Purpose

The Mutual UFO Network of Ohio is dedicated to conduct research into the UFO phenomenon and to provide educational programs and publications to the public. Our specific objectives are to:

- Establish an active network of people in Ohio interested in objective examination of the UFO phenomenon and related matters.
- Conduct investigations of possible UFO-related event and claims, both historical and current.
- Hold meetings and conduct objective educational programs on the subject of UFOs for members and the public.
- Publish a quarterly membership newsletter, a journal, and other publications to make the results of investigations available to members and the public.
- Monitor the news media in Ohio to help ensure that coverage of UFO-related material is objective and fair.
- Provide a forum for non-MUFON and independent researchers to present and publish information as guest speakers or contributors to Mutual UFO Network of Ohio publications.

About the Ohio UFO Notebook

Now in its 18th issue, the *Ohio UFO Notebook* has been published since 1991 by MidOhio Research Associates, an independent UFO investigative group spearheaded by Bill Jones, MUFON, Inc. Ohio State Director and Mutual UFO Network of Ohio Director. Over the years, the *Ohio UFO Notebook* has published scores of sighting reports as well as selected articles, including such notable examples as "Astronauts Speak Out About UFOs" (#12), and "Interview With Retired Project Blue Book Director" (#11). The most recent issue (with introduction by ufologist Robert J. Durant) features a reprint of "The Fitzgerald Report," an indepth account of a classic multiple-witness close encounter in Sheffield Lake, OH, and arguments that an official Air Force investigation was mishandled.

The Ohio UFO Notebook encourages submission of material for publication.



Group Research Project — Project Ohio: October 1973

Project Ohio: October 1973 has been designed to take advantage of the resources offered by an active group distributed over a fairly wide geographic area. Bill Jones will manage this project, which will be the focus of the organization for 1999.

The year 1973 marks what was historically the last major UFO wave in the United States to gain significant media attention. Although the wave actually extended into 1974, the goal of Project Ohio: October 1973 is to find and document as many Ohio UFO reports as possible from the peak month of the wave. The true scope and extent of this wave is not known because sighting reports have not been fully unearthed.

The project is modeled after researcher Jan Aldrich's Project 1947, a grass-roots effort to document the origins of the modern UFO phenomenon by having large numbers of investigators collect newspaper articles, documents, and personal accounts. Phase 1 of Project Ohio: October 1973 will involve collecting Ohio media material from the peak of the wave. In subsequent phases, the project will expand across the entire wave and will include efforts to interview the reporting witnesses. Results of the research will be published in the *Ohio UFO Notebook* and on the World-Wide Web.

The project involves visiting your local newspaper office, library, or historical society to get copies of printed materials that document the October 1973 UFO wave in Ohio. Newspapers often have collections (called "morgues") that may include UFO reports. The collections can consist of entire newspapers archived on microfilm or in bound copies, or clipping files organized by subject. Many libraries and historical societies also have extensive newspaper collections and subject files.

UFO material may be filed under a variety of subjects, including: UFOs, unidentified flying objects, flying saucers, aeronautics, airships, astronomy, extraterrestrial life, meteors, space events, spook lights, ball lightning, fireballs, flying discs, ghost lights, odd occurrences, strange events. UFO material may even be filed under topics associated with parapsychology, such as apparitions, ghosts. Or, the material may simply be filed under phenomena.

Privately held scrapbook collections often contain valuable information available nowhere else. For instance, clippings from now-defunct newspapers may be almost impossible to find except in such a collection.

Complete bibliographic references are needed for each document, including:

- · Name of the newspaper (or periodical, newsletter, etc.)
- Section
- Page number
- Date (including volume number, issue number, etc., as applicable)

Other Projects

- Profiles of Ohio Ufologists
 - Ohio is home base for several nationally and internationally regarded ufologists, many of whom are not as well known locally as they should be. Irena Scott and Wendy Ban will attempt to publish in the Ohio UFO Notebook a biographical profile and research synopsis for each of these ufologists.
- Physical Trace Research
 - Phyllis Budinger has been engaged in an independent research project to perform chemical analysis of UFO physical trace material from historically famous cases.
- Sightings Report Database
 - Don Weatherby is investigating creating our own report database and establishing relationships with existing databases.
- Educational videos
- Billboard to be placed near Wright-Patterson Air Force Base
- A pipe dream? hosting a future MUFON, Inc. annual Symposium




SPEAKER

In her profession as an industrial chemist, Phyllis Budinger has specialized in the analysis of unknown materials to identify their composition. Her lab, Frontier Analysis, has analyzed physical trace evidence associated with UFO events, including soil samples, angel hair, residue from a cattle mutilation, and stains from an abductee's skin. Her lecture will cover the mission and goals of Frontier Analysis physical trace research, and the problems and pitfalls encountered in this sort of work. She will describe what has been discovered to date in the field, and will present real cases. She will also talk about the positive future of physical trace research, a field that Ted Phillips of the Center for Physical Trace Research has described as an "embarassment of riches" since, though many significant samples have been collected and preserved through the decades, relatively little professional analysis has been done.

Frontier Analysis is located very near the meeting site (see map on reverse). After the lecture, all are welcome to visit. Phyllis will conduct tours of the lab facility, and explain the equipment and processes she uses. Space is somewhat limited, so the lab tour may be done in groups while others enjoy refreshments provided courtesy of Frontier Analysis.
