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What is Happening? Ed Dames' "Big Event" and the Mars Observer

The final week of August proved inhospitable to New Mexicans and "aliens" alike as thunderstorms and flash floods drenched most of the state. Despite the weather, several MUFON field investigators and myself sat in a truck near Chaco Canyon watching the cloudy skies for most of the night, Saturday, August 28. (Of course, Chaco was just a guess as to the location of Site Two; northern New Mexico is a huge area!) We saw some interesting ground lights, between downpours, but saw nothing "alien" as far as we could tell. The beautiful pinkred sunset had promised better.

Ed Dames had told me that the predicted "Event" would happen the last weekend in August when I talked to him by phone on August 23. He also said at the time that the malfunction of the Mars Observer was "directly linked to the Event." More on the Mars connection later in this article.

I survived the wet weekend and by the middle of the following week was beginning to wonder if I would indeed hear from Dames, who had said he would keep me informed. There had been no worldwide announcement of any "event" other than the usual wars, disasters and depressingly familiar goings-on of life on this planet. (Here in Albuquerque, a section of the Alameda Bridge dropped a foot--reminiscent of John Keel/Mothman, but probably a coincidence.) A paradigm shift sure would be great about now, I thought. But hoping for a change hadn't made it happen. And researchers were calling me from all over the country asking for the latest news.

Then, at 9:30 p.m. on September 2, Ed Dames called to explain the situation.

According to him the "Event" had happened, despite the weather, but the "announcement" would be delayed for 5

or 6 weeks. He said that there is much more going on than anyone can imagine and it's incredibly beautiful! The timing of the "announcement" is crucial; it will be made by a very high authority, one of three in the world--an important world figure, trusted and recognizable to all and "higher up than President Clinton."

He said he is working with some contacts within MUFON "who will be told." As for Debby and I, he added, "You're my neighbors," and "We're all in this together in New Mexico." He thanked the NM MUFON News staff for the accurate job of reporting we've done to date and assured me, your editor, that he was telling me as much as he could, since it was "not his job to announce anything," that the announcement must come from higher sources, someone who the world would trust and believe to announce "strange things."

When I asked him to elaborate on the nature of these "strange things," he said that "the average person would be scared to death" to see what's happening. Regular people want contact, but when the real thing happens, it can be more frightening

than they can imagine and unpleasant personal physiologic reactions can occur. He added that the situation was very scary and very serious and "the alien hybrids desperately need to be taken care of."

I said, "So it's happening now--"

"And will be going on for quite some time," Ed confirmed. "This is just the beginning of a series of events... You have my word that things are happening."

Regarding the recently defunct Mars Observer, Ed said that the malfunction was "directly related to the 'event' since Mars is key in the martian/alien/ New Mexico scenario that has been ongoing for millions of years." Last year Ed Dames predicted that the Mars Observer would be lost or interfered with when it arrived at Mars, and he told officials at NASA at that time. A researcher I know says that he heard Ed Dames make that claim last year. According to Dames, he is now working on the problem with people at JPL in Pasadena and the U.S. Air Force. NASA, he says, "is arrogant and won't tell the truth... but the Air Force knows what is going on." Several years ago the Russian Phobos II spacecraft mysteriously failed to respond to orders, as, more recently, did the NOAA-13 polarorbiting weather satellite. And now the Mars Observer is defunct and it's due to alien intervention, according to Dames.

Will we ever really know what is going on with the Space program? I hope so. Presumably, this will be part of the information included in the "announcement" when it is made (around the middle of October?).

MARIA'S 15-BEAN SALAD

1 pound of 15 beans (dry)

1 medium onion, minced
3/4 cup fresh parsley, chopped fine
1 cup black olives, sliced

Clean, soak beans overnight. Drain and fill saucepot with cool water. Bring to boil, cover and boil for 2 1/2 hours, or until tender. When done, drain and cool. Mix all ingredients, stir well. Add salt and pepper to taste. Cover and refrigerate. Serve chilled.

Now. I doubt that the U.S. Air Force has the ability to shoot down even one of these craft, unless they get lucky, since UFOs have shown the capability to easily evade our craft, as in the recent Belgium events. And UFOs have shown the ability to evade our radar and to disappear from it whenever they wish. However, Bill's thought that other aliens are shooting down craft made a point that I had never considered. It is an excellent point. Maybe if they are operating under battle conditions in our dimension (?) or airspace, they would be coming down in great numbers. In such a case, our government would have access to all kinds of crashed UFOs and bodies, and ready teams of military personnel to rapidly pick up the remains would make sense. But then, why bother to do battle in our airspace? That brings up some other interesting questions, doesn't it?

As he points out in his excellent booklet he sent along, *UFOs: Deception and Danger*, the idea that the aliens may be at war with each other explains a

TOO MANY ABDUCTIONS?

Most of you will be familiar with that Roper Poll taken last year which showed that a possibly huge number of Americans may have been abducted, something like 40,000,000. The figure one in every 40 of us also floats around in UFO circles. John E. Mack, M.D., mentioned in a recent article that estimates from the June 1992 Conference on the Alien-Abduction Phenomenon at the Massachusetts Institute of Technology suggested a figure as high as 3,000,000 adults in the United States alone may have had this experience. If we make the assumption, one that it may not be wise to make without more research, that the same ratio of people worldwide are being abducted, we come up with an incredible number. In my opinion, whatever figure we come up with which would realistically account for the huge number of people coming forth to say they have been abducted, from several hundred thousand up, indicates that something more than just genetic research is involved.

Before I go further, let me say that I fully believe this event is completely real. Too many

people are having something happen to them for this to fit into the standard explanations the skeptics come up with. Something of extreme importance is going on. But I don't think it is what it appears to be

It is hard to imagine what kind of genetic experiment or breeding program would require more than a few thousand people. Hundreds of thousands or millions of people are not needed to provide genetic material for some dving alien race! We have better capabilities than that. And just how many alien babies are needed to begin a new race? Millions. And here is another point: these programs have reportedly been going on for something like 30 or 40 years now. Come on, folks. There should be enough alien offspring, many now adults, around to fill up the vast deserts of New Mexico, all demanding food, clothing, and shelter. Or a place aboard the UFOs. Is it likely that one spacecraft after another is hauling little brats back to the home planet year after year? There are just too many abductions and abductees being apparently relieved of their sperm or eggs or shown banks of half-breed babies in row after row of incubation tubes for this to make sense. No highly advanced society needs all this genetic material or all these babies.

It is my suggestion here that whoever or whatever is doing these abductions of humans are not doing what they seem to be doing. I suggest that we need to start looking at these real events in some new ways if we are to approach the truth. The UFOers control the minds of adbuctees. They make them see certain things and they make them forget some things, although poorly, which is a subject worthy of more research. What I am offering here is this: All that is apparently going on is a mask for what is really going on! There is all kinds of evidence in this field that a mask covers the true nature of the aliens in both their appearance and their purposes. And there is all kinds of evidence that they lie to us, time after time.

When John Keel hypnotized some of the apparent contactees and abductees during his investigation of the Mothman phenomenon, he discovered that in a light stage of hypnosis they reported the usual abduction scenario. However, when he persisted and got them to a deeper stage of hypnosis, they reported a completely different event, one involving the government and all too human mind control. Whitley Strieber reported that in one of his abductions he saw rows of masks with the inference that the aliens appeared in whatever mask suited their purpose at the time. Jacques Vallee has shown in *Passport of Magonia* that throughout history something very similar to the UFOers have

appeared to humans as whatever best fitted the human expectations of the times. Recently, some abductees are reporting both alien and government involvement in their experiences. Numerous examples in modern times show that "they" appear in various costumes and disguises. Why then should we blindly accept any of this? Is it because we are so anxious to understand what is such a strange enigma to us that we jump at the first explanation? But isn't this explanation the one which the aliens subtly present to us, disguised a bit?

I believe we must look at this gigantic puzzle in brand new ways if we are to understand it. We must recognize that a mask is involved and always has been from the start. And we must be brave enough to consider related fields of research, no matter how far they seem to take us from nuts and bolts UFOs from interstellar space. After all, we may only be able to understand the "technology" of these beings if we realize that it may seem "magical," or "mythological," or "psychic" to us.

Carolyn and I are writing a report which will address all this far more deeply. There are many new ways we can approach this puzzle. After more than 45 years, it's time for us to do so. In the meantime, remember: what is projected into our minds during abductions may only be a mask for what is really going on. Even the sinister government or military agents may be part of the mask. It's time, in my opinion, for open, but not spongelike, minds and new ways of attacking this Cosmic Koan.

It may be several months before our report is out; however, you can write in and say you will be wanting a copy so we can plan how many to print.

DAVE CROSSLEY SPEAKS ON UFOS AND THE F-WORD

At the August 18 meeting of NM MUFON we were privileged to hear a presentation by David A. Crossley, an aerospace engineer and MUFON Field Investigator. His very professional presentation included film and video clips which he used to illustrate the many levels of *fraud* found in the UFO field.

Since MUFON claims to support the scientific study of UFOs, Crossley advised that scientific methods should always be used to review evidence

in the first place to avoid embarrassment later. An example of this, he said, is the Linda Cortile case. It is being stated as a cornerstone case in the literature before any evidence has been corroborated. This borders on *faith*, not *science*, in his opinion. There's nothing wrong with faith--as children we're all conditioned to accept things on faith--it's good for philosophy, but not good for science. And "a flaw in the evidence makes you no longer *in science*."

According to Crossley, examples of other questionable cases include the Travis Walton case, Yuri Geller claims, the Amityville Horror case (which Crossley personally investigated), Hopkins' missing foetus claim, Ted Serios and his "gizmo", as well as most of the early contactees' claims and, of course, the Conan Doyle "fairy photographs."

Fraud can be either intentional or unintentional, but there are many "good" cases which fail because they also contain "red herrings"--irrelevant material introduced which confuses or discredits the case, "house of cards" problems due to extrapolation or "recycled" material that has already been discredited.


"What makes you a scientist," said Crossley, "is a thought process, and scientists are not trained to ferret out fraud." Having professionals exchange views in a public forum is one way to overcome this problem, he said.

Two good cases of anomalous phenomenon which Crossley feels have been investigated well and deserve further attention are 1) the recent Belgian triangle-shaped UFO visual and radar sightings, and 2) a faith-healing experiment conducted by Daniel Worth in which small wounds on unsuspecting volunteers' arms were treated by a healer who was hidden from view; their wounds healed more quickly than the "untreated" wounds.

"There's a lot of interesting stuff out there", he said, "but you must be selective. The rule is that probably 95% is 'bullshit' but 5% is really good stuff, worth investigating."

Though some members of the audience were perhaps dismayed at the skeptical treatment of some of their heroes and pet theories in UFOlogy, it was refreshing to me to hear such a thoughtful and professionally prepared presentation. With all the bunk around these days, Crossley's admonition to think critically couldn't be more timely.

Bob Saltzman, a Taos-area photographer who said he and his wife Catanya began to hear the mysterious sound in 1991, said in a telephone interview Monday that the electromagnetic theory "is precisely what I believe is happening."

The report said readings taken near the Saltzmans' home south of Ranchos de Taos noted high levels of 60-hertz signals and their harmonics (multiples of 60), which are present on the Taos-area electricpower grid.

"It was apparent that stray fields along the ground were quite strong, even well away from any power

lines," the report said. "However, studying "otoacoustic emissions," there were no firm indications that or sounds actually produced by the the presence of these strong over- ear. tones were somehow responsible for the Hum."

The team said it wants to continue the study, focusing on "the human side of the puzzle — hearers themselves — as the best remaining approach to identify the source.

"Possibilities include unusual hearing sensitivities, effects on ears from some interaction with the environment, or disorders of lowfrequency hearing," said a news release from UNM. "They may even find that the ears have a new way of perceiving energy."

Kelly, the UNM hearing expert, dismissed hearing impairments, Hum, but said he is interested in do not hear the Hum.

He said in a Monday telephone interview that about half of all people produce such emissions, though few perceive them.

"It's possible that people in Taos have become sensitive to their own emissions," Kelly said.

Tests earlier this year proved that "there is nothing specific in the environment, so it's logical to look at the hearers," he said. "This is not a sound as we commonly know sound, so it must be something else."

Kelly said he is looking for seed money to begin a new study of people who are troubled by the Hum, to see if their inner ears are like tinnitis, as the source of the different from those of people who

SCIENTISTS GROW HANTAVIRUS IN LABORATORY

Several sources report that scientists at the US Army Medical Research Institute of Infectious Diseases have grown Hantavirus in the lab. This is hailed as an important step in developing a diagnostic test for the disease and is *news* since researchers at the Federal CDC in Atlanta have tried in vain to culture the virus.

(A rapid diagnostic test is vital because the early symptoms of Hantavirus-associated respiratory distress syndrome, or HARDS, are remarkably mild--and virtually indistinguishable from flu. But patients with HARDS can die in a matter of hours if the disease is not properly diagnosed!)

This news prompted cautious optimism that a diagnostic test could be available by the end of the year. This may prove difficult, however, since there is some evidence that there are many strains of the virus in North America and many possible carriers.

Scientists at the institute also claim to be currently developing vaccines to prevent various kinds of Hantavirus illnesses. Let's hope this is so since doctors expect another serious outbreak of the disease soon due to record rains in New Mexico and abundant food for rodents. Authorities are also worried that when winter comes, deer mice will move inside!

No one really knows what to expect this fall in the "Land of Enchantment"!
