SUBJECT: Det 1, 1STRAD Msg 161036Z Nov 82 (U)

1. (S) This information is provided per your request. The sighting was not reported by any civilians to the best of our knowledge. Our radar contact occurred at 0433hrs., 15 Nov 82, the object landed at 0437hrs., 15 Nov 82. Both Sergeants did not observe the object in the sky until a few seconds before it landed. The photographs mentioned in the message were taken by the TSGT. The photographs were developed by Det 1, 1369 AVDS, Kirtland AFB. OPREP-3 accomplished by KCC. Both Sergeants were de-briefed by OSI. OSI assumed custody of photographs.
2. (S) An attempt was made to determine whether the occupants of the aircraft would communicate. Due to the short period of time the aircraft was on the ground, it was impossible to dispatch the CR team to the site. At no time did the Sergeants feel threatened by the aircraft or its occupants.
3. (S) Both Sergeants were medically examined at the USAF Hospital, Kirtland, on 18 and 19 Nov 82. There was no evidence of injuries, radiation exposure or psychological problems associated with the encounter. The hospital personnel were not aware of the exact nature of the incident. OSI arranged the physical examination and briefed hospital personnel on a "need-to-know" basis.
4. (S) OSI was the only USAF investigating agency at the site to the best of our knowledge. They declined to provide us with a copy of their report. They cautioned us not to discuss the incident with any other agency. All members of this detachment were debriefed by OSI.
5. (S) JCSP 134 complied with per your instructions.

a. HQ 1st Strategic Aerospace Division letter, 18 May 83, advising that they were referring your request to HQ Space Command.

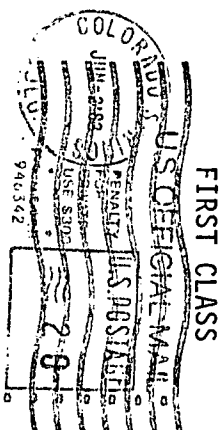

Based on the limited information in your letter we have been unable to locate the records requested.

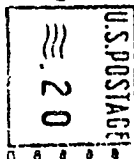
