Part 2

Part 1 of this article, which can be found in issue #6 of Your Newsletter, dealt with the Big Event as described by PSI TECH's Ed Dames. This Part 2 will give you an idea of everything else we talked about, and there was plenty!

At the begining of the interview. Dames gave us a little background about PSI TECH's remote viewing (RVing). targets are largely scientific and technological. For example, the US military has deep space platforms, a series of satellites, that watch for rocket launches. office that controlled the DSPs asked PSI TECH to look into the "things (upwards of five at a time) that were coming to Earth from behind (i.e., outer space) past the DSPs. Dames also mentioned that there have been many UFO intrusions over military bases and nuclear weapons storage depots; the purpose: apparently keeping track nuclear weapons. He has talked to military personnel off the record about this.

Our next questions involved, as might be expected, the Taos Hum. Had PSI looked into it? Naturally! Dames told us that it seems to be caused by a device alien in nature. that is He suggested that rather than accoustical measuring devices. investigators should take measure changes magnetometers (to in magnetic fields). Devices that can used locally (as opposed to those measure large areas for big maps) The sound seems to preferable. He mentioned modulated gravity

MUTILATIONS: SO WHAT'S NEW?

The recent visit to Questa by a group of MUFON members has proven that curiosity is one of the elements that drives us... well, perhaps to any part of New Mexico, to search out the facts in regard to something that "Just sounds... downright wierd".

When someone says "mutilated cow", we suddenly arm ourselves with overnight gear, cameras, video cameras, sleeping bags and recorders, and start honing our skills how to ask a thousand questions. We leave a trail of dust behind us, night or day, in search of the nebulous.

You have to admire the eagerness with which our MUFON members are more than willing to put themselves out for the purpose of an investigation. Too, the recent purchase of various pieces of equipment by the heads of the local MUFON chapter certainly will be an asset during the process of doing investigative work by the group. The group that recently proceeded to Questa were fortunate in coming up with some interesting information. Through the local police chief and some other sources, they were able to locate a resident in the south end of town who had recently lost a "prize" bull to an apparent mutilation of unknown causes. The carcass had shown some of the classic symptoms of many other cattle mutilations, judging from the description of what happened as related by the owner. To add to this indignation, it all had happened within several hundred vards of the rancher's home. At the north end of Questa, another lifelong farmer had experienced a similar event, but this one had taken place in the 70's. His loss was a 3-yearold cow that was pastured on the other side of the Rio Grande. His comments were recorded as he

fields and said they are generated by a solid device. He drew a quick sketch of it; it is underground. It's purpose? It appears to be a time beacon: a rounded triangular device with toruses on top. The toruses cause the hum, generating a pulse that heads out into space. Why? Time traveling aliens use it as a guide post. They sense the pulse of gravity it is creating. We failed to ask why it is so noticeable suddenly. Any guesses?

He mentioned that his mentor. Ingo Swann (Everybody's Guide to Natural ESP) will have a new book out this July, Nostradamus Factor. Another author suggested we look for was Prof. James Deardorff. This scientist, Dames said, was right on, he "hit the nail on the head" in his thoughts and writings about alien subjects. Dames showed us photocopies of two Deardorff articles and I noted down the particulars for those who have access to a college library: Journal of Radio Astronomy, 1986 (24) 94-101 and Journal of the British Interplanetary Society, V40, 373-79, 1987.

Since cattle mutilations are making big news now (at least in UFO interest circles), we asked about them. Dames said that PSI TECH has spot checked them. have seen a small, remotely operated vehicle that jolts a subject cow with electricity, killing it. It takes samples, vaporizing them in the process. Why? The samples are "base-line bioassays". TECH has foreseen nuclear plant accidents in Eastern Europe due to deteriorating plant conditions and poorly (or not) paid workers. He could (but didn't) tell us the exact part that will break in one plant. Thus, the bioassays from around the world are for before and after radioactive accidents.

Hey, we said, if aliens know this is going to happen, why don't they stop it? Dames believes the aliens won't let us get into a nuclear war (again, they know where the weapons are), but as for accidents, well, they teach us something. (He has since mentioned that such trials/accidents give us an opportunity to develop character; depending on an outside force to save us wouldn't do that.) (Star Trek's "non-interferrence" directive at work here.)

Green fireballs became a brief topic of conversation: They are artifacts of UFOs' movement through time. He showed us a drawing showing how it might happen. The sighting itself is like the sonic boom. The sound isn't the jet, it's just an artifact. We catch sight of UFOs

moving through time. Dames grinned and described what it was like to be in a UFO, for example watching Gulf Breezers on the lookout. A set of humans are on the beach on Wednesday, then there's a different bunch on Tuesday, and still a different group on Monday... To the humans the UFO may seem to move a bit but we see it only briefly, in three dimensions; that they're traveling through time faster than we are doesn't occur to us.

What's so interesting about *Gulf Breeze*? Aliens are mining potash/potassium destined for Mars. "They wave at us as they go back through time to get it."

How about *Area 51*? All the UFOs at Area 51 are actually made by humans. The Aurora-type crafts fascinate Dames (to this reporter he sounded proud of U.S. capabilities).

The government and UFOs? The implication was that the government does indeed have information on UFOs, like pictures, but that the information has been gathered while in the process of looking at other things. Agencies have "collection priorities," i.e., getting information about Iran or Cuba. While watching what's on the priority list, UFOs are seen and that... irrelevant information is put somewhere else.

MJ-12? Well, Project Blue Book ran out of leads to explain what was being seen, what was happening. At a high level, those in charge of security feared for their jobs. They realized that weren't Russian. They suspected civilian scientists could have information they needed, but they couldn't ask out right (readers may recall Stanton Friedman explaining how various organizations hold their information close, only to discover that sharing it could have speeded things up, saved money, etc). So to lure out that private information, official-looking documents were made up, broken to the public and the reaction was monitored. MJ-12: Real documents, fake contents...

As for Ed Dames himself, he told us that when he was young he was fascinated by people like Ivan Sanderson. At that age, strange things would fascinate and attract him, "I couldn't figure it out." But "If you're not loosing sleep, you're not alive." Recently he mentioned that now he sees the majesty of the whole thing, "It's worth pursuing."

He appreciates groups like MUFON and others as well as serious, sincere researchers. He suggested that they might want to engage in good photoanalysis of

the videos of odd things seen on the moon, since that capability is increasing. Perhaps the reader has seen the videos made by a Japanese astronomer.

In Your Reporter's Opinion...

This two-part article synopsizes what we talked about in that all-too-brief meeting. It was a lot of fun and I hope that Ed Dames remains in the field so we can do it again. As you may recall, he has said that if the Big Event (which should be the beginning of a series of events) hadn't happened by the end of August he was getting out of the UFO business.

But, as I've been asked, is he for real? I don't know. In my mind, though, he's got several things going for him:


Remote viewing is not a one-persononly phenomenon (i.e., Ramtha et al.). See Ingo Swann's book, or look into what John Alexander and others are doing.

Skilled remote viewers, to my way of thinking, must learn to know what being right feels like, even when what they're looking at can't be easily verified (such as what happened to the Russian probe of Mars). PSI TECH guarantees certain amounts of its work 100%, money back. That impresses me.

Dames also moved here to be closer to The Big Event. Moving ones entire household and business is not simple, and certainly business was easier to conduct in Maryland, nearer the centers of power, than it is out here in the desert, as great a place to live as this is.

And, maybe the biggest factor in my mind, for all this UFO and other fascinating information, Ed Dames hasn't asked us for any money. True, we've given him a lot of free publicity, but if The Big Event fizzles out...

I hope it doesn't. Seeing paradigms change for the better in my own life time would be great.

mentioned there were no visible tracks near the animal and no loss of blood was evident at the cow's body. It seemed this had only happened in the last day or so at that time since he tended his cows often enough during those years. Both eyes had been removed as well as the tongue. The heart was gone, and the farmer made a ring with thumb and fingers of both hands to show the size of the "coring" that had been done to remove the sex organs. Clean, he said. He spoke of "they" with great mystery, and how "they" had been able to do all of this as though from out of nowhere. Isn't that usually the case anyway?

Between Questa and San Luis there was another unexplainable mystery that will be addressed in the future when more facts have been gathered. When something like this happens, at about 11 o'clock at night in a deserted area and in almost total darkness, it can scare your pants off. That is, if you have pants on! Nope, can't blame UFOs this time. The night sky had the glitter of millions of stars but none of them showed promise of being a UFO with a little green pilot!

Now, for the local scene here in our own backyard.

Near Albuquerque, the body of a young cow weighing Maybe 400-500 pounds originally and 3-4 years old, was found recently not too far off a road on cattle rangeland. The animal had been dead for weeks, it appeared, and was on its left side, eyes gone, slit from its throat to about the tail. The tail was missing and any sign of its sex could not be determined. A circular opening about 6-7 inches in diameter on the right shoulder area revealed a bone that had a zigzagged indentation into the bone, 2-3 inches in length and a quarter-inch wide. This was the most mysterious element of all about the cow. Videos and 35mm pictures were made later of this feature and seemed to show details guite well.

The investigative team agreed this was not the action of a predator and more likely had been carried out by some intelligent source.

A State Livestock Inspector has been contacted to render an opinion of this find. He has said he had no knowledge of any dead animal in the region where the cow was found. It is likely that the animal carcass will remain intact for some time and will continue to deteriorate. The remoteness of the area may insure that a flood of curiosity seekers will not be trooping out to the site. Hopefully! We will be looking for more facts here.

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The featured speaker at the June 22 MUFON meeting was Albuquerque resident Frank Joyce a longtime KOB reporter, who was the stringer for United Press in Roswell in 1947, when he was 24.

A key player in the Roswell incident, Frank Joyce is quoted often in many books on Roswell, notably in *UFO Crash at Roswell*, by Keven Randle and Donald Schmitt. "They did a good job on the book, but it's heavy reading," said Joyce, "and they didn't use some of what I told them."

Joyce began his presentation by showing a video which outlined the main events of the Roswell case. He then clarified his role in the incident. First, he stated that W. W. "Mac" Brazel spoke to Joyce soon after he found the debris and Joyce advised him to go to the military. Why the military? "Because they are flyers," he said, "and they will know what to do about something that flies."

Commenting further on Brazel, Joyce said he was "a real hero, a western guy that you would respect. He's the one who had the most pressure put on him." When Brazel was questioned about whether "little green men" were found, he said casually to Joyce, "They weren't green..."

Next, Joyce knew Walter Haut (the PIO of the US Army Air Field in Roswell) and when Haut gave him the official press release which stated that a crashed flying disk had been recovered, Joyce told him *not* to circulate the story. Later, after the cover story had been rushed out, Haut said, "Frank, you were right. I shouldn't have released that story." Joyce also stated that after he had wired the exciting press release to UP, he received a call from a man at the Pentagon who "read me a death sentence." Joyce says the "national security angle and fear" kept him from talking through the years, and even now he "doesn't tell every researcher everything... They'd get PO'd with me!" he said with a smile, looking somewhat anxious.

As might have been expected at such a presentation, there were three videocameras going. Frank asked that they be stopped while he read us his own gripping account of a fast ride he took to Brazel's ranch (the crash site) shortly after it occurred. Joyce's employer, Mr. Whitmore, drove and did all the talking. In addition to Whitmore and Joyce, an unknown "Traveller" was in the back seat. Joyce described the Traveller as "up to my eyes" tall, with a long, sharpfeatured face, aged anywhere from 20 to 60, with remarkable eyes and wearing a dull gold flight suit with no insignia." When asked if he thought this Traveller was an ET, Joyce said, "It's possible." He added that the Traveller "projected power" and was "scaring the hell out of me!" To feel confused and

threatened was an unusual reaction at the time for a cocky young reporter just home from WWII where he had been an orderly to a general, Joyce admitted.

The story continued at the ranch, where the Traveller, who spoke in a throaty voice ("like a laugh") ordered Joyce to wait in a shed. Time slipped by quickly. He heard sheep moving around nervously outside and through "the last rays of the sun" he saw Brazel and a Mexican outside. Brazel asked Joyce why he was there and then asked intently, "You're not going to tell them?" To this Joyce answered, "No, I'm not going to tell them anything, now or ever!" Presumably Brazel had told Joyce a number of things about the crash which he has to date never shared with anyone.

Finally, Whitmore returned and said, "Let's go, Frank, it's cold outside." The Traveller was gone. Later, when Frank tried to talk to his boss about it, Whitmore would only say "It was something the military wanted to cover up." (Whitmore died of cancer in 1951.)

Joyce also told us about a mysterious Colonel Johnson who showed up in Roswell. "Nobody knew who he was. He was from another agency which was involved, nothing to do with US intelligence agencies."

Another strange incident which occurred sometime after Roswell involved someone named Judd Dixon, a man in the Santa Fe UP office, who talked to Joyce and said that the "authorities had come and cleared out all the records." There was a mix-up about whether it was UP or AP, but Dixon later denied having ever spoken to Joyce. "He didn't even remember about flying saucers." This sure "put a chink in my armor," said Frank to an amused audience.

Q&A followed. To a question about Datil, NM, Joyce said "I don't believe anything about Datil." As for MJ12, Joyce allowed that "it was a remarkable bit of research on the people and where they were at that time."

When asked if he'd ever met any other strange entities, he told us of once meeting "a tall, blond man in the woods who gave me a card that *disappeared*." This incident happened shortly after a time in his life when he had been suffering some pain.

Joyce spoke candidly and sincerely and became slightly emotional several times during the evening when pressed by too many questions. He concluded by giving his opinion that "this stuff" has been going on for thousands of years. It's been in human history all along." He stated that he was not sure if it would be a good thing if the truth came out. "It takes us a lifetime to find out what life is all about." He confided that "it might be part of the scheme of whatever is behind this to wait until everyone is dead who knows about Roswell!" Let's hope that's not the case.

Frank Joyce is "descended from the Irish princes of Galway Bay." He's certainly a prince of a man and

we were all charmed and enthralled by his talk. It was a rare treat to hear a man talk who remembers Roswell as if it were yesterday. Why does he remember so well? Because at the time he felt "it was the most important thing that's ever happened."


TAOS HUM - UPDATE

Hmmmmmm... The news is there's no news on what the scientific team has discovered. As of last newsletter they had ruled out an acoustic cause for the hum and were planning to test with electromagnetic antennas and magnetometers. But the phenomenon of strange "hums" is now occurring in other places in the country, from Washington state to Vermont. More than 50 people have contacted researchers about hearing strange, low-frequency "hums."

Apparently this is not a new phenomenon either. Bill Caulfield of Kansas City sent us a clipping in which it was stated that "more than 2,000 people in the London and South Hampton areas of Great Britain have reported hearing sounds dating to the 1940s" (*The Kansas City Star*, Sunday, July 11, 1993 by John Donnelly). The English have an organization (The Low Frequency Noise Suffers Association), a comprehensive newsletter and even a name for themselves (The Hummers).

A New Mexico scientist refers to the Americans as Hearers.

"We now have two large populations that hear these hums, here and in England," said James Kelly, director of research on hearing at the University of New Mexico. Could the sounds be coming from the ear itself? Kelly says the ear is spectacularly sensitive to sound; it makes the eye look homespun. "It's not surprising to me that the ear can do some interesting things." Kelly will start his tests soon on a number of Hearers.



Perhaps they should ask the Hearers if they've ever seen a UFO... Could there be a connection between UFOs, crop circles (England) and the "Hums"? See Ed Dames' explanation on page 1.

MYSTERY ILLNESS STILL A MYSTERY

Though researchers have confidently named hantavirus as the cause and deer mice and other rodents as the carriers of the mystery illness that has plagued the Four Corners area, there remain many unanswered questions about the illness.

Initially, it was thought that dust containing dried urine and feces could infect people but now the CDC says fresh urine aerosols must be breathed in order for one to become infected.

Just why healthy adults get the disease and die is still a mystery. Why is the disease striking now and mostly in the Four Corners area? What do the victims have in common?

There have been a number of reported cases which have not originated in the Four Corners area and others in which deer mice were not found in or around homes of the victims.

Just last Saturday (July 17, 1993) a case was reported in Corrales, NM (now that's a little too close to home!) of a Corrales plumber hospitalized in Albuquerque with the virus. Few deer mice were found near his home or under buildings he has worked on recently. And the mice found tested negative for the virus...

Readers may remember Ed Dames' theory about the cause of the mystery disease: a lethal algal "bloom". Some researchers believe hantavirus is only an associated phenomenon and is not the primary cause of the disease. One thing is certain--the mystery illness is deadly to *tourism* in New Mexico. Send us your theories.

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THE U.F.O. IN UNIFON

'Twas Halloween night 1985 when a friend brought Lady Venus into our home in Ashland, Oregon, A radiant beauty, I knew before she even spoke, that she was unusual and extraordinary. Though my first encounter with a walk-in, I found her claim to have entered the body of an unhappy six-year-old girl 26 years earlier believable, as well as fascinating, along with her claim to be a Venusian/Venuzian. And she was, and no doubt still is, vegan (i.e., a vegetarian who eats NO animal product and makes every effort not to use any, either). Taken by her beauty as well as by her beauty, which included the same warnings about Earth Changes as can be found in the now-popular Mary's Message to the World by Annie Kirkwood, I chauffeured Lady Venus to a couple of radio stations where she spoke about the UFO phenomena, the warnings and urgings to prepare and, often, to relocate to higher ground far from the Coast(s).

Lady Venus also gave showings of the underground film of the Pleiadian ships seen by Billy Meier, and let us peruse the exquisite hardcover book about him/them. Unlike most, who came here as light workers, Lady Venus's connectedness with her higher home, her sense of soul purpose and vision had stayed strong and clear all her days on earth; instead of striving to remember who she was, she knew and stayed in consistent communication with the Ashtar Command, as she demonstrated by her balance, her eloquence and her radiance.

As I have continued to do with any open-minded, open-hearted English-speaking person, I shared with Venus my convictions based on my passionate vision about the reformed, completed English alphabet/ALFU-BET, UNIFON, that is five times more efficient and FUN than the traditional alphabet. Lady Venus was delighted with it, as was the Ashtar Command. They agreed, encouragingly, that it is a great unifying idea, and they pointed out to me that it contains the letters U.F.O. Their genuine enthusiasm encouraged me to continue proponing/presenting UNIFON for the past eight years, planting the seeds of this potential boon up and down the West Coast, and now, here in the Southwest, among the open-minded like you MUFON members.

Many independent thinkers realized the dire need for alphabet reform and completion: Benjamin Franklin, Mark Twain, George Bernard Shaw, and Theodore Roosevelt, to name a few. They made *outrageous* comments about the old traditional alphabet and cried out for its improvement. Chicago economist, John Malone in 1959 devised a one-for-one system of 40 symbols and called it <u>UNIFON</u>, because there is one symbol for every phoneme or shortest unit of sound. His friend and mine, John Culkin, Director for the Center of Understanding the Media in New York, has written a few brilliant articles about <u>UNIFON</u> from which I frequently quote, such as:

"The whole world seems eager to learn English. It has become the unproclaimed international language of the global village... And an estimated 600 million people speak it as their primary or secondary language. It is a nifty language.

"The only problem is the damn spelling.

"For more than 10 centuries the English language has accumulated words and sounds from the Continent and beyond. No one since King Alfred has done much to either extend the alphabet or to assert rigorous spelling rules. The "Anglisc tung" of Alfred has become a glorious assembly of more than a million words spelled in helter-skelter fashion...

"UNIFON... provides a compatible, consistent, generalizable, and unambiguous system.... The 40 letters of UNIFON give us perfect spellings for the one million words of English... We cannot afford to have 24 million adult illiterates in our country or to have large populations who fail to learn English...

"Currently, there are about 4,000 languages in the world and hundreds of alphabets and writing systems. Modern communications and transportation are pushing us closer and closer to each other, and we need direct and clear methods of transmission.... If one language will be used, it will almost certainly be English.

Not only has no one since King Alred done much to extend the alphabet, it seems everything BUT spelling has been revolutionized this century... a century which, according to "Abdu'l-Baha," Center of the Covenant of The Baha'i Faith and devoted son of Baha'u'llah, its Prophet-Founder, is "the century of light--endowed with unique and unprecedented glory, power and illumination."


"Behold," Baha'u'llah explains,

"how its light is now dawning upon the world's darkened horizon. The first candle is unity in the political realm, the early glimmerings of which can now be discerned.
