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Courtney Brown Gets Flustered At Albuquerque Book Signing

On Wednesday, January 24, 1996, a book signing with Courtney Brown, Ph.D., author of Cosmic Voyage--A Scientific Discovery of Extraterrestrials Visiting Earth, was held at Page One in Albuquerque. The overflow audience of about sixty people included myself, researcher Rebecca Minshall, I-beam replica designer Miller Johnson, journalist Anthony DellaFlora, and about a dozen past and current members of MUFON.

Brown's presentation on remote viewing was smooth and informative, though he made some pretty amazing statements, like Martians are now in an invisible base under Santa Fe's Mount Baldy! But he became very upset, red in the face and rude when, after asking for questions, Beckie tried to ask him about the near 100% accurate and replicable results he claims to get in remote viewing. She asked this because we are aware that his results sometimes differ greatly from those of Ed Dames of Psi Tech, who we know was Brown's trainer and monitor. (Ed trained Brown in Albuquerque in the fall of 1993.)

Brown said he didn't want to mention the

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name of his trainer (Dames), citing fear for Dames' life as the reason. When Dames' name was actually mentioned by a member of the audience, Brown quickly ended the discussion, perhaps avoiding a small riot as several of us began speaking at once with questions of our own along that line. At that time Brown said to Beckie and I: "Would you two women shut up!" even though we weren't the only ones asking him about this (we were, though, sitting in the front row).

Why did Brown, whose book was published in January, 1996, appear in Albuquerque of all places so early in his booksigning tour? Did he think Dames/Psi Tech had kept a low profile here when in actuality he had appeared on a TV news cast talking about UFOs in the state? Brown said that there was no one doing remote viewing in New Mexico now. We know that Dames moved to Beverly Hills in 1995, though there could still be many people here doing remote viewing; it doesn't require an office.

At press time we hadn't determined if Dames is still in Beverly Hills or elsewhere. But our very first issue of *NM MUFON News* (January 1993) had a story entitled "Psi Tech Moves To Albuquerque." (For a complete list of our articles on Ed Dames, Psi Tech and remote viewing, see p. 8, issue #30.)



UFO CONVENTION WEEK IN ALCALDE, NM STARTS 1996 OUT RIGHT

Glenn Parry, owner of La Mariposa Gallery Cafe, hosted a week-long UFO conference from January 5-12 in Alcalde (near Española) on the Taos Highway. Admission was \$5 a night, or \$20 for a week-long pass.

Some of the area's best authors and speakers on UFOs were invited to make presentations. On Friday, January 5, Richard Morrow of Santa Fe gave a lecture entitled "We Have Met the Aliens and They Are Us.

Saturday featured Linda Kerth on "UFOs and Pictorial Memory," Christopher O'Brien of Crestone, CO, on "The Mysterious Valley: Unusual Happenings in the San Luis Valley of Colorado and New Mexico," and Gabe Valdez of Albuquerque on "Cattle Mutilations: 1970s-1990s."

On Sunday Dean Balsamo spoke on "Abductee Encounters and Religious Traditions," David Crossley, Albuquerque aerospace engineer, spoke on "UFOs and Electronic Surveillance," and Richard Morrow returned and spoke on "Sensual Fusion."

Monday featured Santa Fe journalist and researcher David Perkins on "Paranormal Phenomena and the Evolutionary Imperative: The Big Picture."

On Tuesday, Richard Rowlette, former NM

MUFON State Director, spoke on "UFOs: Alternative Hypothesis" after participating in a 5 p.m. interview conducted by Diego Mulligan with Richard Morrow on KVSS radio in Santa Fe.

On Wednesday, Karl Pflock, Placitas, NM researcher and author of Roswell in Perspective, was scheduled to speak but was unable to attend. A video of Karl's talk was presented, which was followed by a panel discussion with Dan DeMar, former NM MUFON State Director, and artist Bob Turner.

Tuesday, the speaker was Gene Nieri, of Albuquerque, who spoke on "Cattle Mutilation Investigations in NM, 1994-1995." Gene showed video of several recent investigations in which he documented mutilated cows in northern New Mexico.

On Friday, January 12, the program culminated with an Art Show/Party featuring Diane Patracuolo's space alien silk screen monotypes. Wine, soft drinks, cheese and crackers were served and most everyone stayed to hear the final speaker of the conference, your humble editor. I spoke on "Creativity in Abductees" and invited members of the audience to participate in my informal survey. I also spoke about recent scientific research which is ongoing on the human temporal lobe and its relation to creativity and abduction experiences.

The UFO convention was a real success, according to host Glenn Parry, and he spoke of hosting another convention this summer. I hope he does--it was great fun!

I may have a potential souce of survey participants for you to follow up on. I found them recently when I felt I had to clear up a paranormal incident that happened to me over ten years ago, plus I needed an effective meditation technique (I've been told by other Christian churches I was in league with the Devil when I recounted my experience).

The church I contacted recently actively promotes the development of paranormal powers and has several classes, plus a two year seminary program for intense work. They seem pretty normal, not too "out there", in spite of the classes they teach.

The church is called the Church of Divine Man and its teaching unit the CDM Psychic Institute. They've been in existance for 25 years. The main branch locally is in Everett, WA, but there are branches in Seattle, Tacoma, and Spokane, WA, Portland, OR, and Vancouver, BC. I think there are several other branches in California (figures!).

I havn't talked to anyone about UFOs or the abductee experience there, but after reading about your survey I really wonder if there are members who might have had such experiences. I am considered a highly creative person, as are several members of my family (my Irish grandfather firmly believed in the "little people" and took great care not to irritate them). We also have varying degrees of paranormal ability. I've been told by a friend that I may have had some abductee experiences as a kid and possibly shortly after my adult paranormal incident (complete with the MIB experience, but I prefer to think of my female MIB as a person with a birth defect who happened to be just about everywhere I went).

Building in the Void

It is said that a problem cannot be solved on the same level as its making. Given that there are too many of us, that we are ruining this planet, that most of humanity is unthinking and unaware, is there a solution short of the elimination of most of us? Let's see.

What would happen if we stepped out into the void and used what we found there to build a New Reality? But isn't the void by definition empty? How would we find building material there? And can mere humans dare to step into a place where only monsters and nothingness and maybe madness reign?

Some people are coming to the conclusion

that the void is not empty. Quantum mechanics is talking about a void (the implicate order) from which our world comes. In this void, virtual particles play, sneaking into our world for incredibly short periods of time and providing the building blocks of our matter. This implicate order is filled with vast energy--Zero Point Energy--and all possibilities. Thus, there is a limitless supply of "material" and energy there. We would have no trouble in finding building material for ourselves, stuff for creating a New Reality.

What would be our connection to this world? It may well be consciousness. Which brings us back to the nature of reality. To quote Lawrence LeShan: "There are other ways of creating our contribution to what is real and thereby changing reality. It would mean I would have to scrap everything and start again from the beginning." That is the true implications of such things as ESP, UFOs, miraculous healings, and other strange phenomena to most of us. It is why most scientists will deny these things to their end--let us hope not to the end of human life on this planet. It is why many of the religious will fight this new knowledge with all their

power, proclaiming it to be the work of Satan. It is why the entrenched establishment will ignore it as long as they can, then fight it to the last.

But some of us can help bring this new reality into being. In both small and large ways we can assist its creation. The mere act of accepting the truth of these things can help. And the mere recognition that a new reality is being brought about can too.

Now, let me ask you this: What would happen if we assumed that....?

- Much of what we call the paranormal comes from our minds, not from outside forces which control and manipulate us.
- We create reality to an unknown but significant degree. Certainly, this knowledge overthrows almost every concept of reality that we have built.
- The chains of tyranny of one group or another, promoting one set of beliefs or another, over the masses can be broken.
- We as individuals and as collective New Humans have unlimited energy and potential available to us.
- There is subtle power in groups and this power can grow through us and within us as we strive to bring forth a new reality.

Humanity has been on its knees before visions and concepts it little understands throughout its history. What if we see these forces as things to be recognized as innate within us, given to us by a truly loving God, and to be used for our advancement?

Humanity has believed that our world was created by outside beings or forces over its history. What if we accepted our role in creating what we find and endure here and use that forbidden knowledge to create a better world?

Humanity has been controlled and manipulated by other humans too throughout our history. They have burned us at the stake for daring to believe other than the party line. They have tortured us for non-belief. They have enslaved us in a reality of their making, not ours. What would happen if some of us stood up and said no more?

Humanity has allowed "learned" and "wise" men to tell them what is truth over its history. What if we refused the confines of these boxes and demanded the right to decide for ourselves what we believe?

The time is ripe for this revolution. Never before have the common masses had access to so much knowledge. Never before have so many been exposed to new ways of thinking and seeing. Never before has there been such an opportunity to build a new, greater truth on the ashes of the old, failing ones.

UFOs play in our skies tor a reason. The paranormal operates in and around us for a reason. Any number of beliefs can heal people of incurable diseases for a reason. Peak experiences, medium contacts with so-called spirits and space brothers happen for a reason.
