. Michael Brein, State Dir, and PR Dir.; 6 members; 1-3 meetings yearly; no hotline, no display, possible access to a VCR (no type specified); possible projects uncertain at this time; no treasury. Dr. Brein does some media appearances for MUFON. At the present time, he is not active, due to his father's illness and his own business work overload.

Arkansas-Bill Pftts, State Dir.; no PR Dir. listed; 4 members; no meetings; no hotline; no display; no treasury; VCR- both types. No projects listed.

Nebraska- Ray Boeche, State Dir. and PR Dir. 12 members; monthly meetings; hotline, no display; VHS VCR; willing to do any of the projects listed on flyer; no treasury.

Utah- Mildred Biesele, State Dir; Caroline Johns, PR Dir. Not certain of no. of members; group meetings occasionally and not all attending are members of MUFON. No hotline; no display; VHS VCR; willing to do radio call-in show; letter to paper; public meeting; photographic exhibit. Needs new set of UFO slides. No treasury.

Kentucky- Dr. Burt L. Monroe, State Dir, and PR Dir.; 15 members, no meetings. no hotline, no display, VHS VCR; failed to answer rest of questionnaire regarding projects willing to do for UFO Information Week.

Iowa- Forrest Lundberg, State Dir., Donald
Curtis, PR Dir; 6 members; monthly meetings;
hotline; no display; WHS VCR; willing to do:
UFO display in malls; one-day conference,
guest appearances on radio & tv, press
releases, printed posters; no treasury.

Maine: Dr. Leland Bechtel, State Dir., no
PR Dir pet- searching for the right person;
no idea of number of members in State;
mo botline; no display; access to either
VHS or Beta Max VCR; willing to do: one-day
conference; press releases; guest appearance
on media; public opinion polls; suggests
public speakers on college campuses; no
treasury.

Pennsylvania: Stan Gordon, State Dir. and PR Dir.; 40+ members; monthly meetings; hotline; display; VHS VCR; willing to do: radio & tv guest appearances; press releaves small treasury derived from dues.

New Hampshire: - Peter Geremia, State Dir. and PR Dir; 8 members; no meetings; no hotline (use MA number); no VCR; no display; rest of questionnaire left blank. New Jersey: Tom Benson, State Dir; and PR Dir; 20 members; meet, but it varies; no hotline, no display; (plans to put display together at own expense); no VCR; willing to do: guest appearance on media; treasury from out of pocket.

Connecticut- Bob Bletchman, State Dir; and PR Dir; 12 members, no meetings; no hotline; no display; no VCR; willing to do: media appearances; press releases one-day conference; no treasury.

Massachusetts: Marge Christensen, State Dir. and PR Dir; hotline, display, 35 members; monthly meetings; willing to do: one-day conference; display at malls; UFO courses for adults or children; produce cable ty program to make copies of and circulate around the country to State organizations; press releases; guest appearances on radio and ty; summer activities for children such as make your own UFO contest; treasury derived from dues and fundraising.

New Mexico: John Warren, State Dir.
no PR Dir; no hotline, doesn't know
no. of members; no meetings; no display
no VCR; willing to do: UFO display;
press releases to newspapers; no funds.

North Carolina; Henry Morton, State Dir., George Fawcett, PR Dir; several members, no count given; meetings; willing to do all of projects listed on flyer. Questionnaire not returned; telephoned to furnish information. Claims he received 200+ pieces of mail each week, so group is apparently quite active.

Missouri - Bruce Alan Widaman, State Dir; Joseph Palermo, PR Dir. Info. not furnished; only letter received introducing Mr. Palermo. It would seem that this organization is busy with Symposium plans at this time. 1985 MUFON Symposium will be a large contribution of Missouri to our UFO Information Week, although it will be held more than a momenth before the UFO Information Week. At the symposium, Marge will outline plans for the first national UFO Information Week.

Texas- Tom Deuley, Dir. for San
Antonio area has communicated
willingness to work on project.
Questionnaire not yet received,
and no information yet from Dallas
or Houston groups.
